A stepout from the discovery for Ellenburger production in the Borden field of Northwest Borden County has developed its first free oil on a drillstem test in the top of the horizon to which it was



Freight Train Derailed In Midland





Twelve freight cars of a long, diesel-engined Texas and Pacific westbound train were derailed at the Terreil Street Crossing in Midland causing a 14-hour railway traffic delay on the company's main line. Top photo shows the first box car to leave the track. Note how it plowed into the ground. Bottom photo shows twisted rails and a box car turned across the track. Freight cars loaded with pipe, flour, sugar, beer, salt, lumber and drilling mud were derailed. One derailed freight car punctured a diesel fuel storage tank along the railroad right of way. Wrecking crews from Toyah and Big Spring cleared the wreckage and repaired the tracks. No one was injured in the derailment.



# Britain Must Produce More

Great Britain evidently is under no illusions that its devaluation of the pound can provide anything but shortrun relief in its widely heralded "dollar crisis."

The British expect, of course, that a rise in the volume and worth of its exports to the dollar countries will occur. Unless that happens, the major goal of devaluation will not be achieved.

Yet even if that objective is attained, there is no great hope that the benefits to Britain will be sufficient to serve as a permanent solution of its difficulties.

Sir Stafford Cripps, British chancellor of the exchequer, made plain that the closing of the gap between Britain's exports and imports can only be accomplished in the end by a greatly increased productivity from its

He acknowledged to his country that the decision to cheapen the pound was made reluctantly, that Britain would rather have put all its faith on rising productivity and other means of boosting exports.

"The time is now so short and our reserves have got so low that a change in the dollar rate of exchange is the only way in which we can get our prices down quickly enough," he concluded.

There is more to this statement than may at first be apparent. When the dollar conference in Washington wound up, the three participating countries - Britain, Canada and the United States-announced a program designed to cope with the British crisis through both immediate and long-term measures. They voiced guarded optimism over prospects for easing the problem.

It is obvious now that Canada and the United States knew of the British intent to devalue, even while the conference was on. Their optimism therefore may have reflected that knowledge rather than any great enthusiasm | way and generally is sympathetic to for the short-run objectives of the program.

For it is clear from Cripps' statement to the British people that those immediate steps were not counted on heavily by Britain's leaders. They would give the United Kingdom a freer hand in spending Marshall Plan dollars. eliminate U. S. customs red tape, and explore the possibility of heavier American purchases of tin, rubber and other British Empire products which might fit into our stockpiling program.

If these moves actually were to be given great weight, Cripps would not have stressed the nearness of financial disaster when he announced devaluation. He brushed the short-run Washington program aside, and declared that cheapening of the pound was a necessary device to buy time until higher productivity and better selling methods -the long-range goals-could come into play.

TULSA, OKLA.—(P)—Daily average crude oil production in the United States picked up 44,300 barrels during the week ended September 24, the Oil and Gas Journal reported Tuesday.

The Journal totaled the overall daily average at 4,881,125 barrels. The Mid-Continent area was responsible for more than 60 per cent of the gain, with Oklahoma and Kansas reporting their highest averages since the last week in June. Kansas' output increased 25,-250 barrels to 275,250, and Oklahoma gained 3,650 to 391,000.

Michigan's production advanced 4,200 barrels to 46,400 after having declined in the previous three weeks. Mississippi gained 5,550 barrels to 101,100, slightly above its average for the last four months. Other Increases

Other increases included the Eastern area, up 4,200 barrels to 61.400: Colorado, 1.800 to 65.000: Wyoming, 600 to 127,100; Louisiana, 450 to 486,400, and California and Kentucky, each up 400 barrels to 494,000 and 23,500 barrels, respec-

Production in Texas was unchanged at 1,979,100 barrels. Only sizeable decline for the week was in Illinois, down 1,600 barrels

Alabama dropped 150 barrels to 1,300, Arkansas was off 100 to 70,-500, Florida fell 150 to 975, Indiana declined 100 to 27,300, Nebraska was down 50 to 550, and Utah dropped Canada's production, the Journal said, was up 2,135 barrels to 70,920.




violence quickly arrested 17 pickets.


