GOOD STUDY LIGHTING
Lighting specialists and educators emphasize the importance of proper lighting for home study-to prevent eyestrain and fatigue, make homework easier and study hours more productive. For the study area in your home, select a good table lamp which has a diffusing bowl to soften the light and prevent glare. The shade should conceal the light source from the eyes and spread light evenly over the entire work surface. Use at least 150 watts of light. Help your young students enjoy
better learning.
