One consolation is the fact that Japan has been a buyer of our agricultural products, particularly our grain crops, which benefits this area's farmers. So, even though the trade deficit should continue with the country of Japan, you could justify a certain amount of imbalance in the manufacturing industry, since Japan is a customer assembly. for our grain.

absolutely no sense at all, and should make all our citizens in general, and business people in particular, boiling mad, is the way the United States continues to subsidize undeveloped nations by importing their goods.

Where many of these countries are concerned, they have nothing that we cannot produce here in our of goods from these places 90.33. threatens to close factories and put our own citizens out of work simply because they cannot compete with the imported goods, which are often times produced with very little labor cost.

This situation prompted a letter which was printed this week in the Lubbock Avalanche-Journal, from a housewife in Spade. Her comments pretty well sum up our feelings on the matter:

"Editor, Avalanche-Journal: If the government in Washington won't protect us from

foreign invasion, or flooding our nation with foreign goods, we must protect ourselves, our farmers and our workers' jobs. We read every day about our

American citizens losing their jobs and plants closing because our people can't compete against 20cent-an-hour workers in Third-World countries. But we can stop buying anything bought from foreign nations.

In our family we made a resolution the first of the year not to buy anything not made in our country, and by American citizens. You would be surprised how easy it is and how proud I have been to look for our USA brand on what I

buy. It is not any higher than what is shipped in duty free from all the nations taking our jobs and our money from our own people.

Besides, foreign nations don't pay our taxes. We do. They don't pay for our roads, schools, government expenses. They take all our money back to some foreign country, to take care of their own people.

I have bought the last thing I ever expect to buy from other nations that don't buy the same amount from my country.

The Friona area was receiving a nice gentle rain at its press deadline this week.

Up to 7 a.m., the official measurement in Friona was .32 inch, according to Rodney Dunnam, official weather recorder. However, another .24 inch had been received between 7 a.m. and noon, according to Friona Cablevision's weather recorder, which would make around .56 inch locally for the 24hour period.

Late note--rain had increased to .92 inch for 24-hour period (2 p.m).

The outlying area also had received nice rains, with Mike Ellis reporting an inch of rain at his place southeast of town. The Hub area appeared to be somewhat ahead of the immediate Friona area, with the Rhea vicinity having close to what the city had received, as of early morning.

Farm observers say a good rain would be "just what the doctor ordered" for the area.
