**ORCHESTRAL ORGAN  
INSTALLED IN THE  
PRINCESS THEATRE**

**Instrument is Latest Word in Musical Innovation**

Tuesday of this week, Mrs. O. M. Shaw owner of the Princess theatre, had an orchestral organ installed in the theatre. V. F. Phillips, owner of the Houston Seeburg Piano Company, and C. K. Goss, salesman for the company, installed the organ.

The instrument was given its first test before a Sanderson audience that night. Patrons of the show are delighted with the music which this wonderful instrument produces and it is said that the tones cannot be distinguished from those produced by human artist. One of the patrons coming out of the theatre the first night was overheard saying: "It seems like your in a large theatre in a city listening to that organ."

The instrument installed is known as the Seeburg Celestial Orchestral Organ and is arranged so that it can be played either mechanically or by an operator at the keyboard. The organ was installed by the Princess at a cost of \$2250 and is another step the management has taken to give their patrons the very best that can be obtained.

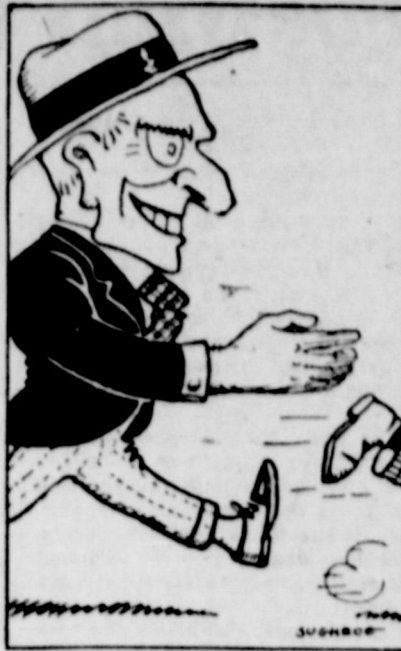

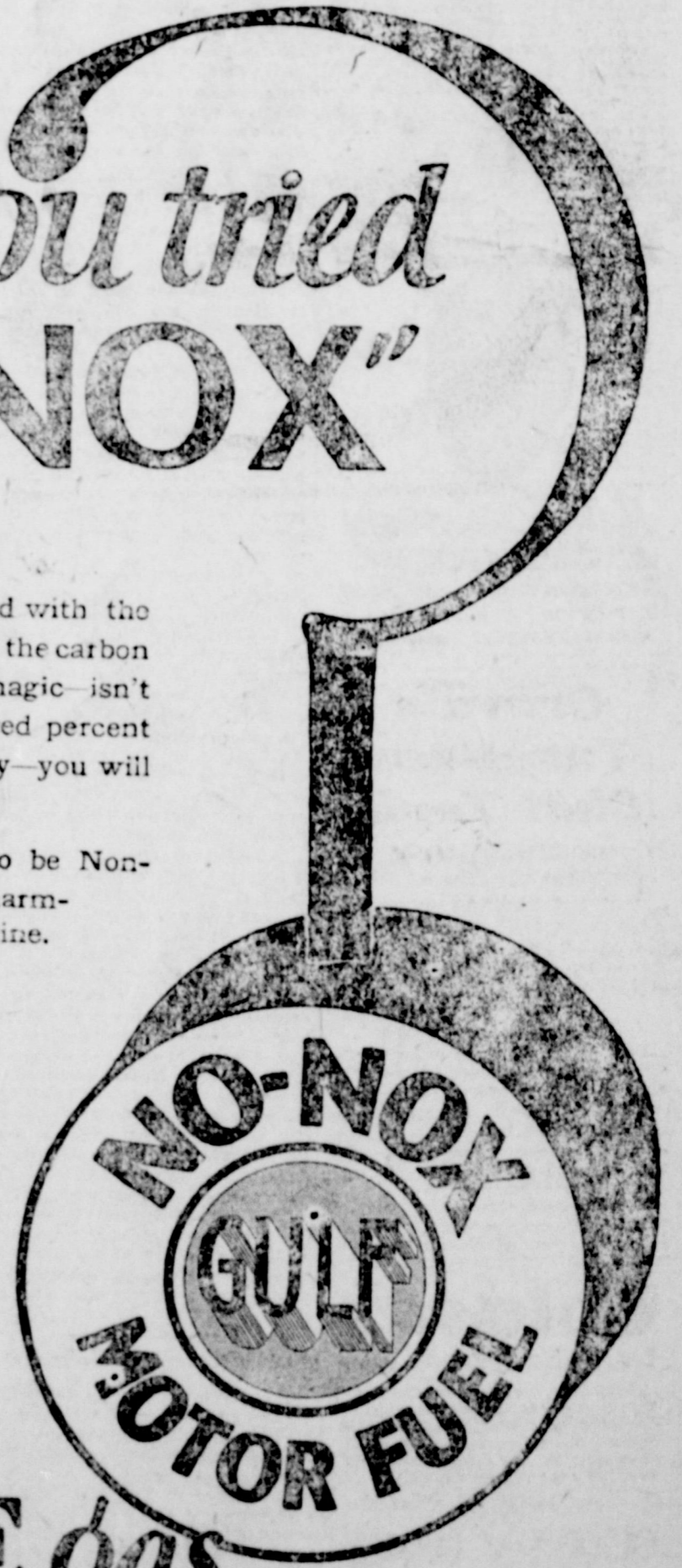
