needed to provide temporary shelter, food and other relief. for the refugees. Concerned.Americans are making it their business to help.

With former President Dwight D. Eisenhower as honorary chairman, 52 leading American businessmen and ed ucators have formed a committee called Near East Emergency Donations (XEED), designed to raise private funds on crash, short-term basis to alle viate the refugees' plight.

The money will be adminis-tered through the financially pressed United Nations Relief and Works Agency for Pales tine Refugees (UNRWA), an organization created by the I'N. General Assembly originally to help the Arabs left homeless after the 1948 conflict. Time is running out on many thousands of refugees stranded on the East Bank of the Jordan River. They are living in make shift quarters-even in the oper air. Unless they get help ver quickly before the desert winter sets in, many will perish. Hunger, disease and deprivation will not wait for political solutions; that is why NEED was

The money culfected by NEED will be converted by UNRWA into the basic necessities of life-including facilities for continuing disrupted educations and distributed among the newly displaced people. Nearly \$7 million has been raised by this humanitarian effort, and a \$1 million che already has been presented. NEED to Jordanian refugees




