Lisa Edelman, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Von Edelman, is one of three young people from the state of Texas who has been selected to participate in the Lions Club International Exchange Student Program.

Lisa left Thursday morning to join the group of over 70 young people and their sponsors from Virginia. The

group will fly from New York to Paris, where they will spend three days sight-seeing. Then the group will break up with each of the students traveling to their chosen country.

Lisa will be spending a month in Switzerland. Two weeks will be spent with a family which owns a resort hotel in Slims. Then she will travel to Chur and spend two weeks with a teacher and his family. Both Slims and Chur are near the Rhine River and German is the predominant language spoken there.

The local Lions Clubs and the City of Friona sent letters of introduction with Lisa. She has taken some typically Texas gifts with her, which she will present to her two host families. In these she has included one of Carrie Tatum's Cook Books, a horseshoe nail sculpture by Jeff Landrum and some framed needlepoint pictures of the Texas flag done by Lisa's mother, Nancy.

She will return to the states on August 9. Lisa is attending Texas Christian University and plans to continue her education there this Fall. She graduated from Friona High School in 1976.

July 4th Events Are Well-Attended

Friona's annual July 4th events, sponsored by the Friona Chamber of Commerce and Agriculture, were well-attended on Wednesday, with local residents taking part in all of the activities.

The noon barbecue luncheon, sponsored by the Friona Noon Lions, had a turnout of over 500 people for the German sausage and barbecued chicken.

Large crowds attended the slowpitch softball tournament, which attracted 12 teams from Muleshoe, Lubbock and Plainview, in addition to Friona.

Good participation was experienced in the other July 4th events, such as the childrens' bicycle races, baseball throw and turtle race. The ping-pong and tennis tournaments were well-entered.

Only the domino tournament, of all the scheduled activities, failed to take place, due to lack of entries. This had been a popular event in recent years.

Local leaders expressed pleasure with the participation in the 1979 events. Several factors probably worked together in helping the attendance. One was the fact that the 1979 holiday was a single day rather than a long weekend. Another was the gas situation and price, which encouraged people to stay home for the holiday.

The crowd for the annual fireworks

display was diminished somewhat due to the strong wind caused by a weather front, which also whipped dust into the air around the lake site

of the display. However, the Friona Fire Department proved they were troopers, by getting the display performed, in spite of the wind.

FRIONA FLASHBACKS

50 YEARS AGO—JULY 5, 1929

Building operations on the Turner theatre building and on the Maurer store building which has been at a standstill for several days were renewed the latter part of last week. The cessation in the work was occasioned by a lack of materials which have been ordered but failed to arrive on time to keep the work going. Reports revealed from different parts of the Friona territory indicated that the average yield for this year's wheat crop is twenty bushels per acre. On Wednesday, the price locally was 92 cents.

45 YEARS AGO—JULY 6, 1934

On Monday morning of this week the two Star routes leading from Friona to Lazbuddie and Brown's Corner, respectively, changed hands. Everett Harry and J.A. Mincher, the former carriers, released their jobs to Clarence and Lewis Baxter, the two low bidders in the bidding contest held last spring. Friona High School will add a vocational agriculture class to its courses of study for the coming term. A special instructor was named for the branch.

40 YEARS AGO—JULY 7, 1939

Twenty-one cases have been listed

on the docket of the Parmer County district court, which will open its first session in the local court house on Monday morning, July 10, at nine o'clock, it was learned this week from County Clerk E.V. Rushing.

35 YEARS AGO—JULY 7, 1944

Mrs. Ocoee Warden, Elementary Supervisor of the Friona Schools, has been selected as president of the Graduate Club of the West Texas State College.

Sam L. Cunningham, who has served the Santa Fe Railroad here for the past two years as third trick man, recently bid in the second trick position with the railroad at Higgins, and moved his family to that city last week.

25 YEARS AGO—JULY 2, 1954

Tragedy struck swiftly and surely on Highway 60 in Parmer County yesterday to snuff out the lives of three members of the best known families in the county. Dead from a car-truck collision halfway between Bovina and Farwell at 4:15 p.m. Thursday afternoon are Mrs. G.D. Anderson, Jr., 32; a little son, John Hillard, age 4; and Mrs. A.G. White, 54, all of Bovina.

20 YEARS AGO—JULY 2, 1959

A wheat fire at 12:15 p.m. Sunday on the Dalton Caffey farm four miles west and three miles south of Friona destroyed approximately 5 acres of wheat and a 1958 International 1½ ton truck. Friona's Volunteer Fire Department answered the call and damage was estimated to both wheat and truck in the amount of \$5,000.

15 YEARS AGO—JULY 2, 1964

Parmer County Community Hospital's board of directors met Tuesday night and awarded a contract for construction of a 10-room addition to the hospital. The bid was awarded to Taylor Construction Company of Friona, at \$104,000.

10 YEARS AGO—JULY 3, 1969

Mary Rando, 1969 graduate of Friona High School, returned this week from South Texas, where she appeared on two county Farm Bureau Citizenship Seminar program in McAllen and San Benito.

5 YEARS AGO—JULY 7, 1974

Steve Gregory of Friona was congratulated by the Texas Highway Patrol for being awarded Citizen of the Month for his action in pulling an automobile wreck victim from his vehicle before it ignited, probably saving his life. The wreck occurred in Deaf Smith County.

Ginger Murphree, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Ray Murphree, was injured last Friday in a boating accident near Abilene. Ginger and her father were thrown from the boat, and Ginger was struck by the propeller from the motor, severely lacerating her leg. She was taken to an Abilene hospital, where surgery was performed to close the wound. Mrs. Murphree was also in the boat, but was not thrown out. Ginger was back in Friona recuperating this week.

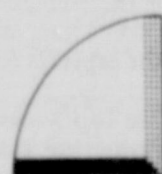

Gas Request Date Given

Farmers, food processors, food distributors and other agricultural concerns desiring protection against natural gas curtailments are reminded to file a written priority request with their supplier no later than July 15, 1979. The Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC), originally designated June 15 as the last day for this requirement but extended it by one month.

"Users of interstate natural gas have been certified by the Secretary of Agriculture to be protected up to the full requirement against curtailment."

The request should include:
 --Name and address.
 --Intended end user and volumes of natural gas needed.
 --Natural gas purchases for most recent 12 months for which records are available.
 --Documentation to support calculation of needs.
 --Standard industrial classification (SIC) code numbers such as 01 for crops and 02 for livestock, and
 --Signature swearing or affirming to accuracy of the request.
 --Suggested that local natural gas suppliers be contacted concerning procedures for obtaining agricultural priority.

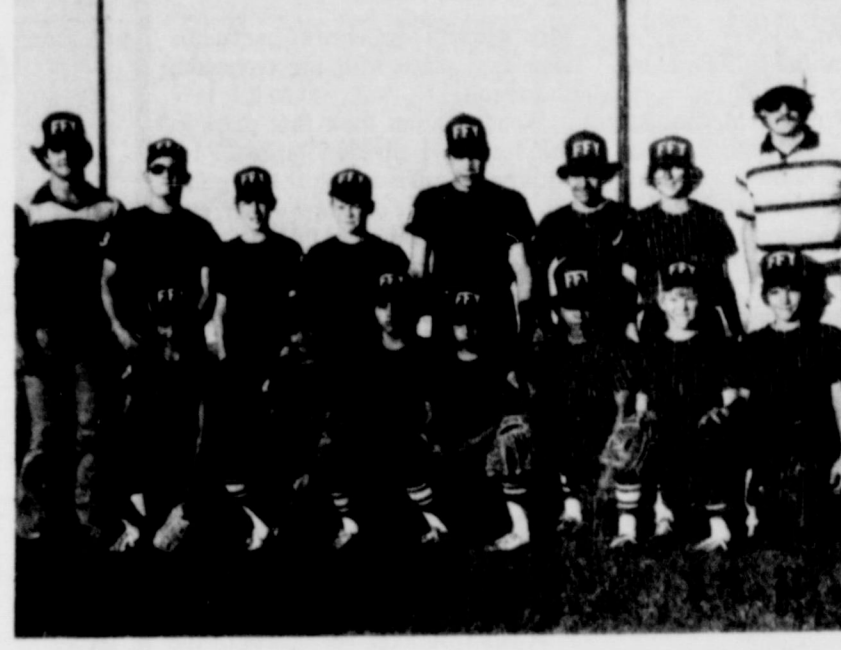
