The grant money can be used for anything the recipient sees fit, from utility bills, transportation to treatment, medical bills, etc. Former recipients are also encouraged to re-apply yearly. "We will continue to give as long as funds are available," Lewellen said.

Cotton field day scheduled

The Texas AgriLife Extension Service offices in Bailey and Parmer counties will conduct their annual crop tour beginning at 10 a.m. August 30 on the Marshall Pool farm northwest of Muleshoe (1.5 miles east of Lariat on CR DD).

The tour and its concluding lunch are both complimentary, according to Monti Vandiver, AgriLife integrated pest management agent for Bailey and Parmer Counties.

"The tour will focus on cotton production and will include two replicated cotton variety trials with a very diverse group of genetics as well as a seed treatment trial," Vandiver said. "We will also have cotton industry representatives and AgriLife Extension personnel on hand to present information and to answer producer questions."

"I suggest those unfamiliar with the area call the AgriLife Extension office in Bailey County for directions to the first tour stop," Vandiver advised. "The site directions are also available online; go to the AgriLife Extension website for Bailey County at http:// bailey-tx.tamu.edu and click on 'cotton tour' to view a tour map.

Water district board candidates

Residents in District Directors' Precincts Three and Four of the High Plains Underground Water Conservation District No. 1 will go to the polls November 6 to elect a board member to represent them in groundwater matters for the four-year period 2012-2016.

Carroll Cook and Mike Beauchamp, both of Friona, are candidates for the Precinct Three director position, representing all of Bailey county, the portion of Castro County within the district, and all of Parmer County. Cook is the incumbent.

Robert Meyer of Canyon and Lynn Tate of Amarillo are candidates for the Precinct Four district director position, representing portions of Armstrong, Deaf Smith, Potter, and Randall counties within the district. Meyer is the incumbent.

Deadline for filing an application for a place on the ballot was 5 p.m. Monday August 20. Early voting for the HPWD director election in Precincts Three and Four will be October 22 to November 2, 2012.

A complete list of early voting times and locations will be published in a future issue of the High Plains Water District's newsletter, The Cross Section. They will also be posted on the HPWD website at www.hpwd.com.


Out on North 214, the homes of the Nelsons, Rays, Harts, and Campbells were the hardest hit. The homes are on the west side of




Pat Clyde Howard




