City Firemen Inspect Business Houses For Safety Precautions

Wednesday, Inspection Day of National Fire Prevention Week, found firemen examining downtown business establishments, checking on fire extinguishers, exits, and hazards. Some businesses maintain excellent preventive programs and are equipped to fight possible fires with maximum efficiency, they found. Others were found to be lax in many respects, and owners of these were cautioned to improve certain conditions or risk high fire losses

Inspection blanks, to be used by home owners in making certain there were no fire hazards on their property, were distributed throughout the city by school children and others. In preparing for Inspection Day, students of the Latin-American school Tuesday conducted a general program of trash-raking and hauling which drew commendation from the Fire Committee of the Midland Jaycees, sponsors of the week-long campaign to make Midland safer from fire less.

"All-teachers" said School Superintendent Frank Monroe, "have co-operated whole - heartedly in teaching the rules of fire safety to their classes and the pupils have shown an intense interest in fire prevention. Every pupil has been given a Home Inspection Blank and has promised to use the blank in investigation of fire hazards.

Rails Get Emergency Freight Rate Hike

WASHINGTON - (A) - A 10 per cent emergency freight rate increase amounting to \$700,000,000 annually has been granted to the nation's railroads, which hoped Wednesday to put the boost into

effect next Monday. The Interstate Commerce Commission authorized the temporary privy seal increase Tuesday, pending a decision on the railroad's plea for a permanent 27 per cent increase over present rates. The ICC also:

Authorized all domestic water carriers and freight forwarders to make the same 10 per cent in-

In a separate action, gave 37 to advance passenger fares for sleeping and parlor cars from 3.3 to 3.5 cents a mile and authorized 26 southern roads to raise basic coach fares from 2.2 to 2.5 cents

The passenger fare increases may be put into effect on five days notice but the roads gave no indication when they might act.

Cotton Estimate Is 341,000 Bales Down

WASHINGTON -(AP)- The Agri-Mrs. culture Department Wednesday estimated this year's cotton crop at 11,508,000 bales of 500 pounds gross

This estimate is a decrease of 341,-000 bales over the 11,849,000 bales forecast a month ago. Production was 8.640,000 bales last year and 12,-390,000 bales for the 10-year (1936-45) average.

The indicated yield of lint cottonper acre was reported at 261.3 pounds, compared with 269 a month ago, 235.3 last year and 250.6 for the 10-year average. The condition of the crop on Oc-

tober 1 was reported at 72 per cent of normal, compared with 73 per cent a month ago, 63 per cent a year ago and 71 per cent for the 10vear average.

In an accompanying report, the Census Bureau stated that 3,898,767 bales from this year's crop were ginned prior to October 1. This compared with 2,334,443 bales ginned to the same date last year and 2,177,768 to the sant date two years ago.

About 35 per cent of the areas of the 24 U.S. national parks are timbered, representing about 19 million acres of forest land.

Michigan, Big Nine favorite with two impressive triumphs under its belt, landed the No. 2 position in the poll. The Wolverines, who were sixth in the final poll last season, drew 29 first-place votes and 46 for second place.

Texas Rates 790 Points On the basis of ten points for a first-place vote, nine for second, and so on, Notre Dame compiled 933 points, compared with 857 for Michigan.

Third place went to Texas, the team which led the voting in the first poll a year ago. The Longhorns, unbeaten in three starts, polled 15 first-place votes on the strength of their 34-0 win over North Carolina and wound up with 790 points. Texas finished in 15th place last year.
