Friona native Ted Sanders, former U.S. Education deputy secretary, would have been a better choice for the Texas job, but Governor Richards opted to go out of state for this appointment. Someone forgot
to give her the lecture about "shopping at home." Anyway, Meno says that the
Texas school system is in need of a Texas school system is in nee
fundamental re-structuring. "We need to provide some
summer school for the kids who need it," Meno said.
He pointed out that
He pointed out that students who rarely ever graduate from high school. He hinted that a summer
program to help the slow students catch up to their classmates might help them in their efforts to stay graduate.
A total of 20 per cent of the
students in Texas schools are being retained, Meno said, and this is a very high percentage.
It's time for the schools'
professional staffs to re-structur professional staffs to re-structure the schools, the commissioner said.
One of the big problems, according to the Texas Education
chief, is the fact that the state's chief, is the fact that the state's schools can't compete with other
industries in the way industries in the way of teacher
salaries. Texas currently ranks 38 th in the nation for teachers' salaries, he said. Meno said that dramatically
improved student achievement would remain his number one priority.

## Rural Fire Ratio Wrecks Budget For Friona Dept.

The City of Friona is waging a trucks running to to keep its fire trucks running to where they are needed, but is coming up short due
to the number of rural fires that the to the number of rural fires that the
Friona firemen are asked to fight. Fince January of 1993, there
Since have been 27 total fire calls, and of
this number, 23 werc rural fires.this number, 23 were rural fires--
almost 90 per cent. Since 1990, the almost
number of rural calls for fires has amounted to 84 per cent of the
total total.
The problem lies in the fact that rural residents pay county taxes, but
no city taxes. Thus, they are not paying directly for fire protection.
Founty commissioners have thaid
the City of Friona a flat $\$ 4$ he City of Friona a allat $\$ 4,000$ comes out woefully short comes out woefully short
according to City Manager Paula Wilson.
The $\$ 4$
The $\$ 4,000$ amount is paid to
each fire department in each fire deparm ant in the count
including those at Bovina Farwell, Lazbuddie and Rhea.
Mrs. Wilson issued figures that
showed the expenses for the Friona
Fire Department at $\$ 50,689$ since October 1, 1992. At this rate, the
department will probably top department will probably to
$\$ 70,000$ in expenses in a year' time, she estimated.
Of this amount, City of Friona budgets approximately $\$ 30,000$ per
year for fire department year for fire department expenses so that leaves a big discrepancy.
The City Manager added that la year the county did allot an additional $\$ 22,000$ to help purchase a new truck. There is still $\$ 23,620$
owing on this emergency vehicle. owing on this emergency vehicle.
