By consulting a simple chart, offices, the zone can readily pe offices, the zone can readily be
identified because tie first three numbers of the ZIP Code repre sent sectional centers. This re-
places a method in which a directory often had to be consult ed to locate the proper zone for each of the nation's 33,000 post
offices. The new rates will range from 40 cents for a 3-
pound parcel destined for local delivery, to 60 cents for the
same parcel to zone 3 (150 to 300 miles). The new zoning method will also apply to Air parcel post, catalogs, and to publishers who pay zone rates
