Trees Availible for Spring Planting

BY W. M. (DUB) DAY County Agent, Upton County

Some 17 species of trees or shrubs will be available for planting by Texas landowners, early in 1965, from the Texas Forest Service at a delivered cost $\alpha<\$ 1.50$ per hundred plus the 2 per cent sales tax.
The trees and shrubs may be used for windbreaks, soil stabilization, and Christmas tree plantings, but cannot be used or resold for shade or ornamental purposes. All seedling orders will be packed in moss and moistureproof paper and shipped prepaid direct to the purchaser
Orders for species shown on the application must be in mútiplee of 50 and orders for less than 10 seedlings or seed (black walnut) will be accepted.
