The cost of living spiral appeared headed toward the year's record peak set a month ago Wednesday as the nation's shoppers still hunted for the elusive food article bearing marked down price tags.

Action on most of the country's commodity, markets Tuesday gave consumers little hope that any immediate reduction in the high cost of basic foods was imminent. There was one exception, however as butter dropped to the lowest wholesale price level in Chicago since last June 27. The top sold at 67 cents a pound. In New York the top grade wholesale butter declined 31/2 cents to 70 cents a



After twice adjusting their sights to accommodate American suggestions, 16 "Western" European nations ask the New World for \$22.4 billions in the coming four years. The United States is asked to provide \$15.81 bil-

This is the answer of Europe, excluding the Soviet bloc which, as usual, refused to cooperate, to the question propounded by Secretary of State Marshall:

If you could get it, how much would you need to repair the worst ravages of war, avoid economic collapse, and get back to where you could support yourselves by your own production?

The 16 countries, plus Western Germany, have answered, in effect:

'If you will let us have \$22.4 billions from 1948 through 1951 we will work like beavers. We will try ao get our farms, our mines, our factories producing faster than they were in 1938. We will rehabilitate our railroads, replace our sunk shipping.

"We will take for our own use only what is absolutely necessary. By the end of 1951 we still will be so short that we shall have to ration. But we believe that, by then, with rationing, we shall be able to live on our own production plus what we can pay for with the income from the school kids learn to spell Tschexports.

Building Costs Rise Now 100 Per Cent

NEW YORK -(A)- A national average increase of 104 per cent in building costs since 1941 was reported by the Dow Service, which based, its findings on a survey in 140 cities throughout the 48 states.

The increase, said Myron L. Matthews in the Dow Service daily building reports "is due more to the cost of materials delivered at the site of construction than to labor's wage increases, adjusted.






