"James Herriot's Yorkshire" is available at Friona Public Library.  
Don't miss this one even if you only look at the 240 color photos. For those who claim English ancestors it's like a trip back home. Herriot is a transplanted Scot just as I am a transplanted Virginian; perhaps that similarity helps me appreciate his fondness for Yorkshire. I must confess to a twinge of envy—he describes his adopted land better than I can.

In case you don't know Herriot he is the country veterinarian who has written such delightful books as "All Things Bright and Beautiful," "All Things Wise and Wonderful" and "All Creatures Great and Small." I suggest you read Yorkshire first, it will enhance your enjoyment of the others.

"How To Do Everything" by Heza Whizz is also available.

The above title contains not one grain of truth, just wry humor. But our library has a number of really good "how to" books. With inflation gnawing away at incomes it might be a good idea to select a couple and become a "do-it-yourselfer" for spring and summer projects. # Letter To The Editor

Dear Editor:  
Please read the following list and see if you know what it is from.

1. Abolition of property in land and application of all rents of land to public purposes.
2. A heavy progressive or graduated income tax.
3. Abolition of all rights of inheritance.
4. Confiscation of the property of all emigrants and rebels.
5. Centralization of credit in the hands of the State, by means of a national bank with state capital and an exclusive monopoly.
6. Centralization of the means of communication and transport in the hands of the State.
7. Extension of factories and instruments of production owned by the State, the bringing into cultivation of waste lands, and the improvement of the soil generally in accordance with a common plan.
8. Equal liability of all to labor. Establishment of industrial armies, especially for agriculture.
9. Combination of agriculture with manufacturing industries, gradual abolition of the distinction between town and country by a more equable distribution of population over the country.
10. Free education for all children in public schools. Abolition of childrens factory labor in its present form. Combination of education with industrial production.

If you did not recognize them, they are goals of the Communist Manifesto.

Would you like to compare this system to our own? Consider these comparisons with the above goals:

1. Carter has already signed an article destroying our right to own property. Congress has to ratify it before it becomes law. This same congress ratified giving away the Panama Canal.
2. A heavy progressive and graduated income tax.
3. Inheritance tax, a tax on our God given right to die.
4. Confiscation by certain agencies such as the IRS of property belonging to anyone that dares to stand up for his rights and to disagree with the system.
5. World Bank, Farmers Home Administration, Chase Manhattan Bank, Small Business Administration.
6. All major networks, newspapers, magazines, air lines, etc. are owned or the major stock is controlled by members of the Trilateral Commission. Also all major oil companies, which are limiting our travel by automobile.
8. Equal opportunity employment.
9. Destruction of the family farm, ownership then belonging to the government loan facilities.
10. Free lunches, government funding for schools who will comply with their teaching methods and material.

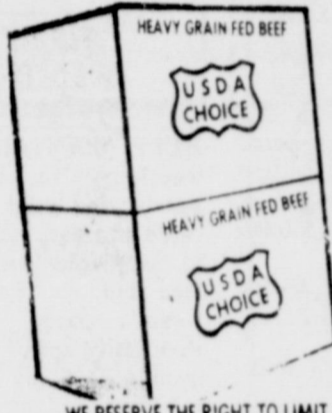

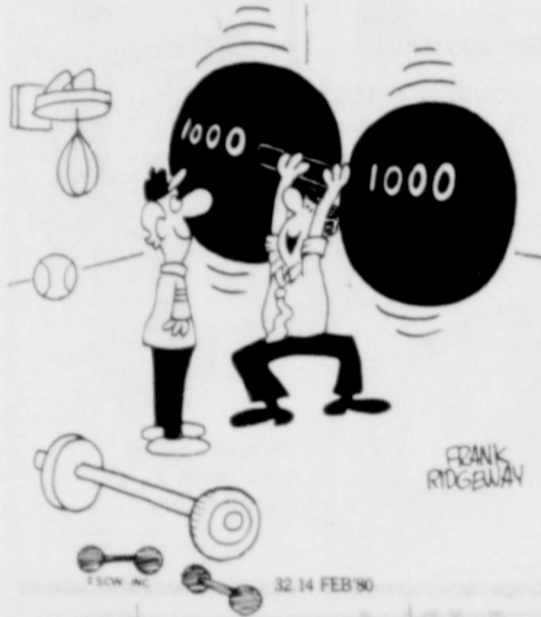
The groom is the grandson of the late Mr. and Mrs. Roy Slagle of Friona.

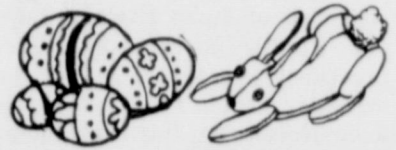

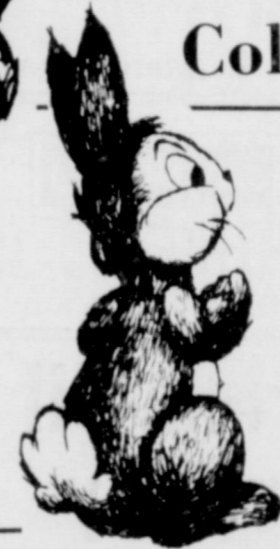

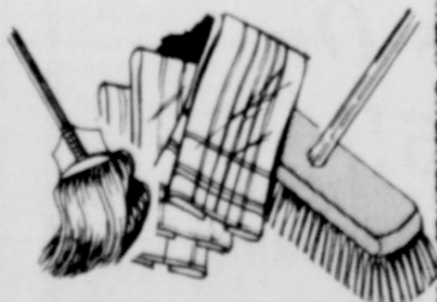

Last weekend I fixed Mexican food for all of my aunts. While I was looking for a Guacamole salad recipe I came across this great hint.
