The combined state and local sales tax in California is seven cents on

California also has a corporate income tax with rates high enough to
drive many businesses out of the state. "Those businesses might just
come here," Bullock said. The state official pointed out that
Texas is the only major state in the Texas is the only major state in the
nation with neither a personal tax.
Bullock compared the two states asoline tax, which is five cents per
gallon in Texas, the lowest in the gallon in Texas, the lowest in the
nation, compared to seven cents in California.
