Bliss Centennial Program To Have Army, Civilian Dignitaries; Varied Events Scheduled

FT. BLISS, Tex. — Secretary of War C. Royall and Gen. O. Bradley will be among the military dignitaries participating in the three-day Ft. Bliss Centennial program, Nov. 5-7, the Department of the Army announced today.

Mr. Royall will be heard with Gen. Beauford H. Jester of Texas in a network hook-up by the National Broadcasting Co. at 9:30 a. m. (MST), Sunday, Nov. 7. The Secretary will speak from Washington and Gov. Jester from El Paso, in a ceremony marking the close of the Centennial.

Gen. Bradley, accompanied by Gen. Charles G. Sage, will be in El Paso Sunday, Nov. 6, for inspection of the Ft. Bliss replica and review of troops. His itinerary also includes appearance at the Centennial luncheon in El Paso in honor of the chief executives of Texas, New Mexico and the Mexican State of Chihuahua; a press conference in downtown El Paso; impromptu appearances at ceremonies in honor of enlisted men of Fort Bliss, William Beaumont General Hospital and Biggs Air Force Base.

The Centennial program, marking the 100th Anniversary of the Department General Order establishing a military garrison at El Paso, highlights the Army's role in development of the Southwest.

Nucleus today of a vast Anti-aircraft Artillery and Guided Missile Center, Fort Bliss was officially designated in 1854 in honor of William Wallace Blair, chief of staff for General Zachary Taylor in the Mexican War. The site of Gen. J. Pershing's Border operations prior to the First World War, it later became the world's

there's a fast north wind. If your enthusiasm for wool includes jackets, pants, mitts, caps, et al, the question arises: "How do you keep the moths out?"

The answer: Assign one closet in the house as the wool closet. Clean, sun and air all woollens thoroughly, hang or stack them away in this closet. Now, hang up as many perforated cans of paradichlorobenzene, as space affords. It comes under various trade names, but somewhere on the container you will find the real name. The crystals will in time evaporate and fill the closet with a gas fatal to moths. Comes cold weather, your flannels will still be "all" wool.

Basic garments for cold weather sports start with underwear which is all wool, spring needle knit, with full length sleeves and legs, and a high neckline. Suit yourself whether it shall be the two-piece outfit or the union suit.

Now and then a store will come up with the old-fashioned two-piece red flannels, but don't be fooled by the light-weight kind used by many skiers. It's a good idea to wear a pair about four sizes bigger than your true size. The well-socked man of rod and gun wears wool on his feet, often during both summer and winter.
