THE ECLIPSE JANUARY 21

If clear weather prevails on January 21, the people of the Eastern portion of the United States will witness the finest heavenly phenomenon of a generation—a total eclipse of the sun.

While the path of totality will be confined to a strip of territory running roughly from New Haven to Duluth, the eclipse will be partial over most of the Eastern half of the country.

At the western limit of visibility the sun will rise in eclipse, while farther east the total eclipse will occur shortly after sunrise.

Nothing is more certain than the movements of the heavenly bodies. As surely as the sun rises on January 21, so surely the moon appear directly between the earth and sun, causing the temporary eclipses of our solar system's great luminary. There is no guess work in the calculations of our astro-omers.

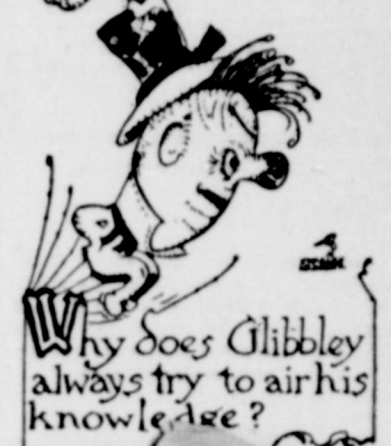
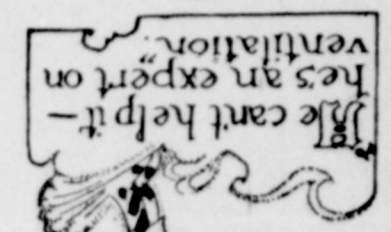
