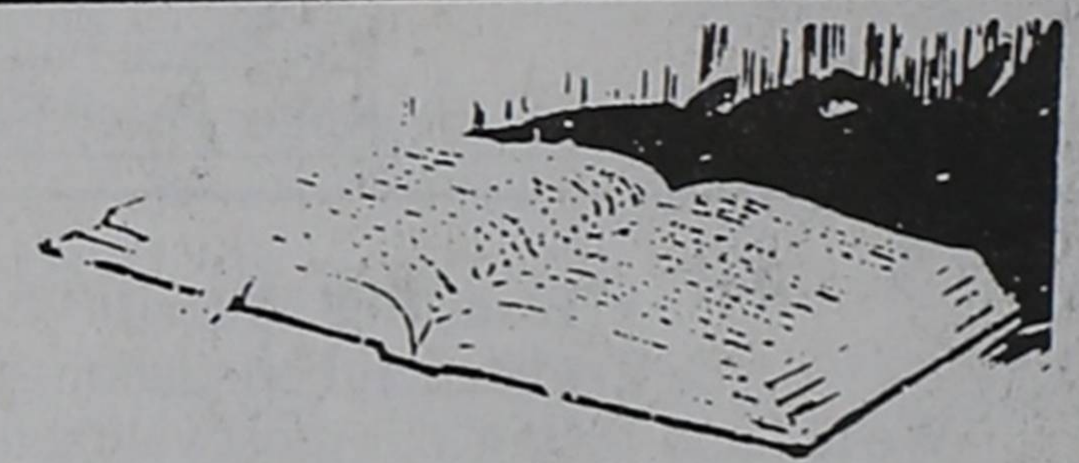

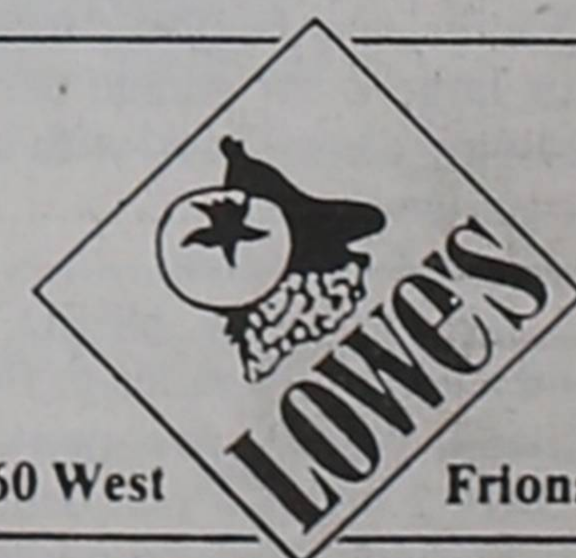

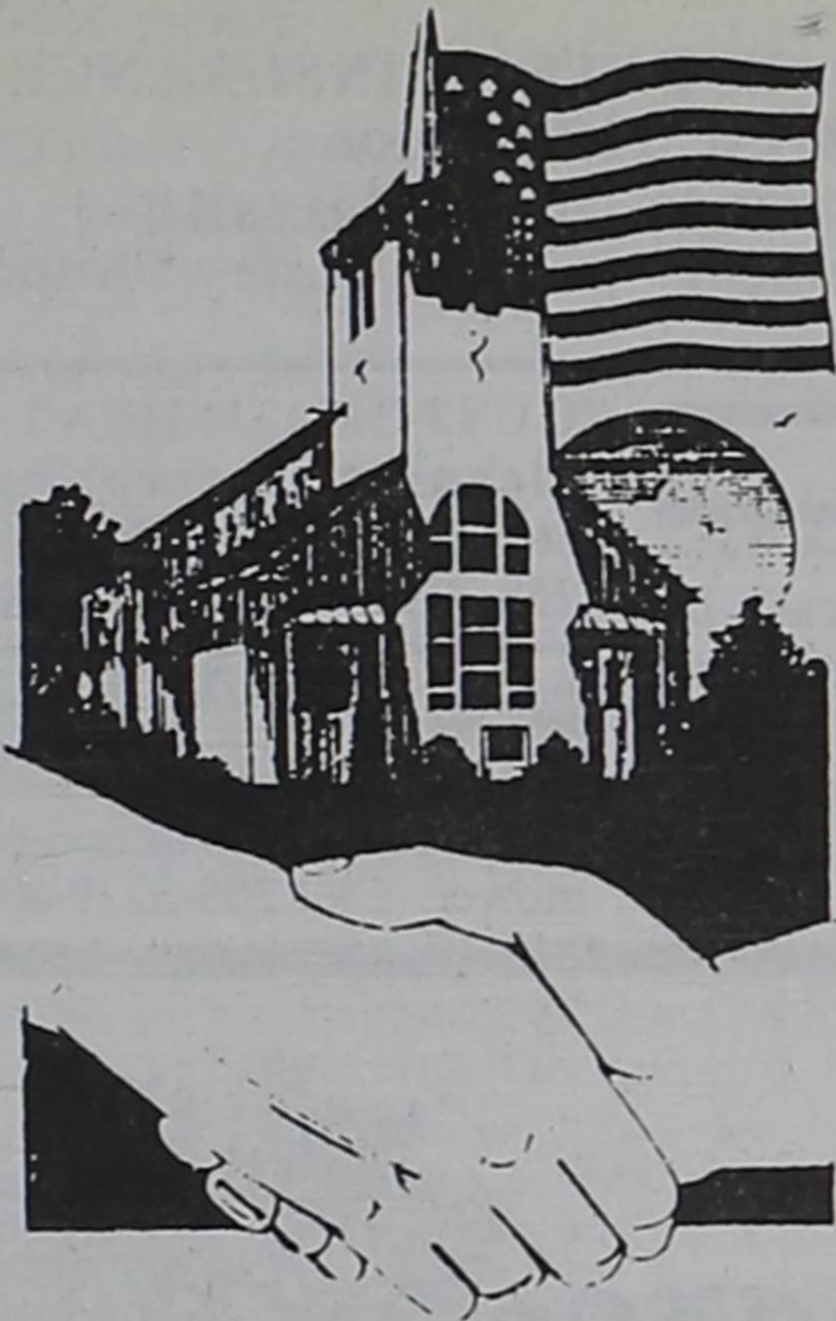

## Lazbuddie Student Earns Scholarship

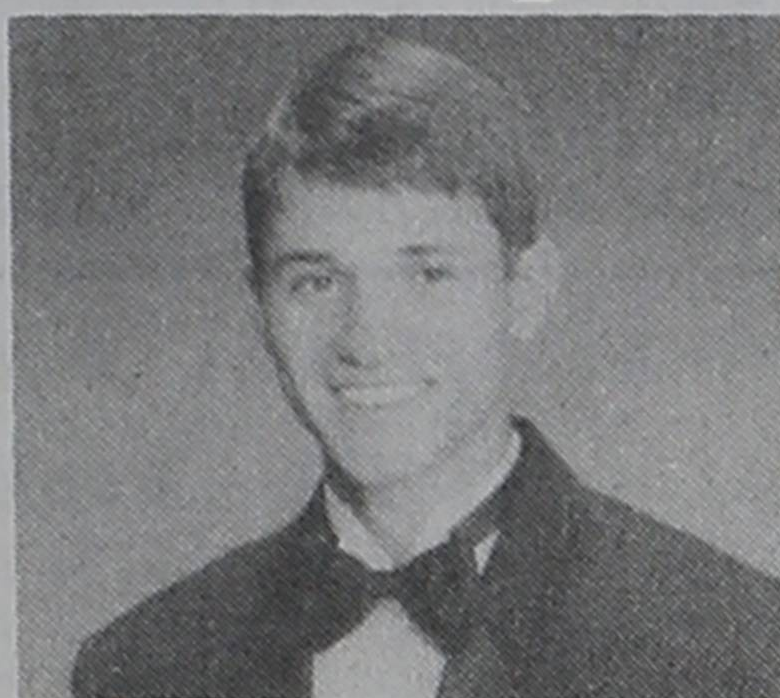

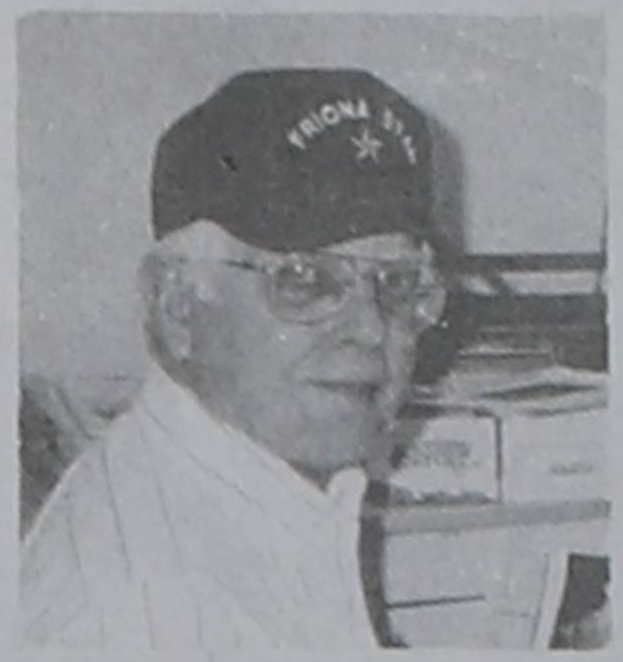

"CENTURY NOTES"

Outland's Career Touched Germany, Japan & Friona

After landing on the southern coast of France after their Atlantic crossing, Outland and his comrades travelled about five miles inland and pitched camp for the night. He and a buddy bedded down in their sleeping bags.

Around midnight, they heard...boom...BOOM! as bombs lit up the night sky.

The next day they learned via radio that the demonstration was the Germans' way of "welcoming" the American troops--sort of like saying "We know you're here, and we'll be watching." Marshalling their equipment, the Americans went up the Rhine River valley. They found the Germans retreating, as the U.S. Air Force apparently had caught them off-guard and gave their ground troops some much-appreciated help.

"The Air Force killed horses, men, and destroyed their equipment. Our engineers took their bulldozers and pushed the dead bodies, horses, etc., into a big ditch," Outland said.

"We went into combat at a place called 'Bitche.' We called it 'bitch,' but they called it 'Beech.' We set up at Strassborg, and had to build a bridge to cross the Rhine and get on the east side. We spent three days there, and lost a number of men, especially engineers involved in the bridge project," Outland recalls.

The Americans worked day and night to complete their pontoon bridge. Eventually the men were able to get across the Rhine with their equipment, and travelled south, where they camped in a deserted German army barracks.

"It was a very sturdily built compound, with all the facilities for our unit to make use of. We spent several days there," the longtime Friona resident said.

Very soon, the Americans

had Hitler on the run in Germany, and the Nazi command had fallen. One of the jobs that befell Outland's unit was to stand guard over a group of "displaced" Russian soldiers and civilians.

"The Russians were boisterous, mean and tough SOB's. They would go out every night and kill some Germans. They might kill one just to get his bicycle. We called a meeting with the Russians, and through an interpreter, told them that the war was over, and they couldn't keep killing the Germans."

"Then, through the interpreter, the Russian group told us 'You go to hell--we'll do what we want to!'"

(Sounds a little bit like Kosovo, doesn't it--B.E.) Outland said that one of the most enjoyable events during his stay in Germany was when the USO sponsored the famed violinist Yasha Heifetz. "He played for three hours one evening, in an auditorium packed with soldiers, who applauded him loudly and thanked him profusely," Outland said.

On another occasion, Outland was called by his general, and several of the officers got to shake hands with movie star Ingrid

Bergman, also there with the USO.

As to close calls, Outland said he had a couple. "I was working with a group measuring the angle that the shells cut, in order to determine where the Germans were firing from."

"At about 10 p.m. one night, a 90-mm shell hit the building we were in--fortunately in another room. If it had been the room I was in, I could have been killed," he said.

Another time, while going by jeep to meet up with some American comrades, Jake's driver turned into a fencerow off the trail they had been on. About that time, a German shell hit the trail just up from where the party had turned. "That was another close encounter!" Jake said.

In August of 1945, Jake and his group received news about a "terrible happening in Japan--something called the atomic bomb."

"Like many other people, we couldn't believe the tremendous loss of life," Outland said.

Finally, in November of that year, Outland's name came up to "ship out." "They put me on an anti-aircraft unit to 'Camp Lucky Strike,'"

and I boarded a ship destined for the USA. I don't hesitate to admit that I kissed the ground of the USA each time I have returned from overseas."

Jake arrived back in San Antonio by military aircraft and surprised Lorene and the children. He had not called them in advance let them know that he was returning home.

Most of the soldiers went ahead and took their separation papers, but Outland hadn't given thought about life after the war. He called his old commander, Gen. Murphy, who was his commander in Europe and asked if he might stay on active duty.

Outland's general told him he desperately needed help at the Army's Separation Center at Fort Logan, Colorado, near Denver. He helped in that assignment, then did similar duty with the National Guard in Kansas and Oklahoma.

A highlight of his Colorado duty was getting the opportunity of meeting and shaking hands with Gen Dwight D. Eisenhower after the general, who was commander of the Allied Forces, had left Europe. Eisenhower later served two terms as president.

He later was moved to the Texas Western College in El Paso, where he was an assistant instructor. "This was an anti-aircraft unit, for which I had little experience. I would study virtually all night in order to stay ahead of the students," he said. He was in El Paso almost three years.

"The next thing I knew, I was ordered overseas to Japan. I arrived in Yokohama and began what was one of my most satisfactory experiences during my military career," Outland said.

Outland applied for his wife and children to join him, as his new appointment was to be lengthy.

The 5th US Air Force had occupied Nagoyo, and built what was called an "American Village," a modernized American-type construction. In 1948, the Outlands were able to move from their Japanese residence into the "Village."

Outland's son Robert, who was three and one-half at the

time, became a favorite of the Japanese workers. He went with a crew one day which was building a gate. Part of the structure fell on young Robert and broke his leg.

As a result, the youngster had a lengthy hospital stay at Osaka, and his mother could visit him only about once a week. It was a traumatic experience for the family, Jake said.

"My tour in Japan was most enjoyable. The Japanese people were very polite, under the circumstances."

When his time was up in Japan, the Outlands returned to the states, and he took an assignment in San Antonio.

Then, on short notice, he was given a "hardship" assignment to return to Japan, where he was made battalion commander of the 99th Field Artillery. "We were training and getting ready. If the cease-fire in Korea failed for some reason, we would have been the first troops to go there. Luckily, he didn't have to."

After about 30 months in Okado, where he had to "soldier" in up to six feet of snow, a cold and miserable situation, he finally returned stateside, again headed to San Antonio.

After about a year, Outland received orders to report to Fort Sill, Oklahoma, his old stomping grounds. No sooner had the Outlands settled there than he received orders that he would be retired on June 30, 1961.

Jake was in Lawton, Ok., when he got a call from his brother Hank, then manager of Friona's SPS office, telling him that the city manager's job here had opened up, asking if he was interested in applying.

After applying, Jake got the job, and followed his 21-year military career with 21 years as city manager.

"Mayor Fleming and Ray Dean Fleming were completing their development of Ethridge addition when I came. Then followed Welch Acres, the Western Addition, and the Northwest Addition, which included the Community Center," Outland said.

The city's primary role was the extension of water and sewer services, the long-time city manager said.

"The north water tower was a major development, and the cemetery was a city responsibility. Our workers dug and covered the graves," he said.

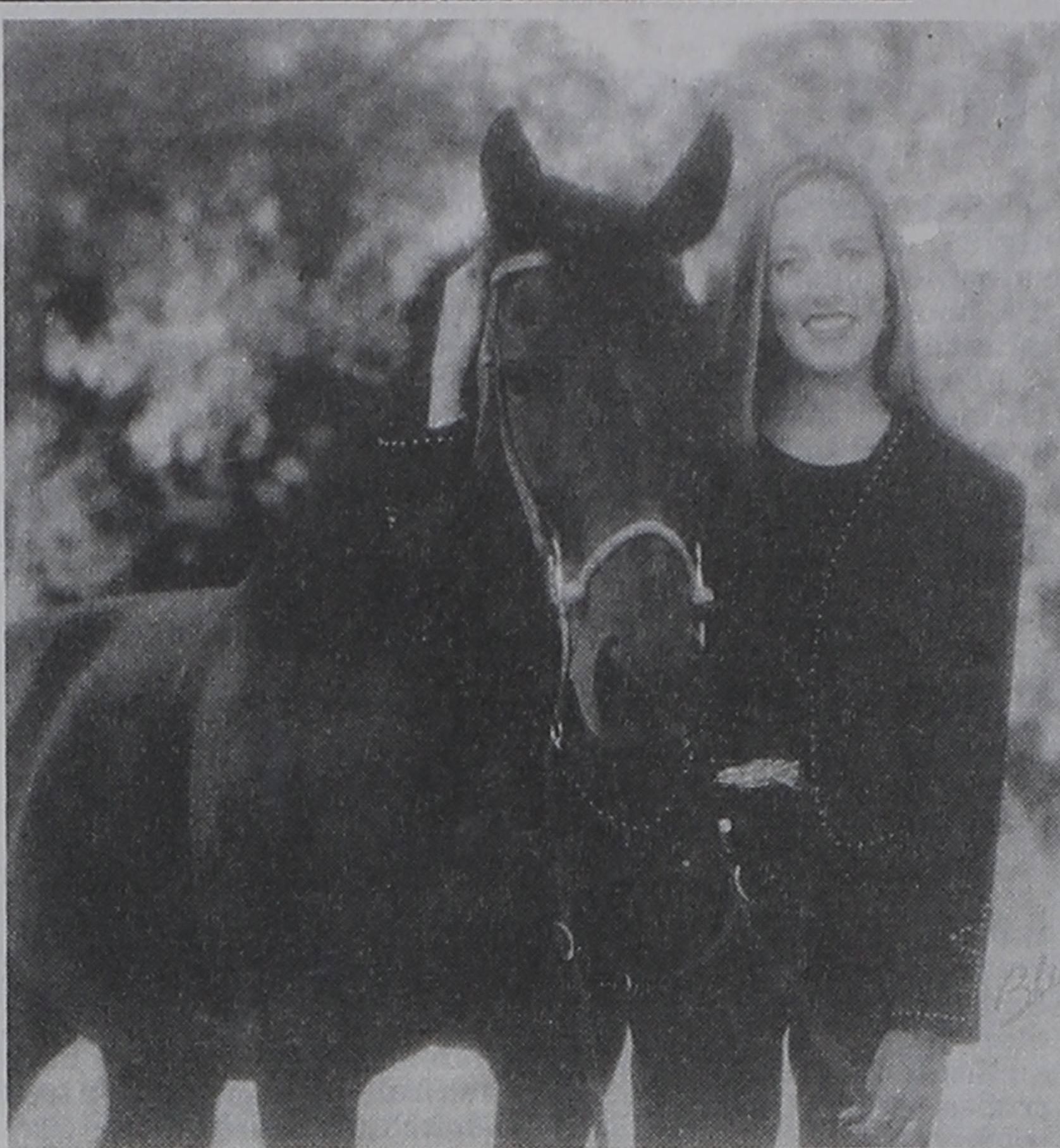

## YOUR EYES

### Repair Or Replace

What's the best option when your eyeglasses break? That depends on the damage that's been done--and the age of the glasses.

A plastic frame over two years old should probably be replaced if it's been broken, unless all that's needed is a replacement screw or rivet. Structural repairs may put stress on the rest of the frame, leading to more breakage. In many cases, it's not even advisable to insert new lenses in an old plastic frame. If the style has been discontinued, it may be difficult to get replacement parts.

What about broken lenses? If the prescription is more than a year old, it's wisest to have your eyes examined before getting new lenses. There may have been a change in your vision.

What about old frames that aren't broken? If you're about to have new glasses made, save the old pair. If your prescription hasn't changed too much, you'll be able to wear the old pair for a brief time in an emergency.

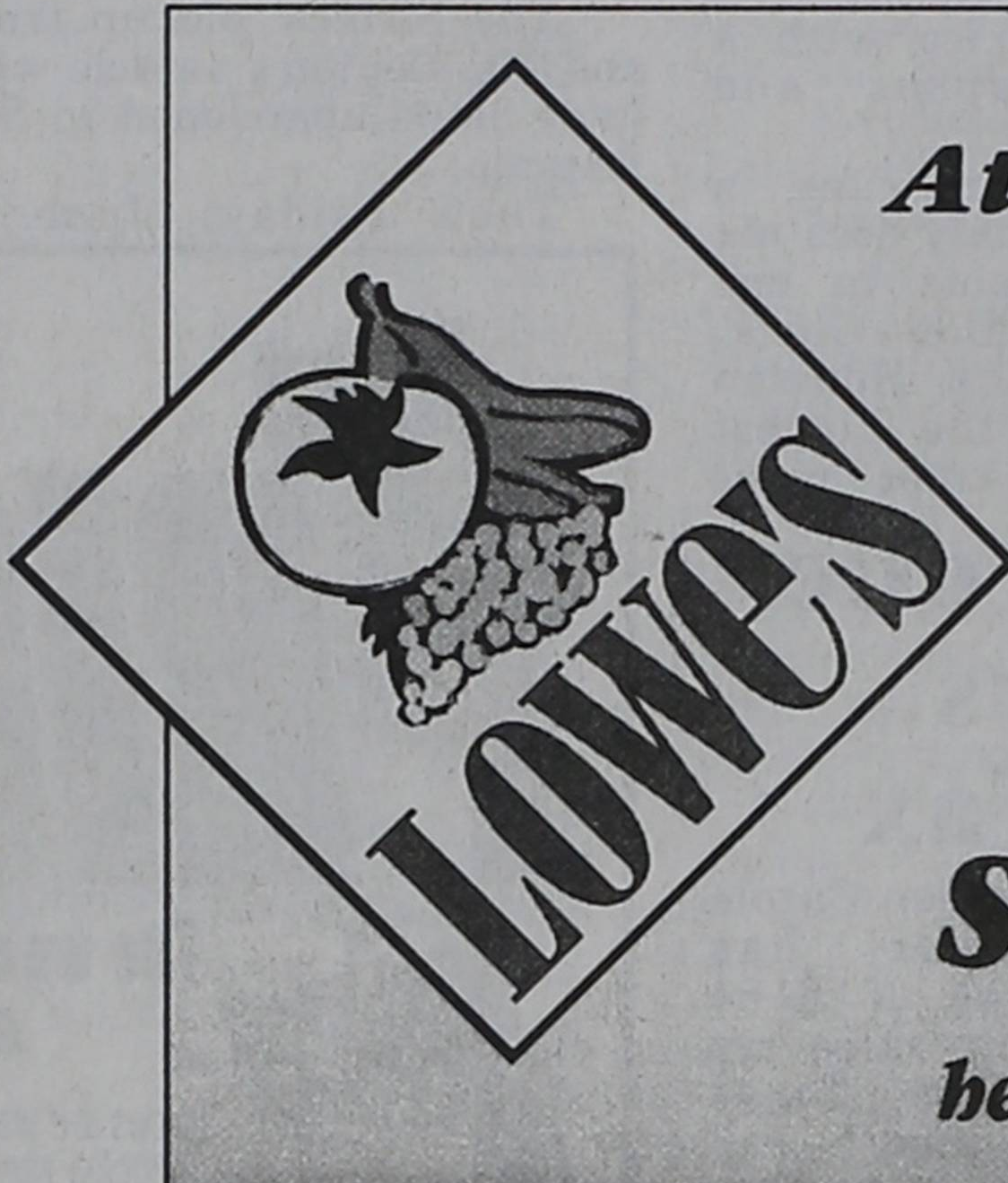
