Star Lites

IF THERE IS ONE industry in the U.S. which is more unstable and less predictable than farming at the present time, it might be the oil industry, which has seen its share of ups and downs during the past year.

Thanks to the high price of oil, as set by the Organization of Petroleum Exporting Countries (OPEC), America's oil industry stepped up their exploration and drilling activity considerably beginning in 1980, which was also the first year of phased decontrol of crude oil prices.

But the OPEC organization, which had always operated like a "well oiled machine," began to falter, when Saudia Arabia began to ignore the daily output quotas established for members, and produced an oil glut.

After several years of spiraling gas prices, American motorists have been treated during the past year by more stable prices, even price wars—something unheard of since 1973, during the past year.

Experts predict that crude oil prices, at least for the near future, are expected to be stable, and although gas prices may fluctuate as much as a dime per gallon, the inflation-adjusted price of crude oil is predicted to drop 14.3 per cent during 1982, and 2.1 per cent in 1983.

The price of Saudi Arabian crude oil has dropped from a level of \$40 per barrel a year ago to \$34 at the present.

While this may be good news to motorists, farmers and other consumers, the domestic oil industry has been thrown into chaos. Where exploration and drilling had caused the oil areas to flourish, operations are now having to be sharply cut back.

The increased activity had been based on oil prices of \$40 per barrel or more, and the oil industry cannot see a profit since the price of oil has dropped. (That begins to sound like farming, doesn't it?)

A spokesman for the domestic oil said that the petroleum industry's rate of spending on expansion would increase only about 14 per cent this year over 1981 levels. This compares to a whopping 39 per cent increase last year.

"When oil prices were moving up, more properties became economical to produce. Now the marginal properties are moving the other way," the spokesman said.

All across the country, the number of working drilling rigs has dropped sharply, and major projects to develop new sources of energy are being slowed or closed down completely.

Experts warn that the consequences of these trends could cause a sharper jump in the level of imports by the second half of the 1980s.

Currently, the United States produces 8.7 million barrels of oil a day, which is an increase from 8.2 million barrels in 1977. This increased production is a result of exploration and development programs begun years ago.

The surge in drilling in 1980-81 will not be felt until around 1984, according to the oil people. The experts agree that the nation's oil production potential is enormous, but is economically feasible only under certain conditions.

And, to say that the "energy crunch" is over or lessening, one would have to make some unrealistic assumptions, such as: "No Middle East dispute will disrupt the world's oil flow," a condition already threatened by the Israeli-Lebanon fighting.

America's dependence on foreign oil has dropped from 48 per cent in 1977 to around 30 per cent at present, an encouraging sign considering that our imports come from the world's most volatile region. But this trend has once again been placed "on hold."

## Area Gets Good Rainfall Sunday, July 11

The Friona area received a good rainfall last Sunday, coming in two separate "doses." One was an early-morning shower leaving about .15 inch, and then beginning about 2:30 p.m., another 1.21 was received in a steady rain lasting about an hour. Total for the day and week. The temperature hit the mid-90s by Thursday.

## Two Killed In Car-Truck Accident Here Tuesday

A Friona man and his six-week-old daughter were killed Tuesday, July 13, when the 1977 Monte Carlo in which they were riding collided with a semi-tractor trailer truck driven by Andrew Fleming, 18, of Friona, at the corner of Highway 214 and Fifth Street.

Esteban Reyes, 21, was pronounced dead at the scene of the accident by Parmer County Justice of the Peace Wayne Spears of Bovina. The infant, Maria Anciono Richardson, was transported to Parmer County Community Hospital where she was pronounced dead on arrival.

City patrolman Mark Ancira said the victims were driving east about 3:30 p.m. when their vehicle was

struck by the truck traveling north on Texas 214. The truck was loaded with wheat and was occupied by Andrew Fleming and his brother, Bruce Fleming, 15. Bruce was admitted to Parmer County Community Hospital where he was treated for injuries.

Andrew Fleming sustained only slight injuries in the wreck. He was treated for shock and released.

Fleming told investigating officers that when he topped the Highway 214 overpass, he realized that his brakes were not working. He began to honk his horn to warn motorists on Fifth Street, but apparently Reyes did not hear the warning, or notice the truck in time.

The impact of the collision pushed the car into the yard of the James

McNeely residence, 710 West Fifth, and the truck came to rest on top of the automobile. Both vehicles stopped just short of the McNeely house, the truck overturning.

The wheat was spilled in the intersection, and covered a portion of Grand Street and a large amount spilled out into the yard.

Local emergency workers were on the scene within minutes, but due to the nature of the wreck, it required about 45 minutes to extricate the bodies of Reyes and the infant.

A drilling truck with a "boom," and one with a forklift were used to pry the truck off the vehicle. Workers from the State Department of Highways and Transportation spent the balance of the day cleaning up the wheat, and replacing road signs which were knocked down by the crash.

It was reported that Reyes was a Mexican National (alien), who had lived in Friona the past three years. He was employed at MBPXL. Fleming, a recent honor graduate of Friona High School, was driving the truck for Hub Grain Company.

The cause of the collision was still under investigation at press time late this week.

## Court OKs Grant To Sr. Citizens

Following a lengthy discussion, the County Commissioners Court, acting on a request by the Bovina Senior Citizens group, agreed to pay the group \$1,200 out of this year's revenue sharing check, which the organization plans to use to help pay utility costs for its senior citizens' center.

The remainder of the General Revenue Sharing Funds are to be divided equally among the four precincts in the county, for maintenance of county roads.

Also meeting with the court were Don Spring and Dick Richards, discussing the equipment needed by Bovina Ambulance Service after Spring completes his paramedic training course, which will be in December.

The court indicated it would try to help, but asked Spring and Richards to check other sources for aid in the interim.

The county's quarterly report was approved unanimously, with the provision that it be published in the three newspapers within Parmer County.

Approval was granted Friona State Bank, which had asked permission to substitute securities pledged against county funds. The request was to substitute a later U.S. Treasury note for one maturing in August. The request was approved.

## Farmers Eligible For Hail Relief

Area farmers, who had their crops wiped out by devastating hail, were made eligible for a portion of a \$400 million disaster relief package which was implemented by Secretary of Agriculture John Block, who announced the program Thursday.

The plan includes four parts: \*Disaster assistance through grants; \*Inclusion of federal crop insurance policy owners in both the disaster program and the FCIC claims; \*Emergency disaster loans through the Farmers Home Administration; and \*Emergency conservation funds to meet erosion problems.

The special disaster payments will include:

\*Cotton, 20.5 cents per pound for crop losses in excess of 25 per cent of the crop;

\*Wheat, \$1.75 per bushel for wheat losses in excess of 40 per cent of the crop.

The pictures are available in 5x7 size, at \$5.00 each.

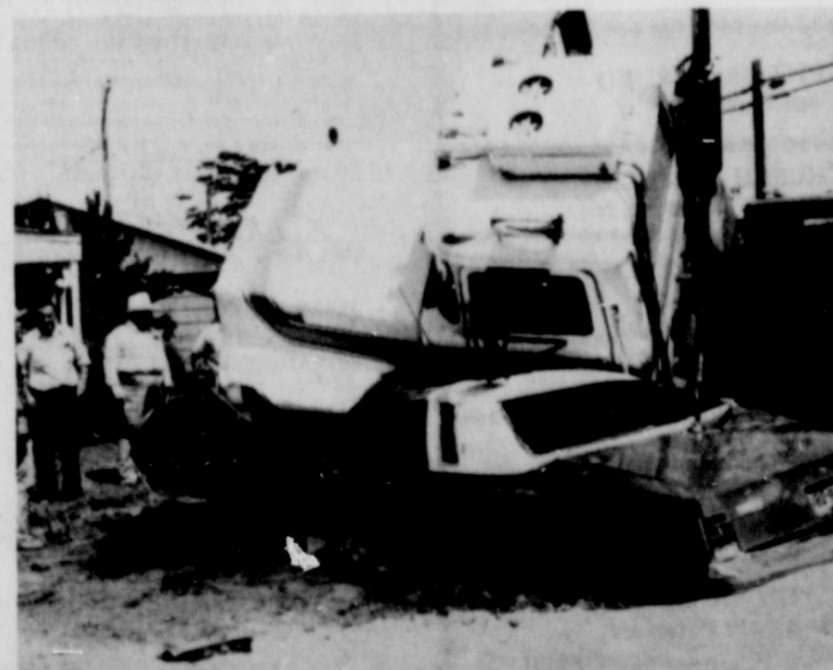

\*Feed grains, 15 cents per bushel for corn; 18 cents per bushel for grain sorghum and 15 cents per bushel for barley for any losses in excess of 40 per cent of these three crops.

Farm leaders applauded the announcement, feeling it may save some farmers from going bankrupt.

Congressman Kent Hance, who worked feverishly on the program, said it was accomplished "because everyone who was affected worked together. He praised the disaster plan, but said only the short-term problem has been addressed. We need to write a new farm bill to do something about inadequate commodity prices," Hance said from Washington.

**50 YEARS AGO—JULY 22, 1932**

Durham, who slept in the building, was preparing to retire when the explosion occurred. The four walls of the building were thrown outward, and the ceiling caved in.

**40 YEARS AGO—JULY 17, 1942**  
Repeating his statement that only a unified effort of all farmers in Parmer County can rid the county of the serious grasshopper menace, County Agent Garlon Harper reported this week that some progress had been made in killing the hoppers and that farmers who have put the poison bait out according to prescribed methods report good results. 'Hoppers are grown now, and in many cases are moving out of wheat land onto land where other crops are growing.

Drawdown on the wells that are producing water now is such that larger pumps and power units will be needed.

**20 YEARS AGO—JULY 19, 1962**

Tulia and Friona.

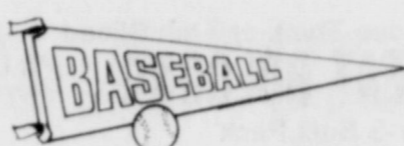

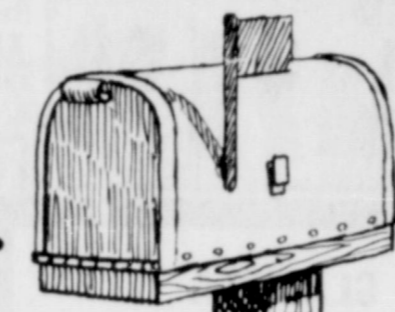
Dear Bill:
