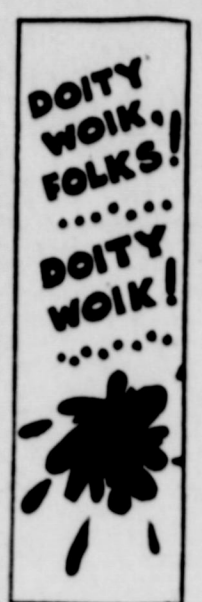

That subsequent thereto she went to live in adultery with some man who is unknown to Plaintiff but well known to Defendant. Plaintiff prays judgment for a divorce on the ground of cruel treatment and the statutory ground of adultery, for costs and general and special relief.

**HUDSPETH DISCUSSES PENSION BILL**

Congressman Hudspeth had a personal interview with Secretary of the Interior West this morning relative to securing pensionable status for Texas Rangers who fought to protect the frontier during the time that Texas was out of the Union from 1861 to 1865.

Congressman Hudspeth introduced a bill which went before the Pension Committee to permit a status of this character, at the last session, and appeared before the committee in advocacy of this bill, and had a number of other congressmen from Texas also appear. But it seems that the committee passed the matter up to the Pension Commissioner.

The Pension Commissioner wrote the Congressman recently stating that the matter had been placed before the Secretary of the Interior for a decision and indicated that it was a matter that could be decided by him favorable to these old Texas Rangers.

After going into the matter fully with the Secretary of the Interior this morning Congressman Hudspeth is very hopeful that the Secretary will decide that, notwithstanding the State was out of the Union and that heretofore these splendid men have not been permitted a pension, they can be placed on the rolls and given a pension.

Secretary West stated to Congressman Hudspeth he was very much in sympathy with the matter and would discuss it fully with Pension Commissioner Scott and hoped to be able to arrive at a favorable decision relative to the contention by the Congressman, in his half hour's interview with the Secretary this morning.

The Secretary of the Interior agreed with the contention made by Congressman Hudspeth that several hundred of these old men, who are in straightened circumstances, many of them living in the Congressman's district, and others scattered over Western Texas in other districts, in the event the matter were decided favorably, would be placed on the pension rolls and given an adequate pension.

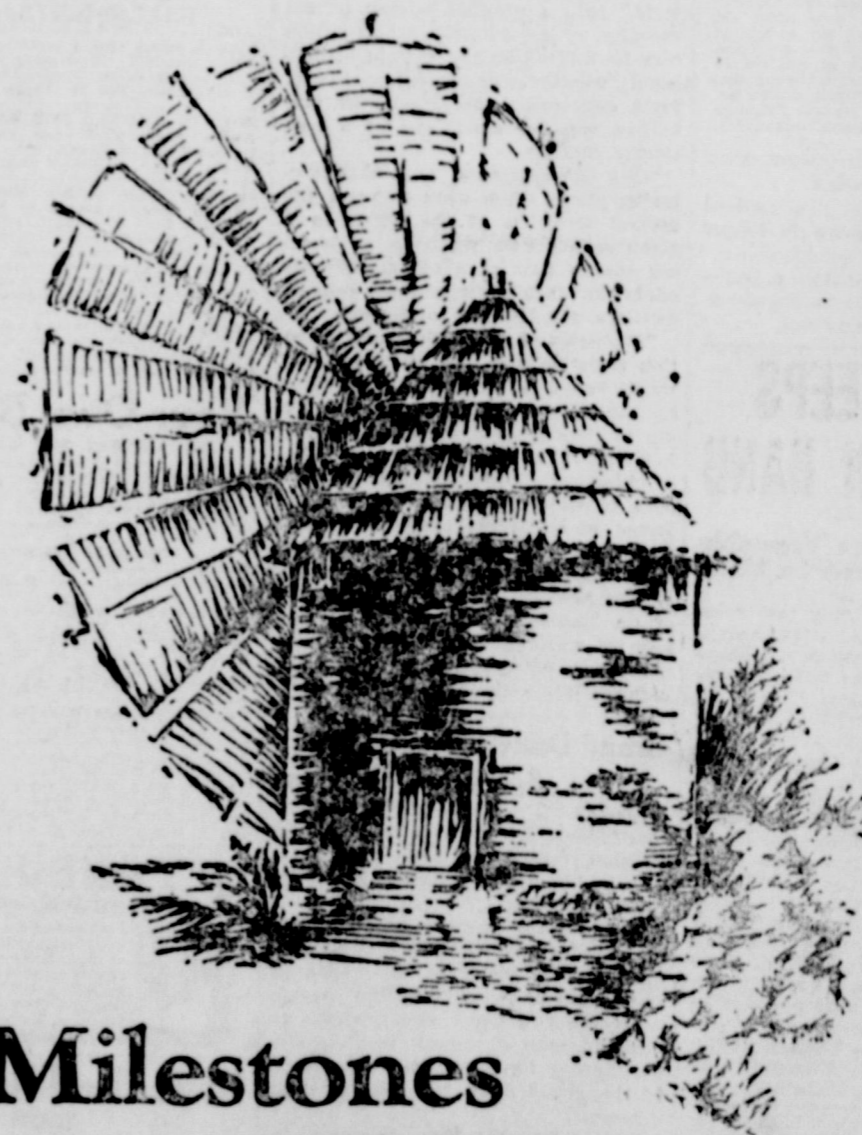
