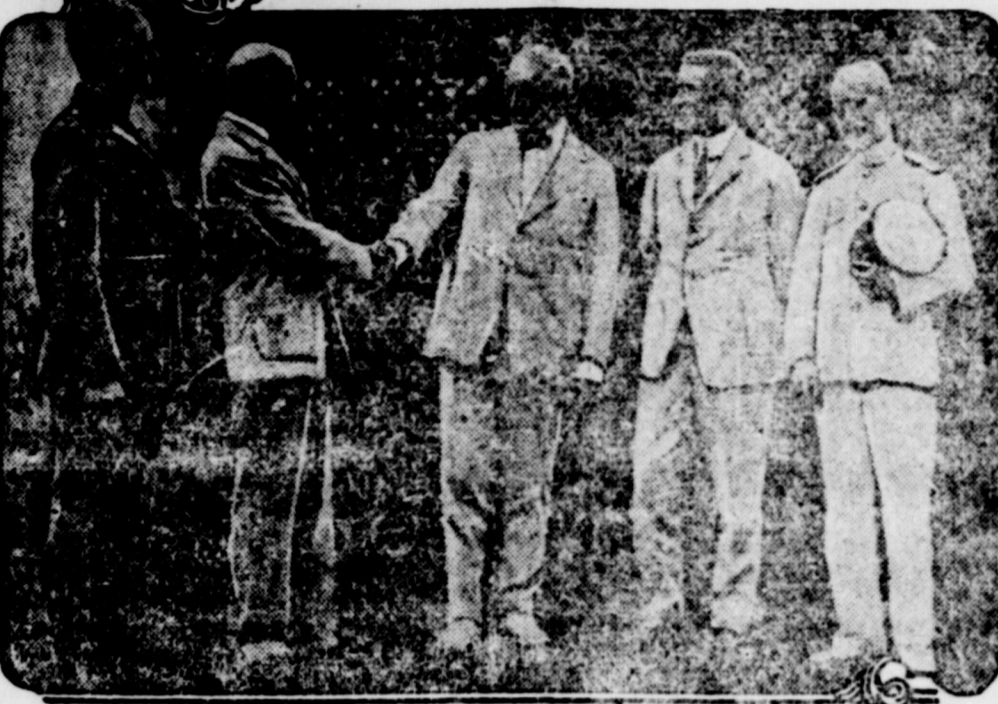

District court was in session here and as he was captured in Terry Co. District Judge W. R. Spencer called the grand jury back in session Friday and the bootlegger was indicted under the Deam law.

He was carried to Tahoka Saturday where bond was made for his appearance at the next term of district court and we understand that G. E. Lockhart of that city was retained as his attorney. A bootlegger can't hardly make head in Brownfield, or at least one never has as yet.

(This is the first of a series of articles contributed by the teachers of the Sunday School of the Methodist church.)

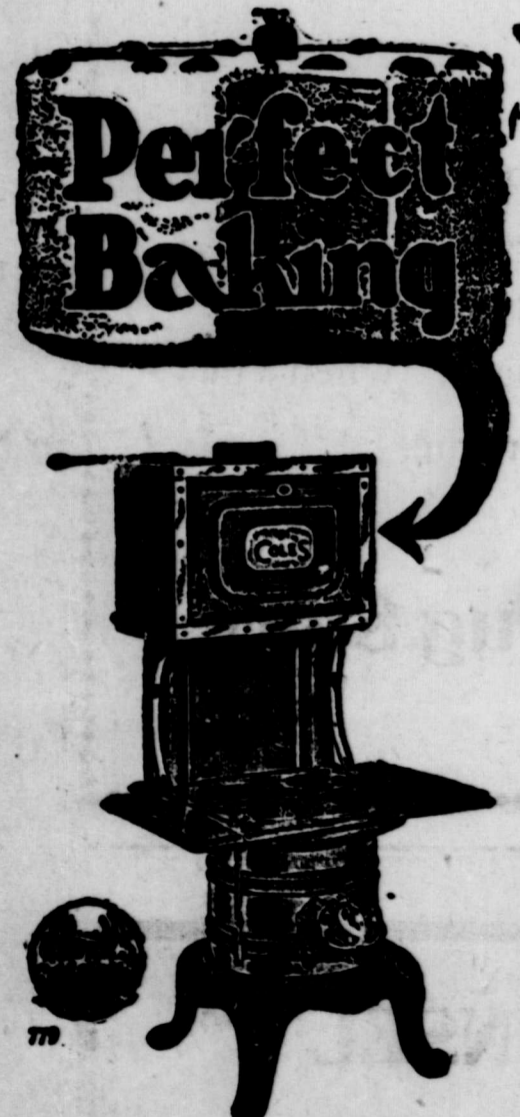
