[^0]:    Governor Price Daniel, while Attorney General, wrote an opinion on the question of party loyalty in which he soid, "The courts of Texas have answered this question by holding that the pledge taken at the time of voting in the primary election DOES NOT create a legal obligation.

    Governor Daniel repeated that opinion by saying that the pledge on the primary ballot does not obligate anyone "legally or morally" to vote for the Democratic ticket in the general election
