## Three Hospital Contracts Awarded Monday in Commissioners Court

Upton County Commissioners' approved three contracts totaling \$186.381.36 for construction and renovations to Rankin Hospital.

Largest contract went to the Glen W. Casey Co., Inc. for the amount of \$107.856.00. This was for general construction. The firm is out of Odessa.

Fitzgerald & Skidmore, Inc. of Midland were awarded a \$59.875 - 36 contract for mechanical construction.

Cardinal Electric Company, another Midland firm, was given a contract in the amount of \$18.650.00 for electrical work.

All contracts require work to be started within 10 days. On the general construction contract with Glen W. Casey, a total of 210 working days-or seven months approximately-is allowed for completion of the job. A fine of \$50 per day is provided against the contractor for each day's delay past the specified 210.

Both the mechanical and electrical contracts have the same clause providing for fines past the agreed upon ompletion date; however, each of these firms get an extra ten days after general constrution is completed in which to finish their portions of the

COIN-OP DRY CLEANING-

Coin-operated or self-service dry cleaning has improved greatly since its beginning in 1960. There were only a few hundred units in use in 1960. At the end of 1965, there were nearly 60 .-000 units in 8500 dry cleaning centers throughout the U.S.

Despite the economy, convenience and efficiency of coin-op drycleaning, some problems occur. Here are some tips for more successful self-service dry cleaning

1. For best results clean clothes frequently. Embedded dirt and soil are just as hard to remove in drycleaning as the ground-in dirt is to remove from fabrics that require washing:

2. Brush dust and lint from inside pockets and cuffs; brush off loose dirt.

3. Close all hooks and zippers to help keep the fabrics from snagging. Remove hooks from all draperies.

4. Remove noncleanable trims

#### **Hunting Leasers to** be Licensed; Must Keep Record Book

A reminder from the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department is that any person leasing land for the purpose of hunting must obtain a "Shooting Preserve Licen-

An application for the license is needed and can be acquired from any game warden. A record book is also required to be kept listing the names of people hunting, their addresses, hunting license number, and a record of each day's kill of different birds and game.

The record book must be mailed to the Department's headquarters in Austin not later than May 1st of each year.

The Shooting Preserve License cost \$5.00 and can be obtained from the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department, John Reagan Building, Austin, Texas, or from any game warden.
