## Friona Voters Stay In Winners' Column



Bush had grabbed the lead on the early returns Tuesday night, and his
lead reached over 6,000 votes at one stage, before the heary Lubbock
vote and the rural northern vote and the rural northern counties
Hance's "home territory," turned Hance's "home territory," turned
the tide in his favor. The Farwell voting box was the
only county box in which Bush threatened, getting 42 per cent of the total, although Hance still ted,
ted -169. Hance carried 20.169 . Hance carried a 17.5 per
cent majority in the county totals. cent majority in the county totals,
and carried 75.4 per cent of the and carried 75.4 per cent of the
county excluding the afore-men
tioned Farwell totals. tioned Farwell totals. City and county voters went for
incumbent lieutenant governor W.P. Hobby, but Friona voters favore Him Baker over John White in the
attorney-general's race 430 attorney-general's race, 430 to 403

that Hance was the winner of the race with 54,690 votes, to 48,056 for Bush.
