



The Date Palm-Tree of Life in the Middle Bast



holiday puddings come from? Chances are better than two to one that they come from Iraq, which supplies more than 80 per cent of the world's dates.

For the Iraqi, the sturdy and adaptable date palm tree is a veritable tree of life. It grows abundantly in the rich soil of the Shatt el Arab region, where the Tigris and Euphrates Rivers join, but it can actually grow in any soil—dry, saline, sandy, loamy, or even water-logged. Most important, it thrives on the intensely hot Iraqi summers which are so hard on other forms of green life.

Over thousands of years the natives of Iraq have become masters at the exacting art of growing their national fruit. Early in April the fellahs rapidly climb the bofty date palm trees, which shoot up higher than the average home, and pollinate the male and female blossoms by hand. The dates begin to mature in August, when they are hard and juicy, and later in the month they enter a soft and squashy stage. Most varieties are picked only in their final stage, dry and toffee-like, by teams of three men—one to climb the tree and throw down its fruit to his partner, who loads it in a square basket, and a third man to carry off the basket.

When the harvest is completed in September Landau to the stage of the same and the square basket.

When the harvest is completed in September, landowners and pickers alike celebrate on the plantations while the dates are being sorted. Nothing goes to waste in this date-conscious country. The finest fruit is sterilized and packed for shipment abroad; the crushed stones, rich in carbohydrates, oil and protein, are converted into excellent cattle feed; date alcohol is preserved for industrial use; and arak, a famous liquor, is distilled from date syrup and sent to lands where grapes are scarce.

Even the timber of old palms (80-100 years old) is put to good use as material for houses and bridges, and date leaves and fibres are used in the making of baskets, hats, mats and thatch. Small wonder that Iraqis value their dates as highly as money, and use thousands of tons of them locally for barter.

# **Board President Urges Passage of** Amendment No. 4




