Council says no to closing Euclid, considers moving 9-1-1 to Farwell

The regular monthly meeting of the Friona city council was held at 6:30 p.m. November 14 in council chambers at 619 Main St. Mayor J. B. Douglas and councilman Mark Osborn were absent. Mayor pro-tem Jim Atwell presided. Council members Martha Barker, Cheryl Weatherly, and Charlie Pope were present.

A public hearing on the issue of the permanent closing of Euclid St. between 8th and 9th Streets drew a standing room only crowd. The Friona ISD board of trustees had asked the council to consider closing the block of Euclid between the primary and elementary schools to allow an enclosed walkway to be built from the primary school to the cafeteria.

Friona residents Carol Zetzsche, Joy Osborn, and

Becky Dickson spoke in opposition to the closing. Primary school teacher Shilo Essex spoke in favor of the closing, citing weather and safety concerns. After a brief discussion, councilwoman Martha Barker made a motion to not close the street, seconded by councilman Charlie Pope and the measure was approved unanimously.

Kyler Estes, a Panhandle Regional Planning Commission (PRPC) representative from Amarillo, guided the council through a series of resolutions required for the grant program the city is seeking to repair water pipelines on the east side of Friona. PRPC will be administering the grant requirements for the city.

The council approved resolutions proclaiming December as Fair Housing Month, adopted a local opportunity plan, assigned city manager Patricia Phipps as the Fair Housing officer, and designated PRPC as the labor standards officer for the pipealso adopted and Brandt Enbid for the water line project. Notices from the PRPC concerning the above requirements are posted in this issue of the Friona Star.

The council approved the \$53,100 purchase of a backhoe from Parmer County Precinct 1. There were no bids received to sell old computer equipment. Bids of \$25 for a pickup bumper and \$601 for a welder were awarded to Mike Lamb. A monthly lease of city office space to Atmos Energy for \$125 per month was renewed. The October accounts payable and financial statements were reviewed and approved.

Parmer County Sheriff Randy Geries addressed the council to propose that the line project. Complaint and county be permitted to move grievance procedures were the 9-1-1 emergency calls from the Friona Police Degineering was awarded the partment to the Sheriff's office in Farwell. Geries said his department has received a grant to improve its efficiency. A part of the grant is \$40,000 in new software designed to streamline communications between fire, EMS,

> and law enforcement. In order to function to maximum efficiency the software needs to include 9-1-1 emergency calls. County Judge Trey Ellis, based on his experience as a DPS trooper, told the council that he felt the system would be an advantage to everyone in the county, minimizing any miscommunication between county departments and speeding up response time for units such as LifeStar.

Geries and Ellis told the council that the county would pay the cost of moving the 9-1-1 service from Friona to Farwell. The Friona Police

Department would still maintain its dispatch personnel for local in-city service.

With the relocation, any 9-1-1 call in the county would be routed to the Sheriff's dispatch unit. The computerized system would pinpoint the location of emergencies and dispatch the proper fire and EMS units. Currently Parmer County has five separate fire departments and four different EMS units, each covering a specified portion of the county.

The council agreed to consider the request and will coordinate with PRPC, the entity responsible for 9-1-1 emergency services in the 26-county Panhandle region. The matter will be included on the council agenda at a later date.

As a final item of business, the council went into executive session to discuss negotiations to purchase property adjacent to the city's sewage plant. No action was taken when they returned to open session and adjourned.

The next meeting of the city council will be Monday, December 12 at 6:30 p.m. All council meetings are open to the public.







Band director Ron 'McWilliams said, "Our band has currently earned over a third of the funds needed for our trip; however some of the students still 'need more opportunities to earn their share of the overall cost."

"Students who do not raise their share of the cost of the trip will not be able to participate. The lack of some students' participation could affect instrumentation and the overall performance of the band," he said.

In order to raise funds the students are once again offering to work. If you need help with fall or spring clean-up, hanging Christmas lights, or any other jobs, you can hire band students and help them reach their financial obligations.

McWilliams says you can hire as many students as you need and each one is billed at \$10 per hour. To hire a student or students call the high school band room at 250-3383 anytime. Leave your name and phone number on the answering machine and he will call you back. "Please call, our young people need your help," McWilliams said.

County sales tax report

Texas Comptroller Susan Combs said that state sales tax revenue in October was \$1.87 billion, up 15.9 percent compared to October 2010.

You say, "God wouldn't do that," but that exposes your fear of leaving what you have here behind. You would rather die with the way things are, instead of follow God.
