However, under the new law you can now decrease your withholding durling the year before you pay a dot of withholding tax that you don't owe. A good example of what can happen was brought out by the tornado and storm
victims in West Texas. Many victims in West Texas. Many of these taxpayers are eligible mount of cax withheld from thelr pay, since their ftemized deductions for the 1970 tax year will include a casualty loss amounting to several thousand dollars. Of course the itemized deduction provision of the law is not limited to casualty losses, but also applies to all types of itemized deductions.
