**JOHN DEERE HAS NEW
LAWN, GARDEN TRACTOR**

A new 8 h. p. tractor with an exclusive independent ground-speed control has been announced by John Deere. It is the John Deere 110 Lawn and Garden Tractor.

The "110" features a transaxle, or combination transmission and differential. There are three forward gears and one reverse. An independent ground-speed control lever can be set in seven positions, giving a wide selec-

tion of forward or reverse speeds. Ground-speed changes can be made on the go without using the clutch or throttle. A rotary lawn mower attached to the tractor continues to run at proper speed while the ground speed is changed. This means that the operator can mow short or high grass without reducing the efficiency of the mower.

Lubbock One Of 15 Spot Cotton Markets

The cotton trade and the United States Department of Agriculture have worked together for many years to make available to all segments of the cotton industry, accurate price quotations for trading in spot cotton, according to W. K. Palmer, chairman of the Lubbock Cotton Classing Office. The Spot Cotton Quotations Report was first issued on Aug. 16, 1915. This is the oldest daily national market report currently being published by the USDA Agricultural Marketing Service.

The purpose of spot cotton quotations is to provide accurate price information to encourage efficient production, effective marketing and economic utilization of cotton. Official spot cotton quotations must be correct and accurate if they are to serve as reliable guides to current values of cotton in a market.

Fifteen bona fide cotton markets have been designated across the cotton belt from South Carolina to California, to quote the price of spot cotton.

Lubbock is one of these spot markets. The Lubbock Cotton Exchange appoints six of its members each year to serve as a spot cotton quotations committee. This committee cooperates with the Agricultural Marketing Service's Cotton Classing Office in Lubbock in obtaining and quoting accurate spot cotton prices.

The quotations are based on the price or value of Middling 1-inch and the differences between the price or value of Middling 1-inch and other grades and staple lengths of cotton. Quotations are based upon the Official Cotton Standards of the United States.

After the spot cotton quotations are determined and published, what use is made of them? Originally the quotations were used in the settlement of future contracts. Now they are guides of current trading values and are used by merchants in buying and selling, mills in determining approximate cost of raw cotton, bankers in providing financing services and insurance companies and other agencies in establishing rates and settling damage claims.

Spot Cotton Quotations are used by the USDA Commodity Credit Corporation to establish premiums and discounts for the government Price Support Programs, to determine the market price for cotton in surplus disposal programs and for settlement differences for sales of government stocks.

Producers can use spot cotton quotations as a guide in determining the current market value of cotton. They will enable the producer to more effectively market his cotton.

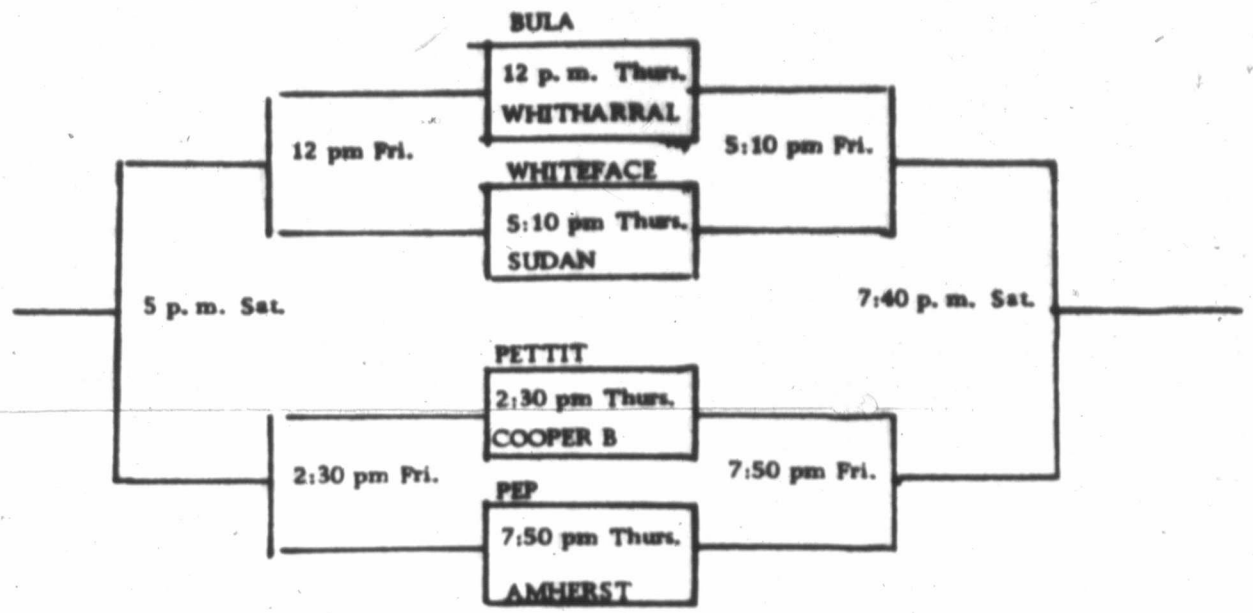

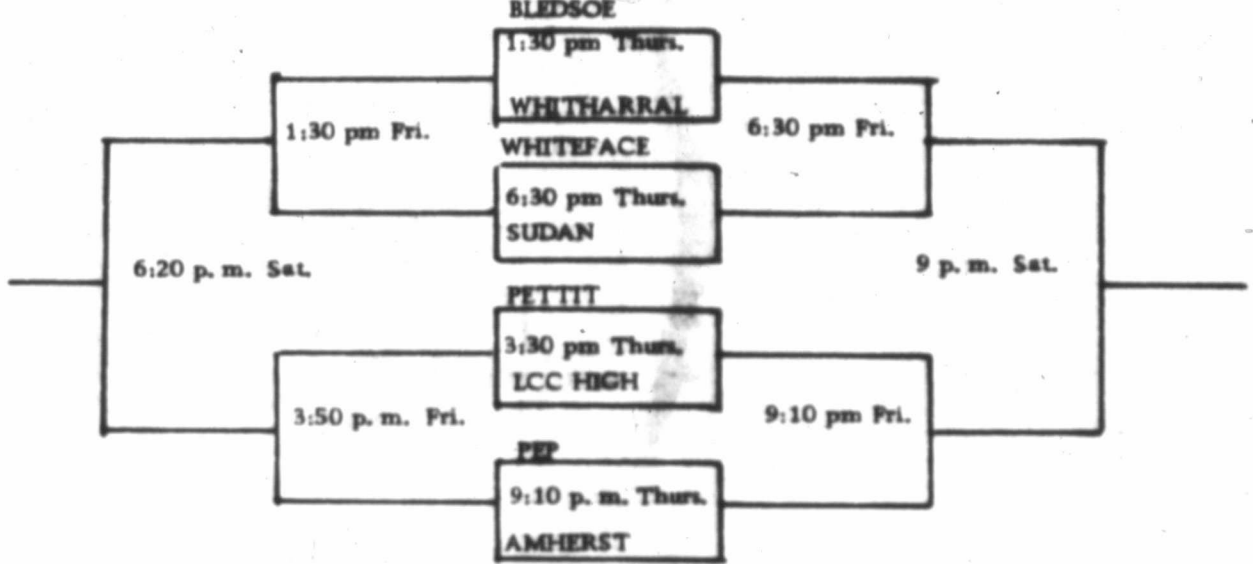

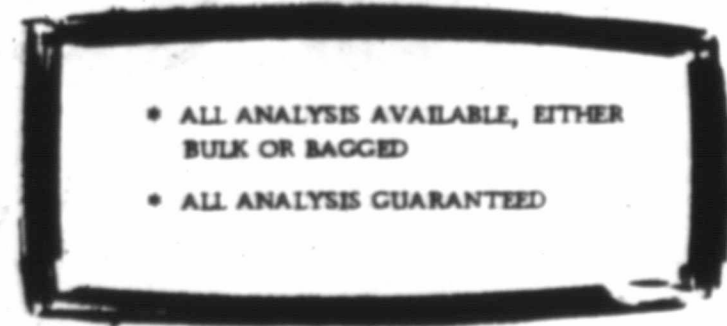
