**Local Baptist Church To Show Sound Film Friday, February 8**

The local Baptist Church is sponsoring the showing of the new sound film, "The Book For The World of Tomorrow." Produced by the American Bible Society, it will be shown at the First Baptist Church Friday, Feb. 8, 7:30 p. m.

The picture, which represents a new departure in the making of movies with a distinctly religious message, was made possible through the cooperation of

the Westinghouse Electric and Manufacturing Co. All people interested are invited to attend. There will be a brief worship service accompanying the presentation.

The film illustrates the important place of the Bible in our land and in many others and how through the devoted labors of many men it came to be the Book for the world of yesterday; how its rapid passage into the tongues of nine-tenths of mankind and its world wide distribution have made it the Book for the world of today; and how we whose heritage it is are challenged to make the Bible the Book of the world for tomorrow.

Among the interesting sequences are the first printing from movable metal type in Europe by Gutenberg; how a translation into a foreign tongue is actually made; and the story of the Vulgate translation by St. Jerome, still an outstanding work of scholarship.

Many fine portions of the picture and some of the musical background were contributed by Warner Brothers, Metro-Goldwyn Mayer and the Radio Corporation of America with the consent of the American Federation of Musicians. The Gutenberg press used in the picture is an exact replica of the original in Mainz, Germany, and was loaned by the Cuneo Press of Chicago.

Rev. Maynard Rogers, pastor, announces this program and showing of "The Book For The World of Tomorrow" as an introduction to "Bible Sharing Day" which will be observed by the First Baptist Church on Sunday, Feb. 10, 11 a. m. and 7:30 p. m. Offerings in these services will go for the work of The American Bible Society, thus sharing the printed Word of God with multitudes, especially in the liberated countries, who beg for the Scriptures. "Doors now open to the Bible," says Pastor Rogers, "present an outstanding opportunity for Christian missions because Scripture distribution is at the center of the missionary enterprise. We, therefore, intend to do our part as American Christians in filling those needs now, realizing as we do, that only America has the paper and the presses and the resources to provide the Book of Books they so sorely need and WANT."

The U. S. S. Montour is one of the Navy auxiliaries which maintained supply lines close behind the U. S. sea, air and land offensive throughout the Pacific war.
