The balance of the bond issue of $\$ 50,000$ which is for renovafootball field; plumbing at alementary school, $\$ 500$; furniture and equipment at high school, $\$ 10,000$; dressing rooms, present $\mathrm{gym}, \$ 40,500$; renovate
high school, $\$ 41,000$; renovate band hall, $\$ 6,000$. It was pointed out that the school now owns two lots on the northwest corner of the block to
