The writers just set down the story with no regard to how long it may take to present it on TV, and when the litter is up, they front coin to inff. it.

As If we didn't have enough frustrations in our daily living, Alfred Hitchcock used to have a series in which he specialised in the susprise ending, but ususlly it made some sort of rester. Even his stories didn't always, though, I like the traditional ending cometimes; I used to long to see one Tom and Jerry Cartoon in which the cat won out.

I even thought htlf-enriously of writing the author and asking his permission to finish the book for him. It was as idiotic and quentlefying as a government directive.

Once upon a time all the stories started out with "once upon a time" and ended with "and they lived, heppily ever after, " Folks got thred of this, finally, and the authors began ending one opposionally with the horo gesting killed, or some such, This was oldly with me for thwhile; then it seemed that there were more stories endisig unhoppdly than happtly.
