as I've eaten solids, I was acutely interested in the Habanero chile pepper.
Depending on the source, 100 times as hot as a jalapeno. sources seem to agree, however, that the Habanero is the hottes chili pepper in the world.
I knew I had to have some--just
to say Id tried the dreaded Habanero to say Id tried the dreaded Habanero.
I finally found some in an Abilene supermarket this summer and bought a small bagful.
Habaneros don't necessarily look like the hottest peppers in the world. Their small size and bright
orange color disguise their fiery
bite. I shared my prize with a few
chile-loving friends and saved the
rest for my own pleasure. rest for my own pleasure. My
husband, Tony, decided to see if the chiles really are the hottest in the At first, he said, "It's hot, al right," but he didn't appear to be on fire. A few minutes later, he was dripping in sweat. A friend of ours Tony said biting into the chile felt like someone was squirting ho sauce down his throat.
I prefer to taste the chiles in a dish so as to enjoy the flavor as
well as the heat. After reading Habaneros have a tropical frui-l-ike flavor, I created the Habanero Sals ecipe below to be served with grilled or baked chicken. I used bowl of salsa o eat.
