**SANDERSON HI GAINS ADDITIONAL CREDITS**

The following important news items regarding the standing of our school and results of the visit of the supervisor, who recently visited the Sanderson High School, was received by Prof. T. L. Williams this week: Miss Lillian Peek, assistant Director Home Economics Education, notified Mr. Williams that "One unit credit was granted for your Foods I and II work on April 27."

Miss Mary Jo Popplewell, chief supervisor of high schools, sent the following as the official report of the supervisor who visited the local school: "In order that the schools may be properly certified it is essential that minimum requirements be met. To that end the supervisor who recently visited your school makes the following recommendations:

1. That the recitation periods be lengthened to 45 minutes. Under the regulations for a classified school, the minimum time given to a recitation, including time spent in passing is 45 minutes.
2. That English history be dropped and civics and economics be substituted. Modern history gives practically the same work as English history though of course with less detail.
3. That the following items denoting progress deserves commendation: (1) \$323.86 for desks; (2) \$91.05 for maps; (3) \$678.60 for septic tanks; (4) \$50.10 for library; (5) \$53.83 for laboratory.
4. The school deserves additional commendation for the excellent organization, good class room instruction and splendid discipline observed."

**CHEVON—AGAIN!**

Our ranch people have been accustomed to saying "mutton goats" and they stay with it; and as long as they do, the Eastern people that have been raised to turn up their noses and laugh at the name "goat" will stay with it too.

Your "nice named mutton goat" will never get through packing houses with any part of a sheep's name tied to his legs. He will either come out tagged, "Goats," "Kid Goats," or "Chevon." Then why should a man talk and do things that injures and keeps his own and his neighbors' products on the bum list? If you men don't blow this Chevon horn after it has been officially recognized by the United States Department of Agriculture as a "suitable name for the meat," comparable to beef, pork and "mutton," it will damage the Angora industry millions of dollars in the future. Why the chevon kid today is in demand and is out selling our lambs for shearing purposes alone. They are being contracted at \$3.50 to \$4.00 per head, and they only weigh 30 to 40 pounds in September on delivery, that's 10 cents per pound. Now, if we can add the edible value to that chevon kid, he will weigh 60 to 65 pounds, as a yearling, (a handy weight), will dress 30 to 35 lbs. The packers and trade are kicking now about the 90 to 100 pound lambs. They want lighter weights. The chevon yearling fills the bill, he quarters up from 6 to 7 1/2 pounds per quarter, nice juicy lean meat, no tallow fat on it and is just right for the average American family. And with little united boosting and advertising we can make these chevons sell on the market at 10 cents per pound, equal to \$6.00 to \$6.50 per head. Get two clips of "kid mohair" off them before we let 'em go, then raise some more—"The best meat on earth."
