## Church Joins Services At Santa Anna

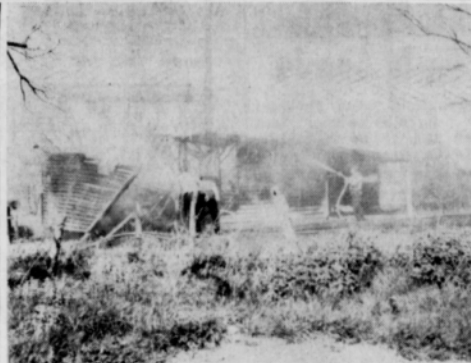

## DO YOU WANT CABLE T.V.

If you are interested in getting cable T.V. installed in this area there will have to be 500 subscribers in the Baird-Clyde area to warrant installation of the cable service.

You will receive seven channels besides the two stations you now receive which are 9 and 12. Total of nine channels to enjoy in your home. There are four Dallas-Fort Worth channels, 24 hour weather channel, 24 hour news channel and an educational channel, which is Dallas, Channel 13.

If you are interested in becoming a cable subscriber and have the cable service installed as soon as the services are available you are asked to mail or leave \$6.00 at either the First National Bank of Baird or the People's State Bank in Clyde and it will be held in trust until your cable T.V. is connected.

If you wait until the cable service is ready to be installed, it will cost \$7.50. If for any reason the T.V. cable service cannot be obtained in this area, you will be refunded the \$6.00.

After the cable service has been connected you will pay \$6.00 each month thereafter for the service received.

Two public education programs have already been executed in Baird. They both were two weeks ago. The first, at Baird High School, was aimed at letting the youth decide about smoking after seeing the facts for themselves. The second program was a challenge to Baird's community leaders and presented to the Baird Lions Club. Cancer control was explained to those men present and they were asked, as individuals, for their support in such a program in their community.

On May 13th, Baird's citizens will have an opportunity to support this program. Mr. Dick Vestal and the Baird FFA Chapter will spearhead this year's Education Campaign. More details will appear in later issues.

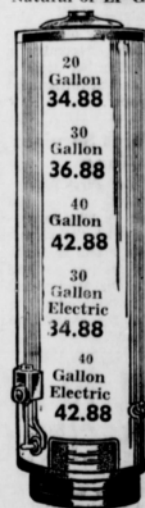

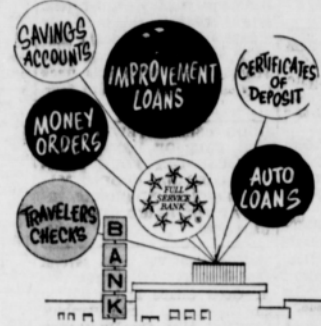

April 10 Mr. Claude Rock will take a group of FFA boys to Stephenville for a judging event.

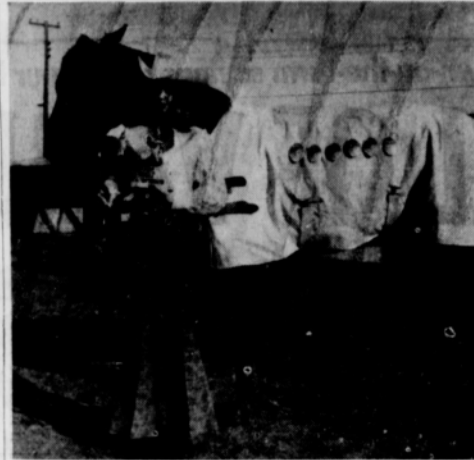
April 12 will be the only day the school will take for Easter Vacation.

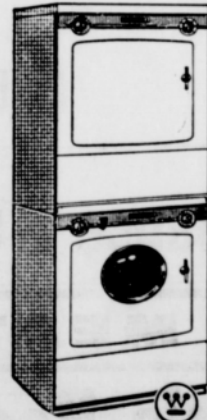

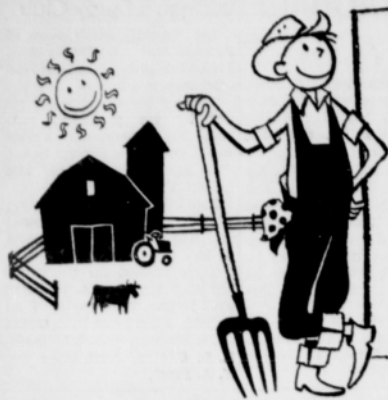
