

PLYMOUTH TO DIG ANOTHER WILDCAT IN N-C STERLING

The Plymouth Oil Company No. 1 Willie Mae Foster is to be a wildcat to 9,000 feet, or oil, gas or water in the Ellenburger, at a higher level, in North-Central Sterling County. Drilling with rotary is to start at once.

The prospector is to be 660 feet from north and west lines of section 56, block 2. H&TC survey. That puts it 2,951.6 feet southwest of the same company No. 1 Frost, discovery for some sort of oil production from the Ellenburger between 8,360 feet and the new bottom at 8.393 feet.

No. 1 Frost showed' oil at the barrels per hour; flowing natural, from perforated section above 8.-379 feet, and then the well started making water, and on last tests.

Mandate Rule Of 25 Years May End Soon

LAKE SUCCESS-(P)-Britain announced Friday she had decided to end her 25-year mandate rule over Palestine if the United Nations failed to find a settlement of the Holy Land problem acceptable to both Jews and Arabs.

· Colonial Secretary Arthur Creech-Jones advised the General Assembly's 55-nation Palestine Committee that the problem of enforcing any unpopular settlement would have to be handled by the UN itself-and not Britain.

Creech-Jones also declared that Britain was ready to

surrender her League of Nations mandate over the strifebly's final decisions. A British spokesman made it

clear that the question of terminating the mandate and the question of withdrawing entirely from Palestine were separate matters.

Price Five Cents

He explained that Britain would be willing to continue in Palestine on a different status after, the mandate was ended if Arab-Jewish agreement could be reached. This could take the form of a United Nations trusteeship administered by Britain in place of the mandate.



Seaboard Oil Company of Delaware No. 1 Wrenchey.
