### THE VERSIONS OF THE BIBLE

The first publication of the complete Bible in the English language appeared in 1535, the work of Miles Coverdale. This was not strictly speaking, an original version but a compilation from five previous versions. All of these that could be found were burned in 1536.

In 1560 several scholars who fled the persecutions of Queen Mary, wrote the Geneva Bible. It was translated from the original Hebrew and original Greek, the first to have italics and the first which was divided into verses. It was convenient in size and seasonable in price.

The Bishop's Bible, published in 1568, was never very popular with the people. Its promoter was Archbishop Parker, who with eight bishops and seven professors made the translation, hence the title "Bishop's Bible."

In the authorized version was translated in 1611 and is commonly called the "King James," because it was authorized by King James I. It was the result of five years work by forty-seven scholars. To meet the demands of the more modern speech the English Revision was brought out from 1881-1885 and the American Revision from 1885-1901. The changes wrought in these have been more in manner of expression rather than a change of thought, and the King James Version holds a never-ceasing popularity with English speaking Christians.

In the short sketch of our Bible's history, which I have endeavored to present over a period of several weeks in these brief articles, it may be seen that from the time scribes wrote upon skins of animals, men have suffered and died that we might have in convenient form the Word of our Lord. Think of the price that has been given that we might obtain and study this book in all freedom! Hated and hounded as no other book has ever been, and yet indestructible; derided, and yet highly esteemed; declared dead by some, and yet always alive. To use the words of the Master, "Heaven and earth shall pass away, but my words shall not pass away." (Matt. 24:35).

## FAIR NEWS

Over one-fourth of the Parmer County allocation of \$80,000 for the payment of approved soil building practices has been obligated to producers. Most of this money has been carefully issued so as to induce the farmer to chisel unprotected land, level for irrigation, re-seed permanent pastures and terrace land that has gone washing away. A good sized chunk of the county funds has gone for 8 cars of 20 percent superphosphate for application on permanent pasture and alfalfa. Farmers wishing to comply under the 1948 ACP program are urged to contact this office as soon as possible.

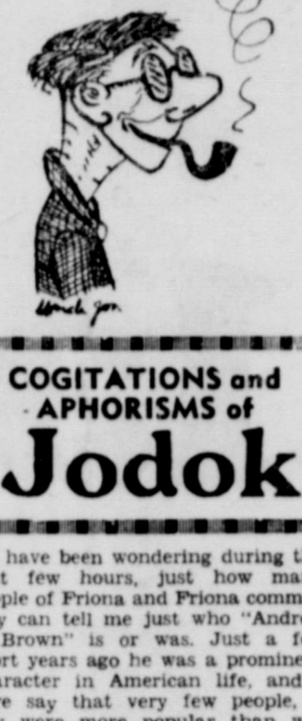

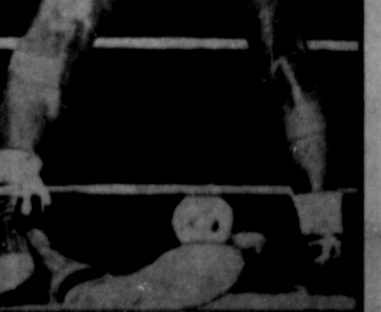

### FARM NEWS

Over one-fourth of the Parmer County allocation of \$80,000 for the payment of approved soil building practices has been obligated to producers. Most of this money has been carefully issued so as to induce the farmer to check unproductive land, level for irrigation, re-seed permanent pastures and terrace land that has gone washing away. A good sized chunk of the county funds has gone for 8 cars of 20 percent superphosphate for application on permanent pasture and alfalfa. Farmers wishing to comply under the 1948 ACP program are urged to contact this office as soon as possible.

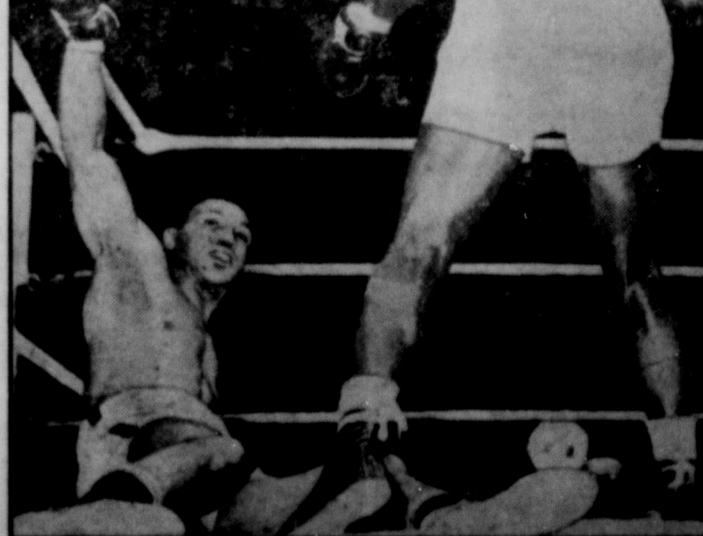

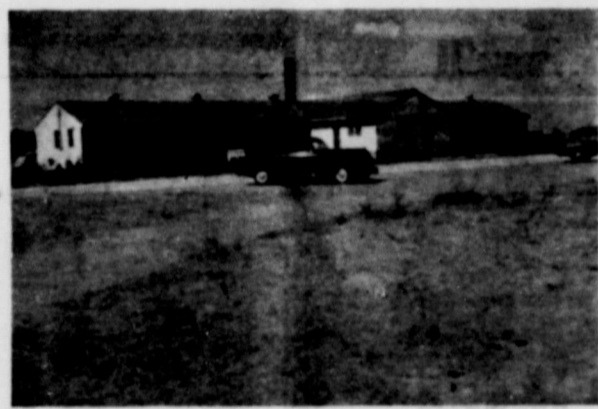
