

HISTORY WAS MADE in America this week, as for the first time in the 198-year history of the republic, a president resigned from office.

Laying aside the arguments pro and con, whether or not you agreed with President Richard Nixon's resignation, you have to be awed by its very occurrence.

Apparently, only one other president was ever in danger of impeachment, in a trial that did go to the senate, failing by one

We've had presidents die in office; we've even in our recent history been forced to see one assassinated. Incumbent presidents have been beaten at the polls for re-election. But never, until this past Thursday night, had we had a president resign from office.

DUE TO A STRANGE turn of events, our country now has a president that has not received the majority vote, popular or electoral, of the American electorate.

Since former vice president Spiro Agnew resigned last year, and was replaced by the appointment of Jerry Ford, we had a successor to the president who had been appointed and

And, for the second time within a year, we are without a vice president, and must now find another "back-up" man who also must be of an appointive nature.

PRESIDENT NIXON no doubt saved the nation the ordeal of going through with what could have been a lengthy impeachment trial.

Our nation has definitely lost face, and probably will count a great number of other losses, due to all of the time that congress and the national leaders have spent during the past two years on the Watergate affair.

The big-city press, radio and television undoubtedly had a big hand in the events leading toward impeachment that caused President Nixon to resign. Yet, he is to be admired for making no comments in this regard in his speech Thursday night.

Considering the magnitude of the subject, and all of the trauma that President Nixon had been through for so long, he exhibited amazing calm and command of the situation during his resignation speech.

We thought the television networks overdid the situation a bit in the hours leading up to the speech by telling the listeners what President Nixon was going to say. They just couldn't resist "stealing his thunder" a little bit.

IF DEMOCRACY has been served, we would hope that America can now get back to the business of caring for its needs, for solving inflation, for taking steps to alleviate shortages of precious commod ities as energy and water.

IN DEFENSE of Gerald Ford. it has been pointed out that he underwent a thorough investigation last fall prior to being approved by the Senate as the choice for the vice president's position.

He was possibly the most thoroughly investigated man to ever hold the office, it was stated. Moreover, he was found "clean."

At least, congress has in this manner approved the new president. Here's hoping they will get behind him, and that America can get back on the road to being the great nation that it once was.

Parents of kindergarten students and others who have not previously provided immunization records and birth certificates are asked to bring these records on registration


Superintendent Jarboe said that the shots required by the Friona school system are the same as they have been in the past-polio, rubeola, rubella, and DPT.



October 4, 1945, is the date on the charter granted Parmer County Community Hospital as a non-profit organization, Signatures on this document are those of Joe Poindexter, Pete Buske, Sloan Osborn and Frank A. Spring.



More Marriages -- Fewer Babies




more, divorcing more, having fewer babies, but still sacrificing many women's lives to childbirth.

According to the Vital Statistics Report, there were 2.2 million marriages in 1972, a three percent rise over the year before.

Divorces continued to grow more common, too, with Florida and Arkansas registering the biggest increases while Delaware and Michigan had the deepest drops in divorce.

How hazardous to a woman's health childbirth and its complications can still be is also illustrated by the Government Report. It says that as the result of becoming pregnant, at least 780 women lost their lives in 1972.

Individuals who find they are earning less than they originally estimated may get additional social security payments during 1974 if they report the change. However, people earning more than they originally expected, and who don't report the change, may get payments not due them, and have to pay back some money at the end of the year," Ent cautioned.

"Social security payments are not affected by earnings of \$2,400 or less for the year. Payments are reduced \$1 for each \$2 earned over \$2,400. But no matter how much an individual earns in a year, he can get full social security payment for any month in which he neither earns over \$200 in wages nor does



Whatever your tastes may be or whatever food you may desire there is just the cookbook you may want at Friona Public Library.

"The Yankee Cook Book" by Imogene Wolcott is an anthology of recipes from six New England states with a little something added about the people in that area and an explanation of how the recipe came to be.

Anadama Bread, which is a favorite of the Frank Spring family in Friona, was invented a long time ago by a fisherman who had a lazy wife and often had to do his own cooking. According to the author, the fisherman experimented with the recipe, which he named after his wife, "Anna, damn her." Polite society modified this to Anadama Bread.

New England kitchens carried a tradition of "smelling good", a condition not present in modern kitchens, states Wolcott. Recipes for chowders, johnnycake, hasty pudding and a New England clam bake are given to help you "perfume"

Hasty Pudding was a favorite supper dish on New England farms where it was sometimes called Stir-about Pudding. It was cooked in a big iron kettle. As the hungry children waited for the fresh warm milk that was to be poured over it, they would watch it pop and sputter. Sometimes it was poured into a

big yellow bowl and served for dessert. Any pudding that was not eaten was turned into a bread pan, sliced and fried for breakfast.

To make Hasty Pudding bring 6 cups of water to a rapid boil in the top of a double boiler; add 1 teaspoon salt. Slowly sift in one cup yellow cornmeal, stirring constantly until mixture is smooth and boils. Set over hot water and steam for 30 minutes or longer. Serve hot with molasses or milk, or sugar and butter with

nutmeg. Recipe serves 8. If you try this, be sure to remind your children that this is the Hasty Pudding of Yankee Doodle fame






