Stays Long Periods in Isolated Tower.

Washington.—The lighthouse keeper, the prospector, the sheep herder have lonely jobs, but what is probably the loneliest of all is that of the forest-fire observer.

Bad Spelling Shows How Jews Talked Latin

Austin, Texas.—Bad spelling on tombstones in the Jewish catacombs of Rome indicates how the Jews who lived in Rome in the early Christian centuries pronounced Greek and Latin.

Scholars have wondered whether the Jews who formed a settlement in Rome clung to their Hebrew ways or whether they did as the Romans did.

Doctor Leon explains. Six Roman catacombs where the Jewish residents buried their dead are now known, and study of the inscriptions on the slabs and the gallery walls shows that the writing is three-fourths Greek and one-fourth Latin.

The Jewish population in Rome, which grew to about 40,000, was no more familiar with the Hebrew language than the average Jew of today.

Man Not So Hungry After Eating Sixty Eggs

Fayetteville, W. Va.—A West Virginian has entered for national honors in egg eating. He is J. W. Carnifx of Hico, Fayette county.

H. L. Sandige, who conducts a general store at Hico and who furnished the eggs, says Carnifx, who is seventy-two, came into the store and after exchanging greetings said his appetite was unusually good, adding that if there was anything to eat on hand he would prove it.

Sandige said there was nothing on hand to eat except eggs, but that Carnifx could have all he wanted.

Sandige made good on the proposition, and it rained his stock of eggs. Carnifx ate 60. A little figuring showed the lot weighed eight pounds. It took him only 15 minutes to do it.

"That last egg tasted as good as the first," Carnifx told the crowd that had gathered. "I never felt better in my life, only I'm not so hungry."

United States Leadership in Politics Needed to Redeem World From Savagery

AMERICAN leadership in world politics is likely to bring about some amelioration of a state of international "savagery" in which the world finds itself.

There are reasons why American leadership in world politics is likely to bring about some amelioration of the state of international savagery. The American nations, taken as a whole, are underpopulated and underdeveloped.

Nations are not intelligent in their world relationships. They cry and laugh at the achievements of a Lindbergh. They rage and storm over a minor unintended discourtesy.

The ideal which should be the contribution of the Americans in the era on which we are embarked, the homely ideal which we commonly call neighborliness.

Porto Rico has offered an example from which we might learn. These Latin-American citizens of the United States, molded by 400 years of Spanish tradition which is the common inheritance of Latin-America, and familiar with the institutions and policies of the United States, have done much to bring together the two great cultures of North and South America and in mutual understanding and comprehension.

Rapid Increase in Knowledge Stimulant to Adventurous Thinking in Youth

The rapid increase in the scope of our knowledge today tends to provoke in youth a spirit of adventurous exploration of every phase of life.

When colleges are doing their utmost to arouse students to independent thought on all the subjects of their studies it is impossible to confine their thinking to any watertight compartments.

The essential objective of a college education is the development in the individual student of his potential capacity, evidenced by a growing intellectual vigor and integrity of character. It has a value to the individual himself in creating inner sources of satisfaction in his own life and a value also to the community in which he lives.

The pursuit of an intellectual interest is always a moral safeguard without which the temptations of our college life cannot be withstood. We are not fully aware of the fact that in the things of the mind we are moving forward with a rapidity which surpasses even the material progress of this rapid age.

The fact that our students live in this age of exciting and stimulating discoveries in every field of study brings to them a challenge which they are meeting with a renewed interest and in many quarters with enthusiasm.

Plan of Companionate Marriage Is to Increase the Stability of Wedlock

In cases where there were children to be considered approximately the same procedure would be followed as is now the case, the duty of the commission being to safeguard the interests of the children.

My purpose is to make divorce more difficult rather than easier. By common-sense methods I want to increase the stability of the family, which appears to be breaking up in the present legal structure.

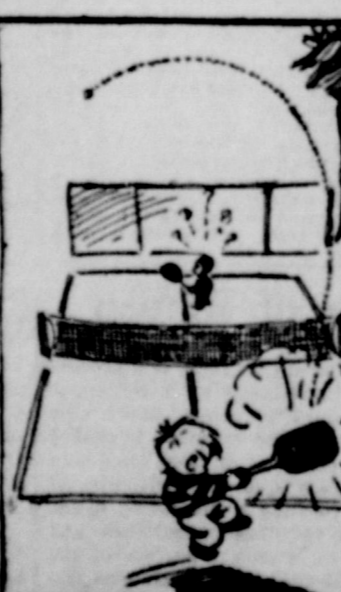

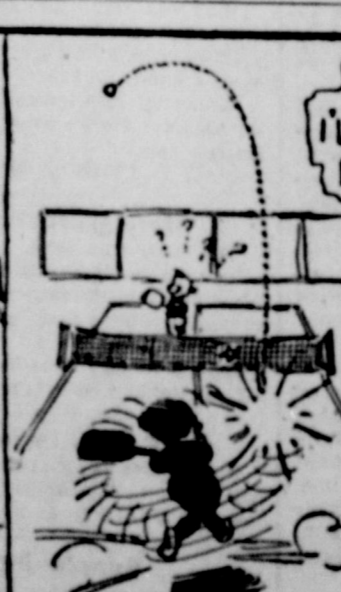

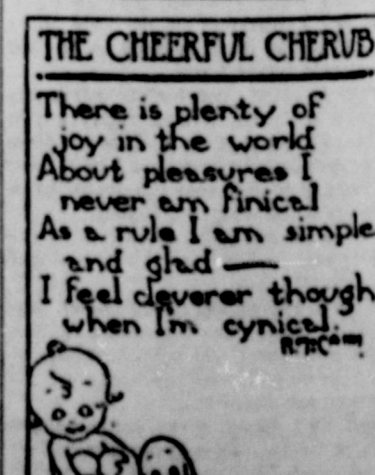
