



It's over 600 miles from Friona to Houston -- about a 1250-mile round trip.

Yet, among the first Texans to see the Houston Astros play baseball in their famous Astrodome (domed stadium) were several residents of Friona.

Among the "first nighters" -- those who saw the very first game ever played under the "dome" were Mr. and Mrs. O. J. Beene of Friona.

The Beenes saw the Astros beat the New York Yankees, 2-1 in a 12-inning exhibition game the Friday night before the season officially opened. They were part of almost 50,000 fans, including president Lyndon B. Johnson, who crowded into the Astrodome to witness the first baseball game ever played indoors.

Then a couple of weeks ago the group who went to Houston for the Texas Association of Bowling Youth (TABY) state tournament were guests of the Astros at an official National League game between Houston and Pittsburgh.

The latter group were among the crowd which was on hand the night Bob Aspromonte and Jimmy Wynn hit Houston's first home runs in the "dome," and set off the new ball park's expensive scoreboard.

There may have been other Friona area residents who have seen Houston's "eighth wonder of the world," probably so; but these are the only ones who have given us a direct report.

Although there is variance in the impressions gained from the visit to the Astrodome, one thing is brought out in each report: it must be a fabulous sight.

Beene and his wife were thrilled with the Astrodome. They were among the fans who were rewarded when "old pro" Mickey Mantle of the Yankees became the first player to sock a home run in the park; and witnessed another old-timer, Nellie Fox, former Chicago White Sox star, deliver the game-winning hit in the 12th inning.

"It's quite a place," says Beene, who recommends that anyone planning a trip to the Houston area include a Houston baseball game on their agenda. Eddie Irwin, manager of Friona Lanes, was the spokesman for the TABY group which attended a Houston game.

Irwin, who has witnessed other major league contests, says that the Astro officials have really "hammed up" the act, but that in so doing they are luring many spectators who previously didn't care a whit about baseball.

The two-million dollar scoreboard, Irwin says, is "incredible." The huge contraption is used for various things in addition to merely heralding the runs, hits and errors which common, every-day scoreboards contain.

The Astrodome scoreboard goes a step farther. When a member of the home team hits a home run, it's like a carnival, county fair and side show rolled up in one package.

When the scoreboard operator wants to hasten a rally by the home team, there is a deal whereby a trumpet sounds and a huge replica of the word "Charge" appears on the screen-like scoreboard.

The fans, naturally, take up the cry. "It isn't like any baseball I've ever seen, but there again lies a selling point for the Houston folk," Irwin points out.

"You take for instance the girls on the bowling team who were at the game. Most of them don't ordinarily care about baseball. But the 'side attractions' made it an enjoyable evening for them," he said.

There are many other fabulous aspects of the Astrodome, such as its air conditioning, speaker system and so forth, but as those who have seen the place attest: you just have to see it for yourself.

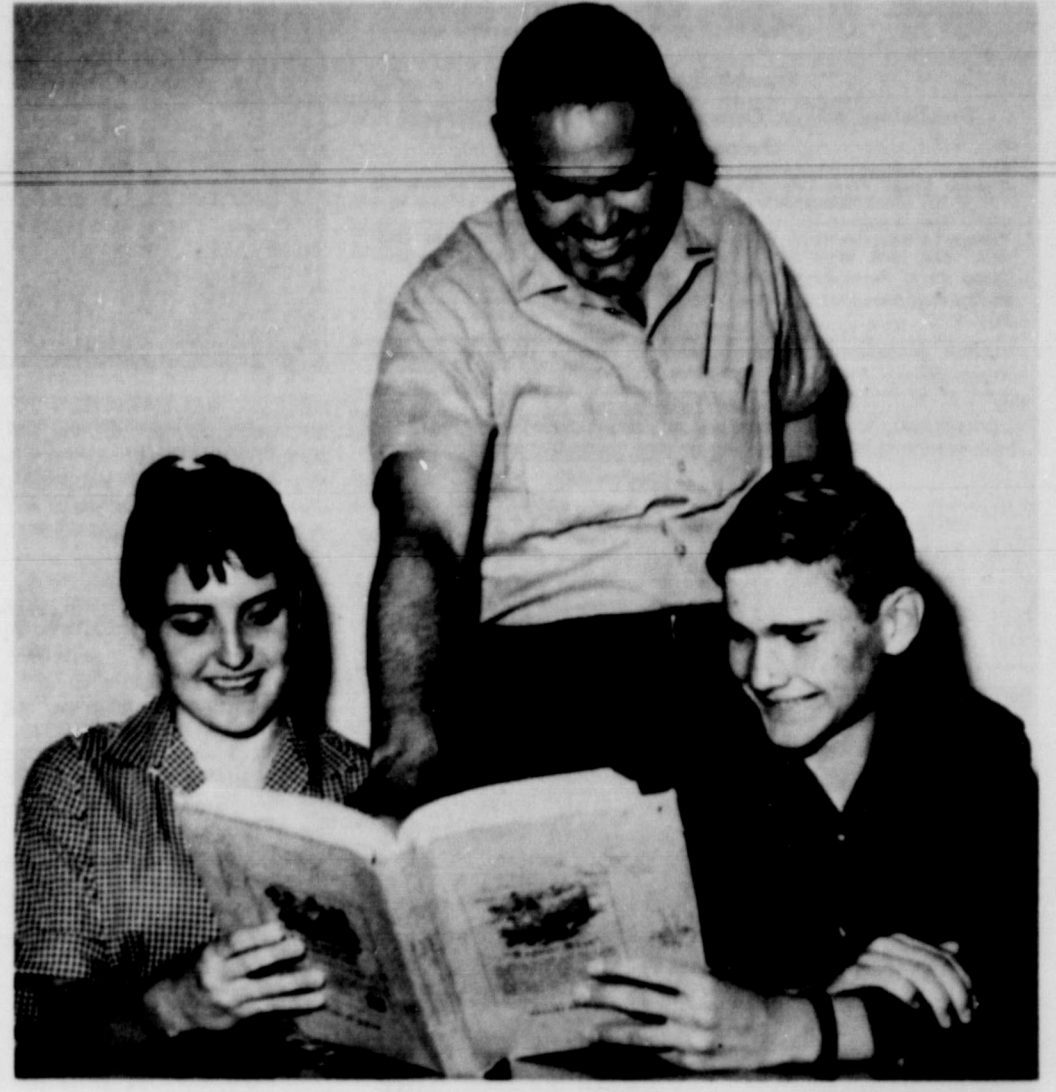

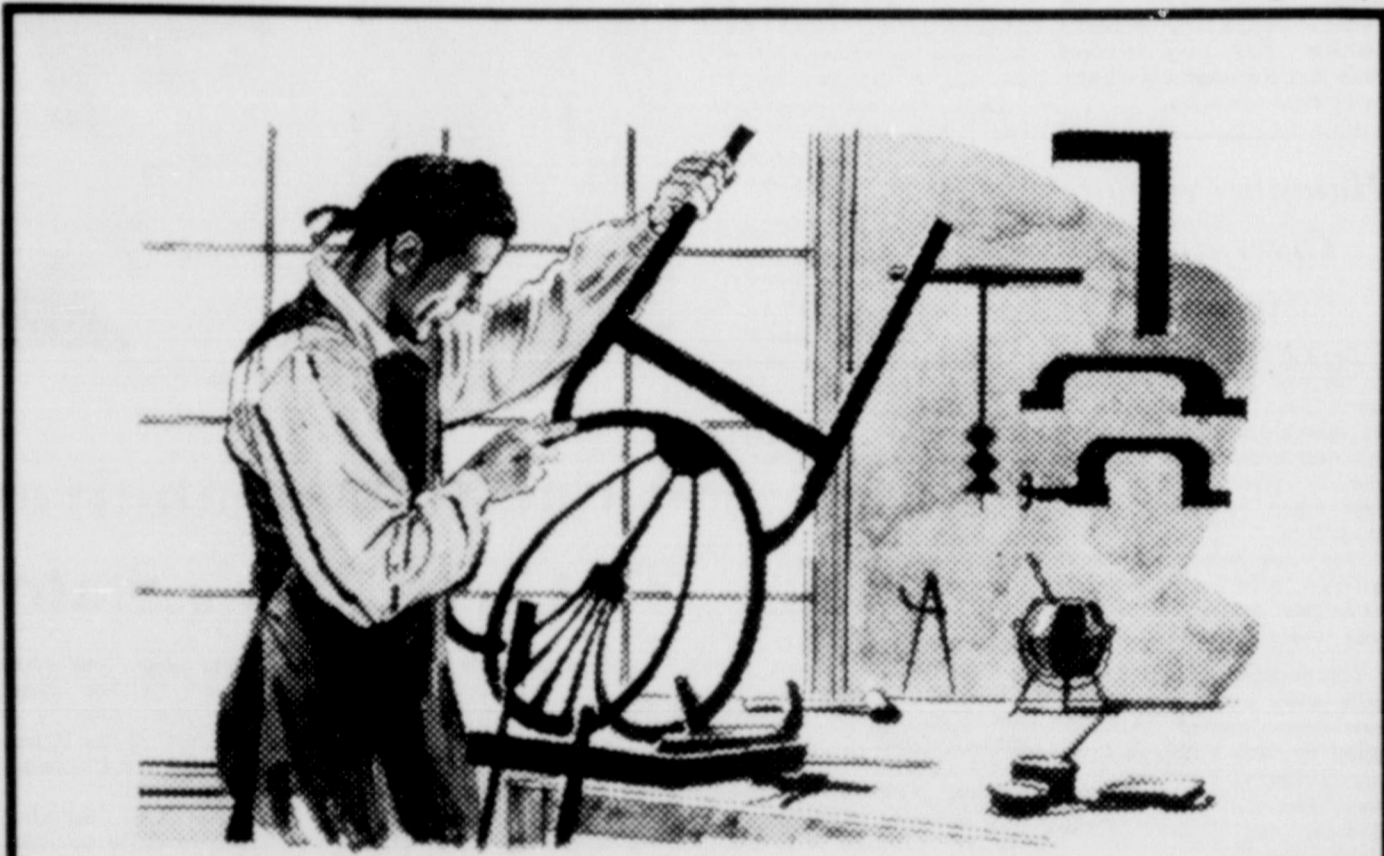

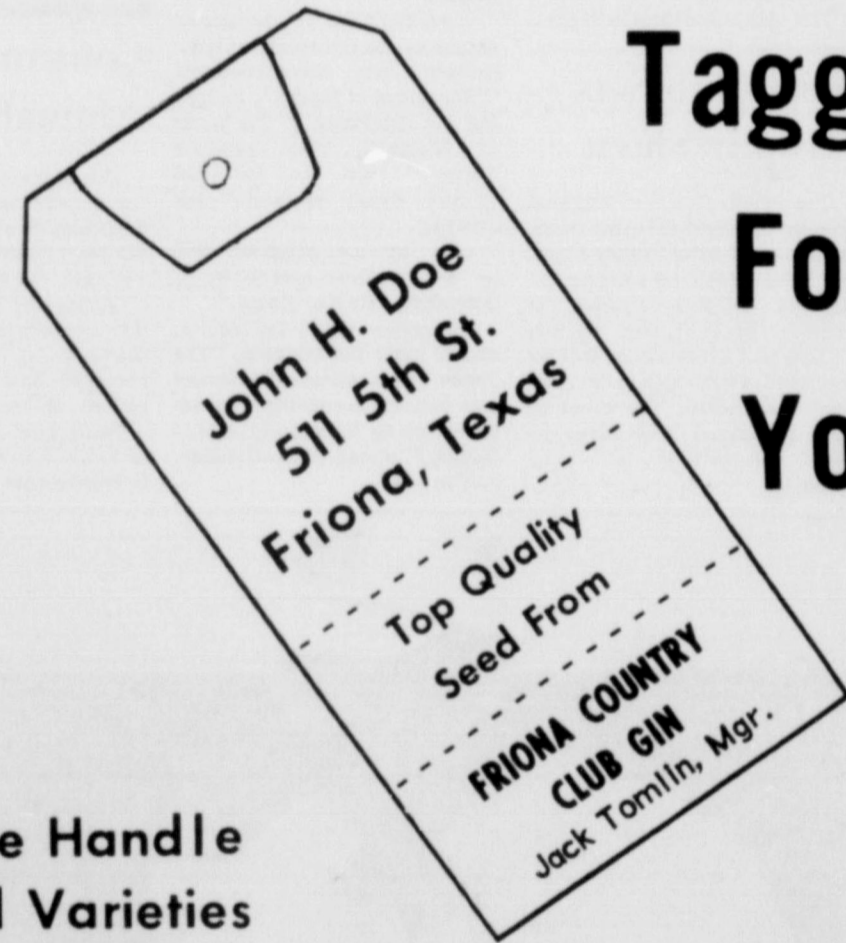

Friona Farmer Hopes To Beat Seedling Disease

While many farmers were worrying about planting early because of cotton seedling disease, Charles Hough planted at least a six acre test plot last Saturday which should free him of these yearly worries. Seedling disease annually causes loss of stands and replanting on thousands of acres in many counties of West Texas. Losses are usually heavier earlier in the spring when the soil is too cool at planting, or when excessive cold rain later falls.

Bush each planted experimental plots, using a granular fungicide, although in granular form.

The test plots are making use of two new materials which will become available to farmers, will allow the county agent, working through local farmers, to evaluate the new chemicals.

Cotton seedling diseases during a period from 1952 through

1956 caused an annual reduction of 2.17 per cent of the potential Texas cotton crop. This represents a loss of about \$13,000 per year.

The objective of the fungicide treatment is to mix the chemical with the soil from the seed level to the soil surface in a band three-quarters to two inches wide to produce a treated area through which the seedlings will grow.
