"This must find expression in political negotiations which show a willingness to compromise. Without such a will, without cooperation and agreement, let me emphásize that no mechanism for the maintenance of international peace and security, however perfect, can be effective.

There is widespread fear among UN diplomats that unless Moscow and Washington can be persuaded to find some grounds of common curpose the showdown now developing may lead to an actual breakup of the UN organization as it is at present constituted.

These fears were given new point Tuesday by word from authoritative Soviet informants that Russia might boycott the proposed new Assembly Security Committee if the United States succeeded, as expected, in persuading the assembly to create such an agency.

The Fifth Annual Midland County Fair now is his tory and dates already have been set for a bigger and better fair next year. The 1948 exhibition is scheduled September 17-18.

This year's fair, which ended Saturday night, was a record-breaker from every standpoint, with more interest and enthusiasm shown by more persons and organizations than ever before. Sponsors were more than pleased with the number and quality of items entered in all divisions, and were disappointed only in that some items could not be accepted for display and judging because of lack of space in the exhibit building. The attendance at the fair also was most pleasing.

The event was sponsored by the Midland Chamber of Commerce, in cooperation with other organizations and groups, and congratulations upon the success of the event are in order for each organization and for each individual who had a part in it.

That the dates have been set for next year's fair should be an incentive to citizens of the county to start planning and working now on exhibits to be entered in the 1948 event. Heretofore, it has not been known in advance whether a fair would be held or when, and as a result very little planning or preparation was possible in ad-

With advance work and planning, next year's exhibits will be more numerous and of better quality than ever before.

Senatoring Ain't Easy

Just about the only senator you see regularly around the Capitol these hot recess days is Senator Sheridan Downey of California.

He'll show you a good reason why he is forsaking the vacationland wonders of his own state for steaming Washington—a desk piled high with work. If you can drag him away from his dictating or reading, he'll tell you in no uncertain terms just how much work there is in being a senator. But he wouldn't have it otherwise.

First, he says, about 90 per cent of all the senators; are overworked. The rest, somehow, have learned to do only what they are physically able to handle, he claims.

lie says that the office work alone could take up 100 per cent of a senator's time, if he would let it. He estimates that between 300 and 400 letters a day come into his office. Most of them require work to be done or calls to be made. About 20 per cent of this routine, he estimates, is of such a nature that he has to tend to it personally. The rest, which he never sees, is done by his

When it comes to legislating, the senator says to be an expert on any of the big bills under consideration at a session takes long hours of study. The result is having to take the word of hired experts, or the words of the other senators, on much legislation.

Another High Price Probe

The government's relentless statistical assault on the high cost of thing continues.

The next agency to tell U.S. citizens that prices are too high will be the Federal Trade Commission. It's going to be a report on an investigation of how high prices have remained on certain consumer goods which are controlled by "manufacturers' restrictions."

There is feverish activity to get it completed by the end of September. The reason for all the rush in the midst of the Summer heat is that it's really the second time the FTC has tried to do the job. The first time the prices rose so fast that, by the time the report returned from the printers, it was obsolete.

This particular FTC investigation got started last Winter when the "Newburyport Plan" was big news. Remember? That was the plan cooked up by a group of merchants in the small Massachusetts town, based on the apparently fallacious idea that you could get prices down by simply lowering them. Prices weren't so bad then.
