

MADE BIG CUTS IN BUDGET REQUESTS

Total Appropriations Recommended to the Legislature \$31,000,000.

Austin Tex -The state board of control has cut \$8,238,784 out of the W.L.DOUGLAS-ho requisitions for appropriations for the next biennium as submitted by the heads of the state departments and institutions and is yet to revise \$6.600. stitutions and is yet to revise \$6,600, 000 of requests for buildings at the various educational institutions which amount is sure to be reduced.

Excepting the amounts asked for buildings at the educational institu-tions, the requisitions for the two years amounted to \$35,678,689, which the board has cut to \$27,439,905. Against this the board of control estimates that with the usual income and maximum tax rate the gross revenues for the two years will be \$36,000,000. While this makes an apparent margin of \$5,000, 000, the board realizes that emergency appropriations, the expense of the leg islature and other expected and unexpected demands will bring the total needed to the maximum available amount in sight.

Less the amounts for buildings at the educational institutions, all of the other requisitions aggregated \$23,132,-194 for the first year and \$19,164,250 for the second year, which the board has reduced to \$14,072,272 and \$13,-367,633, respectively, for the two years. The educational institutions are asking for new buildings or permanent im provements totaling \$4,124,604 for the road commission. Cancellation of old first year and \$2,493,152 for the second year. Governor Makes Plea for Constitutional Convention

Brenham, Tex.-A plea to unshackle Texas by providing a new constitution which would life inhibitions now hampering its progress was made Tuesday by Governor Pat M. Neff, who delivered the first of a series of addresses dealing with state problems. The governor on the occasion of this speech selected Brenham, he said, that he might be near Old Washington on the Brazos, where in 1836 the first con-

Four outstanding subjects were men tioned by the governor as he listed the reasons for a constitutional convention roads, he said; the entire judiciary, civil and criminal, should be revised and improved; the state's educational system is badly in need of constitutional changes which would tend to perfect it, and the preservation of flood waters for irrigation of arid lands and the protection of overflowed bot toms was a matter designated as being incapable of solution without changes in the constitution.

PLAN TO SPEND \$12,500,000 ON SICK MASONS

Establishment of a chain of Sanatoria throughout the United States for members of the Masonic order suffering from tuberculosis, the whole enterprise to involve an estimated expenditure of \$12,500,000 for construction and the care of 5,000 sufferers with an annual expenditure of \$5,000,000 for operation will be recommended to the Masonic Grand Lodge of Texas at its annual meeting at Waco on Decem-5, 6 and 7 by the Tuberculosis Sanatoria Commission of the Grand Lodges of Texas, Arizona and New Mexico.

This is a commission appointed by the Grand Masters of the three states named, under authority of resolutions adopted by the grand lodges to prepare a plan for the establishment of tuberculosis sanatoria, for the care of consumptive Masons who come to the southwest seeking restoration to health. These resolutions were adopted at the last meetings of the respective grand

The plan is to take care of tubercular Masons all over the United States. The first hospital will be built in the southwest because of the large number of Masons already awaiting treatment there.

"It will take from five to ten rears to carry out this program of building. The cost will be ad. vanced by assessments on the membership of Masonic bodies in the United States, and they will be invited to participate in the movement by voting a small assessment for this purposp.'
