#### Ninety-Two Seniors By Bill Ellis To Receive Degrees

ONE GOOD THING that has come out of the farm strike, or American Agriculture Movement is the new political awareness that has been generated by the movement.

"The farmers went to Washington in an attempt to save agriculture. They came home intent on saving their country," said candidate Jim Reese in a recent visit to the county.

Political observers cannot remember when as much interest has been expressed at the grassroots of the political organizations-the precinct and county conventions.

All across the county, the precinct conventions were packed, with people not only interested, but prepared to offer resolutions, and to argue in their behalf. The same was true of the Democratic and Republican county conventions this past week.

A longtime Democratic leader remarked that this was a big improvement from the days when you had to call around on the day of the convention, to make sure you had enough party faithful at the precinct convention to elect your slate of delegates to the upcoming county convention.

As was indicated in the above statement concerning the farmers, in getting familiar with the political processes, and finding out what was going on, a number of folks who previously had not been that interested in politics are suddenly becoming well versed on such

ibjects as gun control laws, foreign ivestors bidding to take over certain industries, the "one-world" movement promulgated by the Trilateral commission, along with several others.

Our nation was founded by basically a group of farmers, who carved from the wilderness the original farmsteads. It may be that our farmers have started the ball rolling toward getting our nation back under the control of its people, as it was originally established.

If this happens, then the farmers will have earned the most profitable return they could have ever achieved on their investment.

#### Hearing Called On Water Problem





#### Mailbox Week Set May 22-27

The Postal Service designates a week during May each year when customers on rural, city motorized, and contract delivery mail routes are encouraged to examine and improve, where necessary, the appearance of their mailboxes.

The week of May 22-27 has been selected this year. The purpose of Mailbox Improvement Week is to call attention to the need for providing mail receptacles which are designed to protect the mail from the weather and are neat in appearance, conveniently located, and safe to use. "Neat, attractive mailboxes make a significant contribution to the appearance of the countryside and the streets in suburban areas," said Postmaster Richard Wilson.

Where box numbers are assigned, rural route box numbers must be shown on the side of the box visible to the approaching carrier, or on the door where boxes are grouped. If the box is located on the street other than the one on which the customer resides, the street name and house number must be inscribed on the

In all instances, placing the owner's name on the box is optional. Generally, boxes should be installed with the bottom of the box between three and one-half and four feet from the roadway. However, due to varying road and curb conditions,

and other factors, it recommended that customers contact the postmaster or carrier prior to initially erecting or replacing their mailbox and support.

On city motorized routes with curbline delivery, it is recommended that the box be either the approved traditional rural type box or an approved suburban box of contemporary design. Boxes designed primarily for use by customers receiving door delivery are difficult to serve efficiently from a vehicle and their use is not encouraged.

However, any box that gives protection to the mail and allows safe, convenient delivery from the carriers vehicle is acceptable. Boxers should be installed with bottom of the box between three and one-half and four feet from the coadway. Where boxes are not located directly in front of the customer's residence, the house number must be shown on the box.

When a mailbox is newly installed or an unsuitable receptacle is replaced on contract delivery routes, and approved box of either the traditional rural type or contemporary design must be installed.

Mailboxes on both rural and contract routes must be located on the right-hand side of the road in the direction traveled by the carrier. The box must be placed and served to comply with state laws and highway and postal regulations. The carrier must have access without having to leave the vehicle.

Supports for mailboxes should be of adequate strength and size to properly support the box. Reports have been received that some mailbox supports are so massive that they are damaging the vehicles and causing serious injuries to the people who accidently strike them.

The use of heavy metal posts, concrete posts, and miscellaneous items of farm equipment, such as milk cans filled with concrete, should be avoided. The ideal support is an assembly which, if struck, will bend or fall away from the striking vehicle instead of severely damaging the vehicle and injuring its cocupants.

#### Democrats Name State Delegates

Parmer County Democrats elected four delegates and three alternates to the state convention in a harmonious county convention at Friona last Saturday, May 13. The meeting was well-attended, with virtually all of the county's elected delegates at the meeting.

Delegates elected were Hollis Horton, Jerry Fancher, Ralph Roming and Jerry Don Glover. Alternates selected were Sue Fancher, Donna Roming and Donna Glover.

The state convention will be held in Austin in September.

Following the election of delegates the convention passed a total of nine resolutions, which will be forwarded to the state Democratic Convention which will be asked to consider the resolutions.

Resolutions included one supporting the state's right to work law; and a resolution calling for stricter guidelines for the Texas Education Agency, which was criticized for the types of programs and requirements it places upon local school districts.

Resolution number three objected to the establishing of governmentregulated child care centers for pre-schoolers, which are supposed to make it easier for mothers to work, but could turn the youngsters into a military-type program at an early

Two other resolutions objected to extending the time limit for states to approve the Equal Rights (ERA) amendment, and the use of tax funds for promoting the IWY (International Woman's Year.)

A sixth resolution was passed objecting to the use of tax dollars for abortions.

A pair of resolutions were passed which were sponsored by the American Agriculture Movement. One objected to foreign investors in the state, calling for such foreign investors to be subject to the same tax structure as American citizens. The article also asked that such foreign investors be given a time limit to sell their property, or see the property liquidated and confiscated.

The other proposal called for the support of the AAM's five-point program, which calls for 100 per cent of parity, creation of an entity composed of agricultural producers to devise and approve policies that affect agriculture.

The final resolution opposed the registration of firearms, calling for support of the right to bear arms. It denied the use of tax dollars to enforce the registering of firearms.

#### Twelve Items Are Approved By GOPs

Parmer County's Republican party, in its county convention at Bovina last Saturday, passed a total of 12 resolutions to be forwarded to the state convention, and selected a slate of three delegates to the

Delegates elected were Ellen Estes of Bovina; Ron Awtrey of Friona and Jimmy Briggs of Lazbuddie.

Resolutions passed included favoring the five-point proposals by the American Agriculture Movement, calling for 100 per cent parity and more control by farmers over their commodities; opposition to the United Kingdom Treaty which exempts foreign investors from paying taxes required of American citizens; and opposing the Human Rights Covenants which denies rights of private property holdings.

Other resolutions urged repeal of the Supreme Court ruling that requires school children to be bussed away from the school in their neighborhood, called for the abolishment of Daylight Savings Time, and called for reforms in the Welfare program to eliminate fraud and abuse.

Another resolution asked for elected Republican officials to uphold the party platform; and another called for our nation's defense and military be kept sufficient to prevent an enemy

Resolution number nine asked for an amendment to prohibit deficit spending except during national emergencies and limiting govern-

#### Demos, GOP Ready For Runoff Voting

Texas Democrats found out this week what some had suspected ever since the May 6 primary-there will be a runoff for one of the statewide Democratic nominations.

The runoff will be in the race for Railroad Commissioner, unexpired term, between John Poerner and Jerry Sadler. Sadler is the former state official who alienated voters to the extent that they turned him out of office in 1974. They apparently forgot this on May 6, however, since he led the four-man field seeking the commissioner's spot

In six of the eight Parmer County precincts, this will be the only issue on the June 3 runoff ballot for the Democrats. Voters in the Bovina and Rhea precincts have a commissioner's race to spark their turnout. Jack Patterson and Glenden Sudderth are the candi-

Hollis Horton, County Democratic chairman, said that he had secured permission to consolidate some voting boxes for the Democratic runoff. Black, Lakeview and Friona precincts will all vote in Friona. The Oklahoma Lane precinct will vote at Farwell. Rhea and Bovina will remain as planned, because of the commissioner's race.

'This was done in order to save on election expenses, and due to the fact that in the majority of the precincts, where only the state race will be considered, the vote is expected to be light," Horton said.
