IN THE NEWS BUSINESS, it's always "feast or famine," and Wednesday of this week was one of the "feast" days.

As you all know by now, the day's main event was the Royal Wedding, wherein England shared the rest of the world via television the marriage of Prince Charles and Lady Diana.

We thought it a nice break from the usual for the day's major news to be something other than that of wars, murder or other violence and economic woes.

The British Royalty has a little of the "fairy tale" quality, and I suppose everyone still enjoys an occasional fairy tale.

There has been some criticism levied at the British, for going to the expense (estimated at \$2 million) of the Royal Wedding, when the money might have been better spent in other places. STATESIDE ON WEDNESDAY, President Reagan had a big day of his own, with the passage of his tax cut program. The victory was another milestone for the president in his efforts to achieve some of his campaign promises to the American people.

The vote outcome was also a major victory to this area's congressman, Kent Hance, who was co-sponsor of the bill being voted on, as it was styled the Conable-Hance bill.

It was by far the most vital piece of legislation Hance has introduced in his short tenure in Congress. He may be a relative novice as far as national politics are concerned, but his colleagues are learning that this West Texan has a lot of political savvy.

Hance more or less went out on a limb as far as some of his Democratic colleagues were concerned, when he took on the sponsorship of the tax bill. But its passage Wednesday, when 48 Democratic congressmen broke with their party and supported President Reagan's bill, may have helped him out in that regard.

After the vote results were known, President Reagan called Hance and congratulated him and gave him his thanks, and commended the Dimmitt native for his courage in undertaking the legislation.

We've said it before, and think it bears repeating, that when it comes time to vote, we believe a legislator has a lot of things to consider, besides his party affiliation. We commend Congressman Kent Hance for his statesmanship.

Those watching President Reagan's speech Monday night may recall a story Reagan told about a "Conservative Southern Democrat" during a town hall meeting, being quizzed by a farmer constituent. The farmer had pinned down the representative, on the tax matter, asking (in reference to the president) "What I want to know is: are you for 'im or agin' him?"

A Lubbock television newscast later in the week confirmed that the "Conservative Southern Democrat" the president referred to in his speech was our own Kent Hance. We had wondered at the time if it might not be, and sure enough it was.

State Candidate Makes Visit

The only announced candidate for Texas Land Commissioner, Garry Mauro, campaigned in Friona Thursday. Mauro, a Democrat, stopped by Friona businesses and paid visits to local officials.

He also was a special assistant to former Congressman and Ambassador Bob Krueger. "Texas Business" magazine recently named Mauro as one of the "25 Rising Stars of Texas." A graduate of Texas A&M, with his law degree from the University of Texas, Mauro now practices law in Austin.

Footballers Set Workouts: Need Exams

Football practice is just around the corner, and Friona Chieftain Coach Tommy Moss announced this week that prospective football players should report on Wednesday, August 5 between the hours of 9 a.m. and 9 p.m. so that shoes, shorts and T-shirts may be checked out.

Moss also reminded footballers that they must have their physical examinations before Monday, August 10, which is the first day of two-a-day workouts. Players are to be dressed at 9 a.m. August 10. Workout times will be announced at that time.

The players will begin working out in pads on August 14, and the team's first physical is slated for August 20.

Fund Drive To Continue For Library

The Library building fund campaign has not at this time met its original goal of securing \$70,000 to purchase the Friona Consumers building on Main Street.

The Library Board met on Thursday morning and made plans to continue the fund-raising campaign for a six-month period.

During this time the building situation in Friona will be evaluated and a new decision will be made concerning a new building for the Library.

The campaign chairman, D.L. Harguess, announced that approximately \$20,000 has been raised. The Friends of the Library officers will put the money in a six-month certificate of deposit next week.

"We would like to thank everyone who solicited funds and contributed to the building fund. Those of you still wishing to contribute may do so at Friona State Bank in the Friends of the Library Fund account," said Harguess.

Mauro discussed the importance of the Land Commissioner's office, and said that last year the General Land Office generated more than \$600 million for the State treasury, through the administration of the State's 22.5 million acres of public land. "The more money Texas collects from its public lands", Mauro declared, "the lower our taxes will be." He stressed that the job needs a good administrator. "The Land Office requires professional management skills, and ought to be run like a business," Mauro stated, "I will bring efficiency and the latest business techniques to the Land Commissioner's office."

Mauro also spoke in support of the Veterans Land Program, which is run by the Land Commissioner's office. "The Veterans Land Program allows Texas veterans to borrow money at low interest rates in order to purchase land," Mauro stated, "The only problem is that the Texas House didn't get around to passing the necessary legislation last session to keep the program alive."

"The voters have always supported the constitutional amendments providing bonding authority for the Veteran's Land Program, so it

Maps will be available at the Community Center prior to the meeting, if anyone wants to inspect them ahead of time.

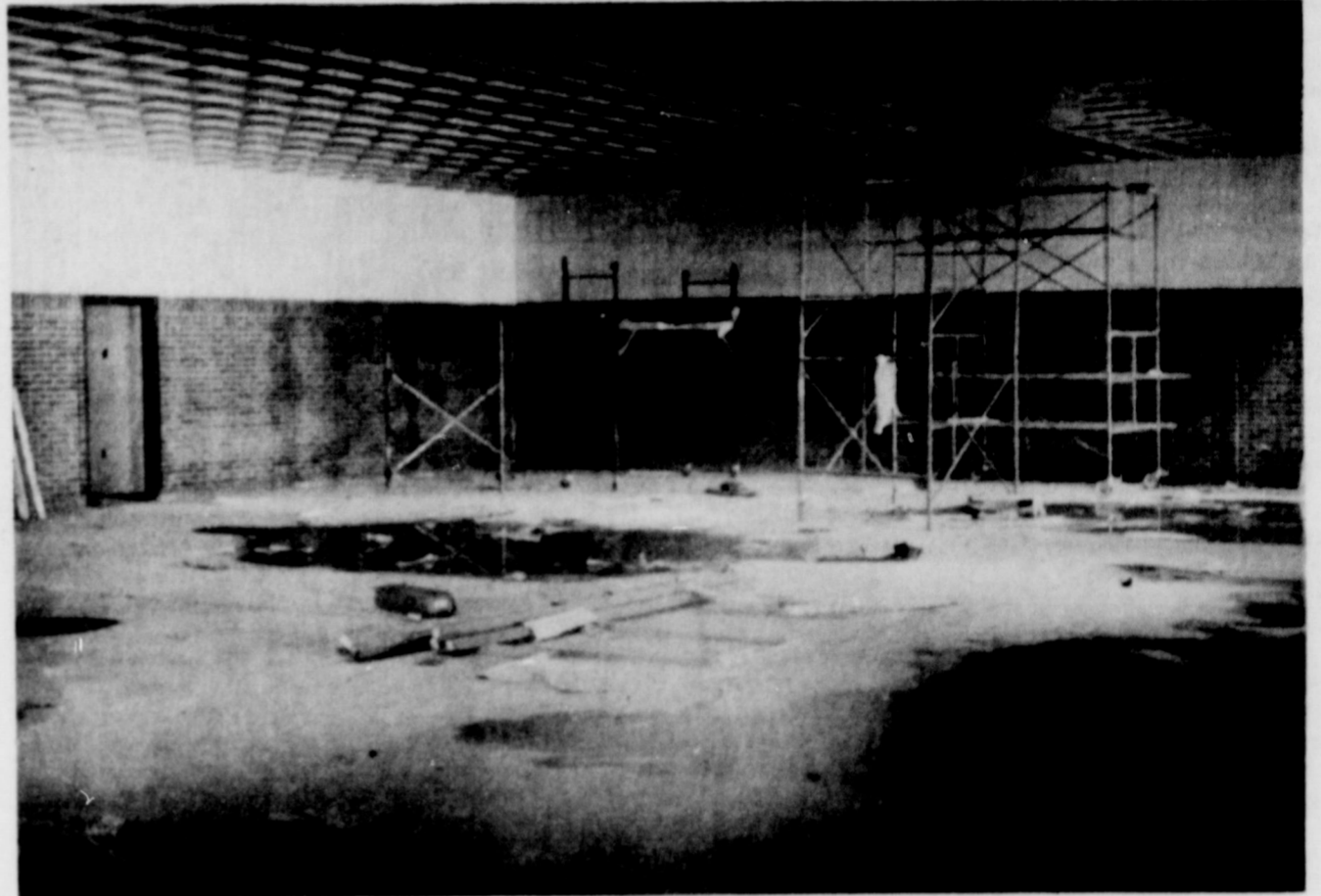
Drama Event Is Slated

School Officials Eye New Building Progress

Friona Superintendent of Schools Tom Jarboe could be excused if he is a little edgy as the calendar turns a page into August, the month which has become associated with the beginning of the school term.

This summer, Jarboe not only has had his usual chore of lining up replacement teachers, so as to have a full slate of instructors on the opening day of school; he also has kept a watchful eye out toward the school's expansion program at junior high, with more than a little apprehension.

"The contractor is optimistic that the new cafeteria, and the junior high building itself will be completed by the opening day of school (August 24). However, at this point, we are sure the new classrooms (from the old cafeteria) and the gymnasium will not be completed," Jarboe said.

The superintendent said that the school could operate with this schedule, if it is met. "We could operate without the classrooms, and the gym, for a time—but obviously we need the cafeteria and the junior high building," Jarboe says.

In the meantime, Jarboe said that all of the school's instructional positions are filled with the exception of one, involving a coaching position and a junior high teaching assignment.

Jarboe said that James Whitis, who had been hired at the beginning of the summer to replace Nancy Ray as assistant band director, has been named head band director, and that James Ochoa has been hired as assistant director.

"We found ourselves competing with some seven other schools in the band director hunt, and with a limited deadline to boot," Jarboe said.

The school begins its year with teachers reporting for in-service training on August 20. The first day of instruction is Monday, August 24.

In other school news, Jarboe said that the Friona school board, in its

finalizing the school's budget for 1982, and that it would be sometime in August before the school board could name its tax rate. The school already is committed to a ten cents per \$100 evaluation tax increase, due to the school's bond issue.

A group representing "Friends of the Library" from Friona, Mrs. Billie Fairchild, Kitty Gallman, Nancy Edelman, Ann Osborn, Tiffany Osborn and D.L. Harguess, met with the commissioners to explain their fund drive to purchase a larger building to house the library.

After their appeal for funds, the court asked Judge Porter Roberts to look into the legal aspects of a gift of tax money for such a purpose.

County Agent Seth Ralston reported that 25 record books had been turned in by 4-H Club members for judging. County winners will be

forwarded to the district 4-H judging in Lubbock.

Ralston said that the county swine judging team will go to Avoca for a Hampshire and Yorkshire field day.

It was reported that Laura Jacobs, County Extension Agent for Home Economics, attended a week-long electric camp in the Sacramento Mountains of New Mexico, sponsored by Southwestern Public Service Company. Three County 4-H girls accompanied her on the trip, Maureen Jesko, Devera Rhodes and Sarita Gay Ellis.

Miss Jacobs was to leave this week for a 4-H camp at Brownwood.

A motion was approved to approve six requests for soil conservation work to be done by county equipment, as soon as the machines are not in demand for road use, and are in the area of the work to be performed.

Those applying for the work were R.J. Renner, Jr., Dickie Clayton, Greg Bell, Gil DeLeon, Harry Sheets and Jim Mace.

Burial was in Friona Cemetery under the direction of Gilliland-Watson Funeral Home.

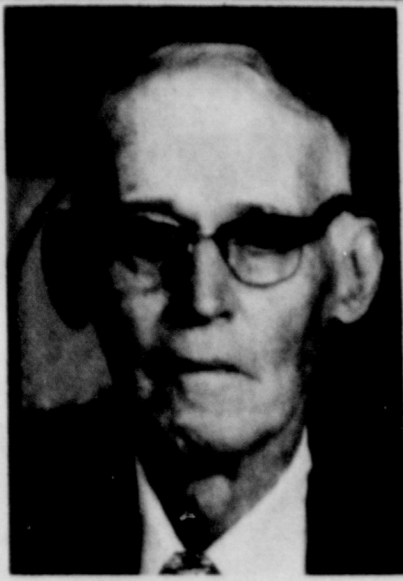
Mr. Lindley died Friday, July 24 in Parmer County Community Hospital following a long illness.

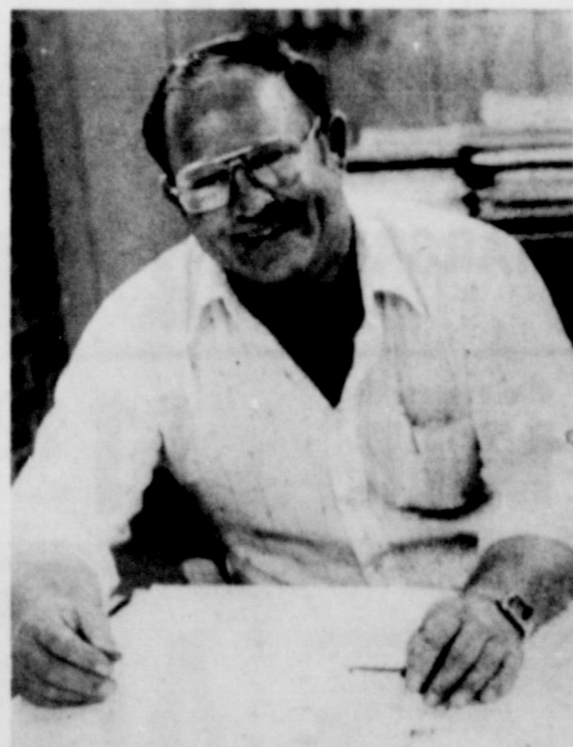

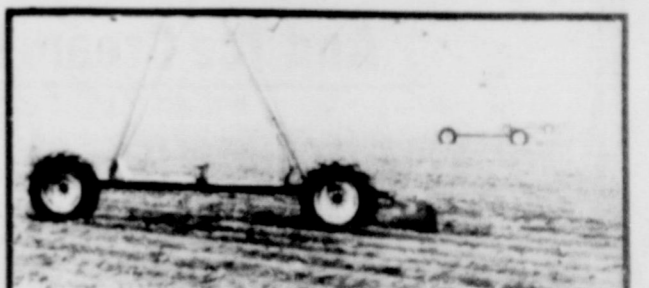

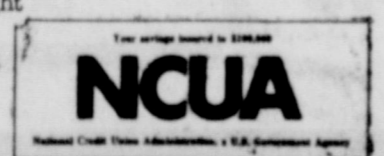
