Program Items Taken From Our Exchanges

**OZONA**—A movement begun 3 years ago by Crockett and Val Verde county authorities was crowned with success last week, according to the Stockman, when the State highway commission at Austin designated the route from Ozona south to Comstock as a state highway.

**CARRIZO SPRINGS**—According to the Javelin, plans were being perfected here to try out the Townsend old age pension plan, and a fund is being subscribed by volunteers to collect \$200 which would be given to some qualified old citizen on March first.

**MARFA**—The Presidio silver mine of the American Metal company at Shafter produced the bulk of the state's output of gold and lead, according to the Big Bend Sentinel. The information was put out by the Bureau of Mines, Washington, D. C.

**FORT STOCKTON**—Leasing of the 14 1/2-section ranch of Joe Lane, and the 7-section ranch of J. L. Nutt in Pecos county, by Wilford Day, widely known Rambouillet sheep breeder of Parowan, Utah, and J. D. White of Barnhart was announced in last week's issue of the Pioneer. The two men have formed a partnership of Day and White, and have placed 700 head of registered sheep on these ranches, 400 of which are ewes. Pecos county was chosen by these men because of good range conditions and the increasing importance of Fort Stockton as a sheep center, according to the Pioneer further stated.

**FORT DAVIS**—A deal was completed last week whereby John Childers of Ozona became owner of the Wouffler ranch, formerly owned by Lee Kingston of Balmorhea. The ranch, located in the Davis mountains in the vicinity of Gomez Peak, brought \$5 an acre on patented basis, according to the Dispatch.

**MONAHANS**—At a meeting of the board of directors of the newly created First State Bank of Monahans, March first was set as the opening of the institution, the News reports. At present officials are busy getting the building in shape and it is hoped that the bank may open for business by February 15 or 20, the News further stated.

**BALMORHEA**—Work on the State Park Camp near here is being stepped up in order to complete as much of outlined plans as possible before removal of the CCC camp unit. Work is now being rushed on a caretaker's house, a modern and commodious building, Balmorhea, which boasts of the largest outdoor swimming pool in the world, a huge lake abundantly stocked with crappie, perch and bass, is destined to become one of the leading resorts of the Southwest.

Funeral services will be held in Martinez this afternoon, in burial will be in the Martinez cemetery.

Firemen W. C. Cargile and J. H. Lochausen acted as messengers with two of the new engines from Sanderson to Valentine Tuesday.

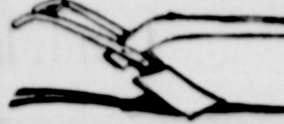
