Washington, July 12. - The administration decided today to pay railroad pensions out of the treasury, although a recent ruling of the court left it without any immediate means of collecting taxes for the retirement fund. The decision of the railroad retirement board was predroad retirement board was predicated on these three fac-

Judge Jennings Bailey of the U. S. District court here did not rule unconstitutional a measure providing for payment of the pensions, although he held invalid a companion act levying taxes to create the pension fund. \$46,685,000 Appropriated

Congress, enacting a law to replace a previously invalidated railroad retirement act, appropriated \$46,685,000 for payment of the pensions for one year. This was on the assumption the appropriation would be returned to the treasury from a 31/2% tax on railroad payrolls and a similar levy on workers' salaries.

The Railroad Retirement Board announced "an appeal probably will be taken" from the decision. A final Supreme Court ruling on this appeal could be reached bebefore the present congressional appropriation was expended by the end of the fiscal year.


