



RIVER AND HARBOR ALLOTMENTS MADE

War Department Allows \$750,000 for Waterway At Houston Port.

Washington-Final allotment of \$35,-604,250 of the funds appropriated by congress for river and harbor improvement work during the fiscal year 1923, made by the chief of army engineers, was announced Friday by the war department. Congress appropriated \$42, 215,000, of which approximately \$7, 000,000 has been reserved for future emergency expenditure.

Almost the entire day was devoted to addresses and talks by various engineers and representatives of similar associations.


