## Christmas Project Kicks Off Here

Modern Study Club will sponsor "Project Christmas Card" in Friona for the 27th consecutive year, it was announced this week.

The project benefits Parmer County Community Hospital during the Christmas season each year, and in the course of its previous 26 years has raised over \$52,000 to purchase equipment for the local hospital.

Equipment which cost over \$37,500 has been provided in the past eleven years by gifts to the project. Last year the project raised \$4,004.61, which provided a new "call" system for nurses on duty.

Linda Murphree, chairman of Project Christmas Card for 1982, said that the money raised this year will go to purchase a warming table for the hospital's delivery room.

Cost of the table is expected to be around \$3,000. Any money left over will be placed in a special account which is to be started for a new X-Ray machine for the hospital.

Administrator Elda Hart said the hospital's current X-Ray machine was bought in about 1946, and is beginning to feel its age. It had to be repaired recently, and it isn't known just how long it will last. A new machine is expected to cost between \$40,000 and \$50,000.

It was felt that if a special account was started for the X-Ray machine, individuals might want to contribute to it.

Residents of the area are requested each year by Modern Study Club to donate to the fund rather than mailing Christmas cards to local friends.

Names of those contributing are published on a full-page in the Christmas edition of the Friona Star, as a community-wide greeting to everyone in the area, as well as those outside the area who receive the paper. The Star donates the full page to the project each year.

Donations may be left at Friona State Bank. Club members also will place containers at a number of local businesses, where residents, may leave their donations.

Deadline for donating to the fund and being a part of this year's project will be Wednesday, December 15.

There is no set amount for the donations, but each person or family is requested to donate at least the amount of money they would normally spend on Christmas cards and postage, mailing to friends and relatives.

Mrs. Murphree, chairman of the 1982 project, has as members of her committee Laverne Burrow, Mary Moseley and Sherri Taylor.

Posters and containers are to be placed in local businesses Friday, November 26.

In recent years, the project fund has purchased a heart monitoring unit, automatic beds for the new

hospital wing, heating and air conditioning for the emergency and surgery rooms, fire alarm system for the building and an anesthetic machine.

Also, a Coulter counter, a monitor for the surgery room, a spirometer (a device to measure pulmonary functions for lung patients), I.V. drip counters, a table and carts for the operating room and a new light for the emergency room.

Beginning in 1970, the project has selected a particular object or need for its funds, and in that time has purchased equipment costing roughly \$40,000.

Project Christmas Card has become a fine way for residents of the area, and even former residents, to say "Merry Christmas" to their friends, and at the same time assist Parmer County Community Hospital.

## Team Has Tournament

The Friona High School Forensics team entered the Levelland High School speech tournament November 20.

Debaters Patti Hinton and Stan Miller placed third, for Friona's best showing. Carrie Schueler and Tory Taylor earned the semi-final round in informative speaking, and Gayla Stowers was a semi-finalist in prose reading.

Other students participating included Brent Hinkle and Bill Caudill, debate; Trey Collier, informative speaking; Ana Ramirez and Lynn Stevens, persuasive speaking; Leslee Upton and Chuck Ellis, prose reading; Cindy Drake and Sheri Dodson, poetry reading.

Twelve schools, from the size of Wilson High School to Lubbock Monterey, took part in the tournament.

## United Fund Nears Goal

The Friona Area United Fund drive for 1982 had passed the \$10,000 mark as of Wednesday of this week, and co-chairmen Mike Hanes and Keith Black were optimistic that the goal would be met.

The amount raised as of Wednesday amounted to 83 per cent of the goal of \$12,350.

"We still have some packets out, and feel that victory is within reach. Families who might have been missed by the canvass are urged to contribute, either to Keith or myself, or at the bank," Hanes said.

**PRESIDENT REAGAN'S** announcement this week concerning the plan for the MX Missile system to be located in Wyoming ended several years of debate and speculation as to where the controversial defense system would be located.

At one point during the Carter Administration, one plan had been advanced to locate the system in Eastern New Mexico and West Texas, which brought howls of protest from the farming community, which saw that plan as a threat to the area's farmland.

The later plan, which included the proposed "Dense Pack" system, was considered a possibility for Eastern New Mexico. From a security standpoint, since Clovis already has Cannon Air Base, the addition of the MX might not have been that bad a deal, considering the impact that it would have had on the Clovis area economy.

But the decision has now been made, subject to the approval of congress, which still will have the final say-so in regard to the MX proposition.

There has been some opposition all along to the MX Missile system in congress. Some say that the system is out of date, before the engineering even begins. Others argue that rather than locate our missiles in a place easy to chart by an enemy, we should come up with a system of placing them on submarines, or have airplanes capable of launching defense missiles.

So, the MX missile system will be one which faces considerable debate in congress.

It is really tough to know what to do. The president's argument that we need some type of system, to serve as a deterrent to the Soviets, and to give our country more "bargaining chips" in international talks, is reasonable.

But the final decision by congress may come down to the fact of whether or not the MX is, as President Reagan calls it "The Missile for the Times."

The debate has (as usual), already begun on television and in the mass media, which sees themselves as the nation's problem solvers. Hopefully, congress will take its time in addressing the matter, and attempt to get the feelings of their constituents on the matter.

**THE NFL STRIKE** is apparently over, and for millions of Americans, watching football on Sunday afternoons has returned as a pastime. Even though yours truly has promised to cut down on the amount of time spent in front of the "hoop tube," I just had to catch Sunday's Dallas Cowboy game, for "research purposes."

What I discovered was an angle which had been overlooked by all the experts and commentators on the game. They were all worried about the quality of play, and whether or not there might be injuries, due to the eight-week layoff; how crisp the play would be, etc., etc.

The thing that was overlooked was whether or not the game officials (the guys who are charged with throwing flags) would be at their peak. After watching the Dallas game, my conclusion was that the players seemed to perform much better than expected, both on offense and defense.

But the guys who throw the flags must have had their minds on those rose beds they had started digging during the strike, or how they were going to get some other project finished up. They definitely weren't watching the same game I was.

## 50 YEARS AGO--NOV. 18, 1932

The city authorities of Friona are sponsoring a community program for a Thanksgiving dinner, the services to be held in the Capital Theatre and a basket dinner to be spread at some convenient place in town, probably in the J.W. Parr garage building on Fifth Street.

A.C. Echols, proprietor of the Friona Drug Company, has this week moved his store from the room in the theatre building, owned by O.G. Turner, where he has been located ever since coming to Friona. His store is installed in the T.J. Crawford building, adjoining the post office building.

## 40 YEARS AGO--NOV. 20, 1942

Because of the unusual amount of rough feed and pasture here, many carloads of cattle have been shipped into this locality and unloaded at Friona for winter feeding and pasture.

W.S. Menefee was chosen Saturday night by community committeemen delegates to head the Parmer County AAA Committee, with John G. McFarland, vice-chairman, Albert H. Smith, regular member, and Keith Pigg and Otho Whitefield, alternates. John Martin will serve as secretary-treasurer of the

committee, which took office this week instead of waiting until January 1, as has been the custom in the past.

## 30 YEARS AGO--NOV. 20, 1952

Friona will play Idalou for bi-district honors on Thanksgiving Day. Site of the much-anticipated play-off will be the Plainview High School stadium, a point mutually agreed upon by two contesting schools as a desirable central location.

As winners at the Muleshoe meet, the Friona teams will compete this Saturday in the area contests at Plainview.

## 25 YEARS AGO--NOV. 21, 1957

The champions of District 3-A, the

Friona Chiefs, meet the ruler of the 4-A district, the Ralls Jackrabbits, Saturday in a top-flight contest. The game is to be played in Plainview. The Jackrabbits have demonstrated their tremendous power in season games, losing only one of 10.

Equipment for establishing a base radio station for the Friona Police Department arrived at City Hall Tuesday morning. Included in the base station will be four mobile units and a monitoring receiver for the New Mexico State Police frequency in Clovis.

## 20 YEARS AGO--NOV. 22, 1962

C.H. Veazey of Friona won the two free tickets to the Cotton Bowl game January 1, along with \$55 expense money, but it took a check of the tie-breaker scores to break a tie between Veazey and Waymon Wilkins. Veazey and Wilkins tied with 74 correct games during the course of the contest.

Temperatures fell to the 20s in Friona last week for the first time this season, as a moisture laden three-inch snow halted harvest operations throughout the county.

## 15 YEARS AGO--NOV. 23, 1967

Lloyd Thompson, a former resident of the Friona area who lived near Amarillo the past few years, is the manager of the PACO feed mill south of Hub, which will manufacture a cotton feeding supplement

from cotton burrs.

## 10 YEARS AGO--NOV. 23, 1972

### Steven P. Riff Is New Staff Member

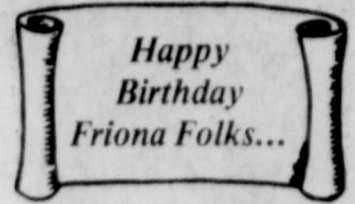

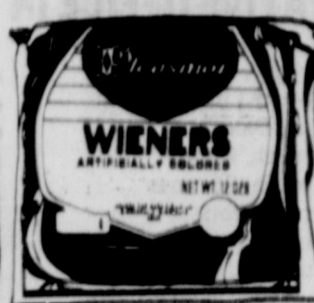

## Lila Vars Is Named Development Director

Lila Vars, who has worked as associate registrar at West Texas State University, Canyon, for the past eight years, has been appointed as the new director of development at WTSU.

She assumed the duties as the major fund-raiser of the university immediately following her appointment.

Dr. Don Cates, dean of admissions and registrar, said a replacement in the Registrar's Office will be hired "as soon as possible," although the title and duties may vary.

"She's been such a valuable person to this office that she'll be a difficult person to replace," he said.

Vars will be the second director of development at WTSU. The position was created in 1973 when Keith Winter became director of development. He was involved in recruiting and fund-raising, in addition to several other activities until he resigned in August to join a community development firm in Dallas.

She will raise funds for the university as she travels throughout the Panhandle region. She will be responsible for the President's Development Fund and the Endowment for Excellence. The Development Office also administers a number of memorial scholarship funds. She also will serve in an advisory capacity to the WTSU Foundation, whose members are Panhandle area residents who assist WTSU administrators with fund-raising.

"This is a role of continuing importance to West Texas State University," said Dr. Gail Shannon, WTSU president. "Mrs. Vars, in her role of associate registrar, built an outstanding reputation in her relationship with students, faculty, academic administrators, prospective students and parents."

"Her fine background should permit her to move ahead immediately in various areas of fund development that are critical in the growing life of WTSU."

A graduate of Friona High School and Texas Tech University with a bachelor's degree in education, Vars taught at schools in Lubbock and Canyon before joining the registrar's staff at WTSU in 1974. In addition to her duties as associate registrar, she served as director of the Office of Programs for Women for two years and was chairperson of the governing board of the Children's Center. She was instrumental in establishing a location for the Children's Center at the WTSU Fieldhouse and beginning the center for the care and instruction of children of WTSU students, faculty and staff members. She also traveled as a recruiter.

Since August, she has supervised the activities of the WTSU Campus Services students, who serve as official hosts and hostesses of the university, and the WTSU Student Foundation. Members of the WTSU Student Foundation raised more than \$50,000 in pledges during the October

phone campaign. The total is beyond the \$40,000 goal.

She is a member of the Alpha Delta Pi sorority Alumnae Association, an honorary member of Scribes Honor Society, a member of Wives, Etc., and Women Involved in New Goals and chaired three Texas Panhandle Distinguished Services Awards luncheons. She also serves as an active participant on nine university committees including Parents Day and Buffalo Branding, the successful orientation program for beginning freshman students.

Community service has been important to Vars. She joined a local federated women's club in 1966 and became president of the local club, a district officer for junior clubs and became the youngest president to serve the Top of Texas District of Federated Clubs. A number of duties involved more than 2,000 women from 73 clubs.

She also is a member of the Canyon Study Club and was elected to a three-year term on the board of the Canyon Independent School District in 1981. She chairs the scholarship committee and teaches a class at the First Baptist Church of Canyon.

Vars is married to Don Max Vars, who is chairperson of the board of the First National Bank of Canyon. Their two daughters are Mayla Vars Paris, a sophomore mathematics education major at WTSU, and Misty, a junior at Canyon High School.

### DON'T LET BABY GET BORED!

From birth an infant's eyes are constantly changing, and they need the kind of stimulation in surroundings which parents can easily provide. Keep a dim light on in the nursery-after dark so that, when baby's awake, he or she will have something to look at. Move the crib around the room so that light will come from different directions. Also, you can shift the infant's position in the crib so that light attracts baby's attention from different sides.

When an infant is five to six weeks old, it's time to help him or her learn to follow a moving object with the eyes. Hang a brightly colored mobile toy for visual interest over the crib at eye level. Even babies can get bored looking at the same surroundings hour after hour...so provide some variety for your baby.

Such simple practices as feeding or changing your baby from alternate sides can give different SEEING experiences. A rattle will help a child to follow sound with the eyes. The game of "pat-a-cake" teaches visual lessons, too. During your baby's first months, modify the nursery environment to help develop visual skills.
