## Graduation Rites Slated May 23-24

**FOR THE PAST** several years, our nation has experienced a trade deficit which has mushroomed into the billions of dollars, and threatens to bankrupt our economy.

Most of us are aware of our plight in regard to the country's oil imports. Due to our massive needs for consuming oil products, it has become necessary to import the bulk of the country's oil needs, at least so our own domestic supplies are not quickly depleted, the experts say.

At last, our leaders are making at least token progress toward our trade imbalance with Japan. It has been a standing joke for years that although Japan may have "lost" to the United States and its allies in World War II, they came out better than if they had won, through the tremendous trade imbalance, with Japanese products flooding our shores, and putting American manufacturers out of business.

America poured millions of dollars into Japan following World War II to get the nation back on its feet.

One consolation is the fact that Japan has been a buyer of our agricultural products, particularly our grain crops, which benefits this area's farmers. So, even though the trade deficit should continue with the country of Japan, you could justify a certain amount of imbalance in the manufacturing industry, since Japan is a customer for our grain.

But the part that makes absolutely no sense at all, and should make all our citizens in general, and business people in particular, boiling mad, is the way the United States continues to subsidize undeveloped nations by importing their goods.

Where many of these countries are concerned, they have nothing that we cannot produce here in our own country. Yet, the importation of goods from these places threatens to close factories and put our own citizens out of work simply because they cannot compete with the imported goods, which are often times produced with very little labor cost.

This situation prompted a letter which was printed this week in the Lubbock Avalanche-Journal, from a housewife in Spade. Her comments pretty well sum up our feelings on the matter:

"Editor, Avalanche-Journal: If the government in Washington won't protect us from foreign invasion, or flooding our nation with foreign goods, we must protect ourselves, our farmers and our workers' jobs."

We read every day about our American citizens losing their jobs and plants closing because our people can't compete against 20-cent-an-hour workers in Third-World countries. But we can stop buying anything bought from foreign nations.

In our family we made a resolution the first of the year not to buy anything not made in our country, and by American citizens. You would be surprised how easy it is and how proud I have been to look for our USA brand on what I buy.

It is not any higher than what is shipped in duty free from all the nations taking our jobs and our money from our own people.

Besides, foreign nations don't pay our taxes. We do. They don't pay for our roads, schools, government expenses. They take all our money back to some foreign country, to take care of their own people.

I have bought the last thing I ever expect to buy from other nations that don't buy the same amount from my country.

# FI Acquisition Nears Reality

Friona Industries, Inc. announced today that CHS Holding, Inc. has notified Friona State Bank that CHS has waived the financing condition to its obligation to consummate the acquisition by CHS of Friona for \$19.00 cash per share of Friona Common Stock. CHS has informed Friona that CHS has entered into definitive loan agreements with a group of financial institutions to provide the financing necessary for CHS to consummate its acquisition of Friona.

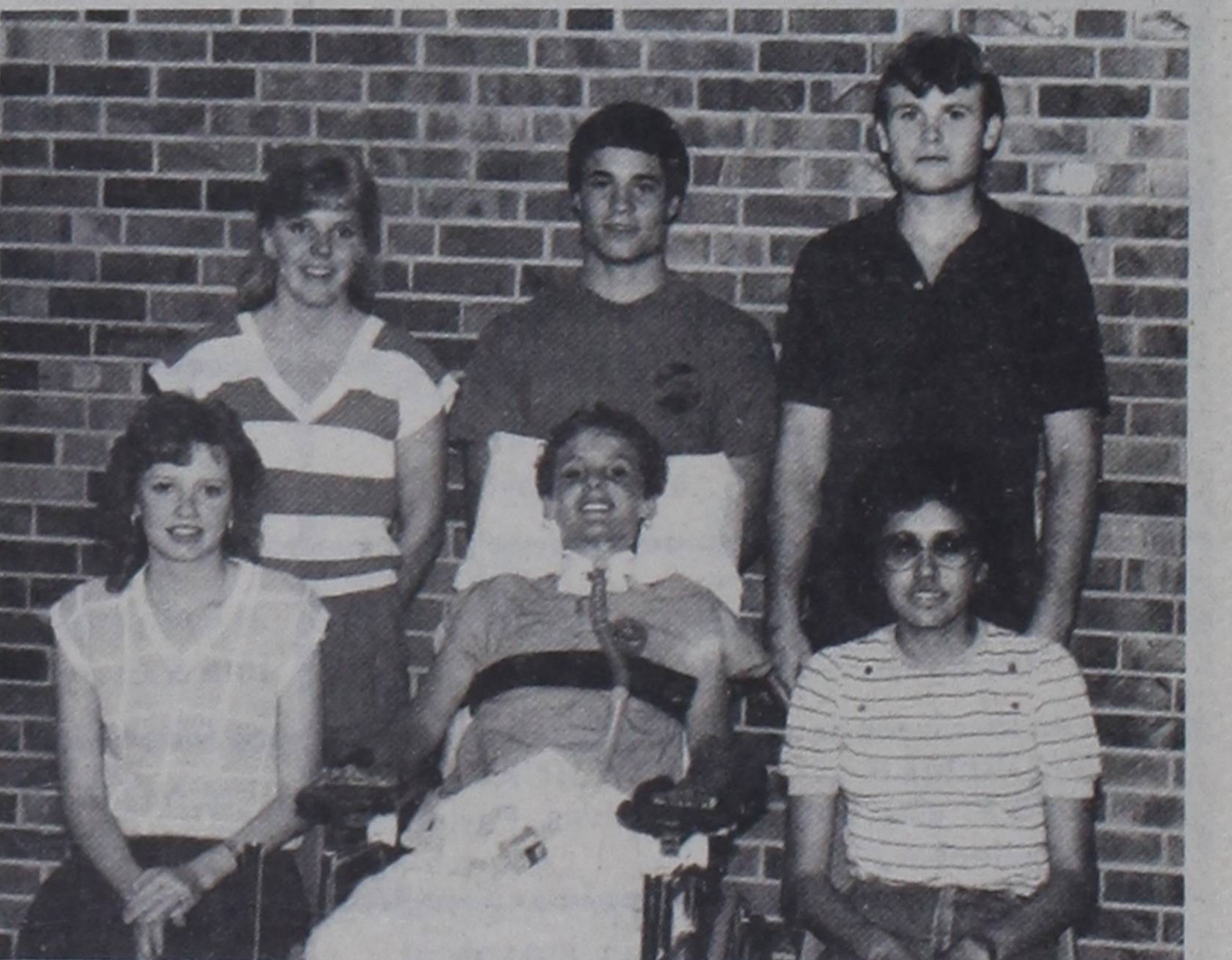
Friona also announced that CHS has purchased the assets of Friona's Hi-Pro Feeds division pursuant to the exercise of an option granted to CHS in February 1985. The purchase price was \$9,000,000, payable in the form of a 10-year promissory note executed by CHS. The Hi-Pro Feeds division represented approximately 16 per cent of Friona's pre-tax operating income for the year ended June 30, 1984 and is

expected to represent approximately 15 per cent of Friona's pre-tax operating income for the nine months ended March 31, 1985.

On May 9, 1985 Eller Enterprises, Inc. announced that it had increased its cash tender offer for all outstanding shares of Friona Common Stock to \$19 per share conditioned, however, on the rescission and termination by Friona's Board of Directors of various contracts and agreements between Friona and CHS. Friona's Board of Directors has recommended that its shareholders not tender their shares to Eller since Eller's tender offer is subject to a condition that cannot be satisfied and the Friona Board continues to support, and is committed to proceed with, the acquisition of Friona by CHS.

As previously announced, on April 19, 1985, Friona filed with the Securities and Exchange Commission its preliminary proxy statement relating to the acquisition by CHS. Ron Davenport, President and Chief Executive Officer of Friona, said today that as soon as the proxy statement has been cleared by the Commission, Friona intends to mail the proxy statement to its shareholders and proceed with holding a special meeting of shareholders for the purpose of approving the acquisition of Friona by CHS.

**55 YEARS AGO--MAY 9, 1930**

Steel workers have arrived in Friona and started work on the new elevated water tank, which is to supply the water works system. When completed, the tank will have a capacity of 50,000 gallons. It is known as the hemispherical bottom type. Elevated storage will give Friona a water system which will be economical to operate and efficient in service. A small pumping unit fills the tank in a short time and will be able to keep it full at all times to meet the demand. This reserve flows by gravity to all parts of the system. The tank is to be elevated to a distance of 92 feet above the ground which means the water will always have a gravity pressure of at least 40 pounds.

**50 YEARS AGO--MAY 10, 1935**

The Baptist congregation has purchased a part of the J.L. Landrum building on Euclid Avenue and moved it to the lot adjoining their church property. The building is being converted into a cottage to be used by the pastor as a parsonage. The carpenter work is being supervised by Rev. E. Ray Lansdown, assisted by members of the congregation.

**45 YEARS AGO--MAY 10, 1940**

Paul Spring, arts and science junior at Texas Technological College, has been elected president of the American Chemical Society to serve during the next school year. He is the son of Mr. and Mrs. F.L. Spring of Friona.

**40 YEARS AGO--MAY 11, 1945**

Two Friona girls, Misses Anna Lee and Eula May White, daughters of Mr. and Mrs. Ed S. White, were injured near Black Tuesday night, in a car wreck when the car in which they were riding turned over. A blow out on one of the tires was the cause of the mishap. Anna Lee received a severe cut on the leg, but her sister received only minor scratches and bruises.

**35 YEARS AGO--MAY 5, 1950**

Work is now underway on the

\$60,000-\$70,000 church building being built for the First Baptist Church in Friona. The new unit will consist of an auditorium with a seating capacity of 500, offices and additional Sunday School facilities. Steel, concrete and brick are being used in this modern functional-designed building. Being supervised by G.G. Gilliland, the plans are from the drawing boards of architects Shaffer and Merrill of Clovis. Rev. Tommie B. Allen is the local Baptist minister, being here since May, 1947.

Contract was let Tuesday morning for a new 250,000 bushel elevator for the Black Grain Company, according to announcement just made by J.R. (Pete) Braxton, manager. This will more than double the present capacity of 200,000 bushels in the elevator just completed.

**30 YEARS AGO--MAY 6, 1955**

Announcement of the honor students of the high school graduating class was made this week by Principal Dillie Kelley. Valedictorian is Gay Cass, who has a four-year grade point average of 95.6. She is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Kenyth Cass. Zelma Fay Beaty is salutatorian with a grade point average of 94.5. She is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Joe Beaty. Deniese Magness was in third place with an average of 93.3. She is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. H.T. Magness.

**25 YEARS AGO--MAY 5, 1960**

Jackie Hight, a senior student in Friona High School, was injured in a car-pickup wreck about four miles west of Friona on FM 1731 Saturday afternoon about 3 p.m. David Kelley, who works for Doris Buske, was traveling west on the road and stopped at the twin lakes to see how the fishermen were making out. While he was stopped, Hight rammed into the rear of his pickup. Witnesses said the visibility was impaired by dust. The Hight auto, a 1955 Chevy, was

a total loss. He was taken to Parmer County Community Hospital, where he was treated for head injuries.

Archie Tarter was elected to a full term as county judge in Parmer County in the race which highlighted the primary voting locally last Saturday. Tarter defeated W.L. (Preach) Edelman of Friona by a total vote of 964-537. Edelman was given majorities only at Friona and Black. Tarter won the other six precincts, as well as the absentee box.

The law grants to the Court the power of appointing an attorney as counsel for the child as well as for the child's parent(s) and to appoint an attorney as guardian ad litem for the child.

Where the child or the parent(s) are unable to retain an attorney because of financial reasons, the Court may appoint an attorney to represent them at Racine County's expense. If a question of ability to pay is raised, proof may be required to justify payment at public cost.

IF YOU FAIL TO APPEAR, THE COURT MAY TERMINATE YOUR PARENTAL RIGHTS.

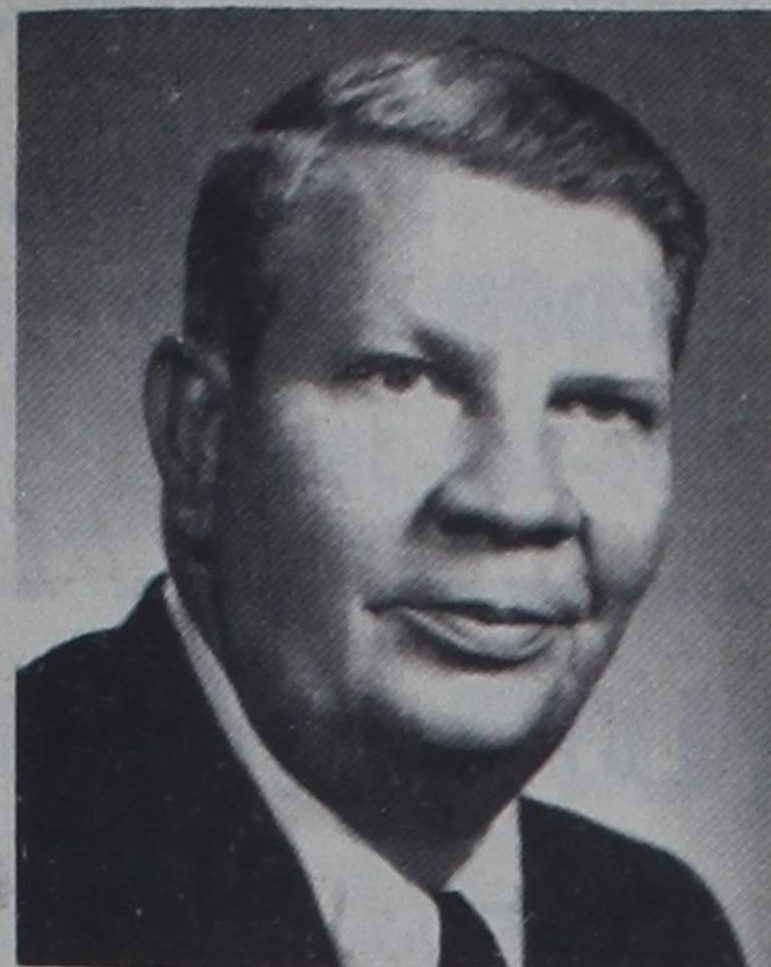

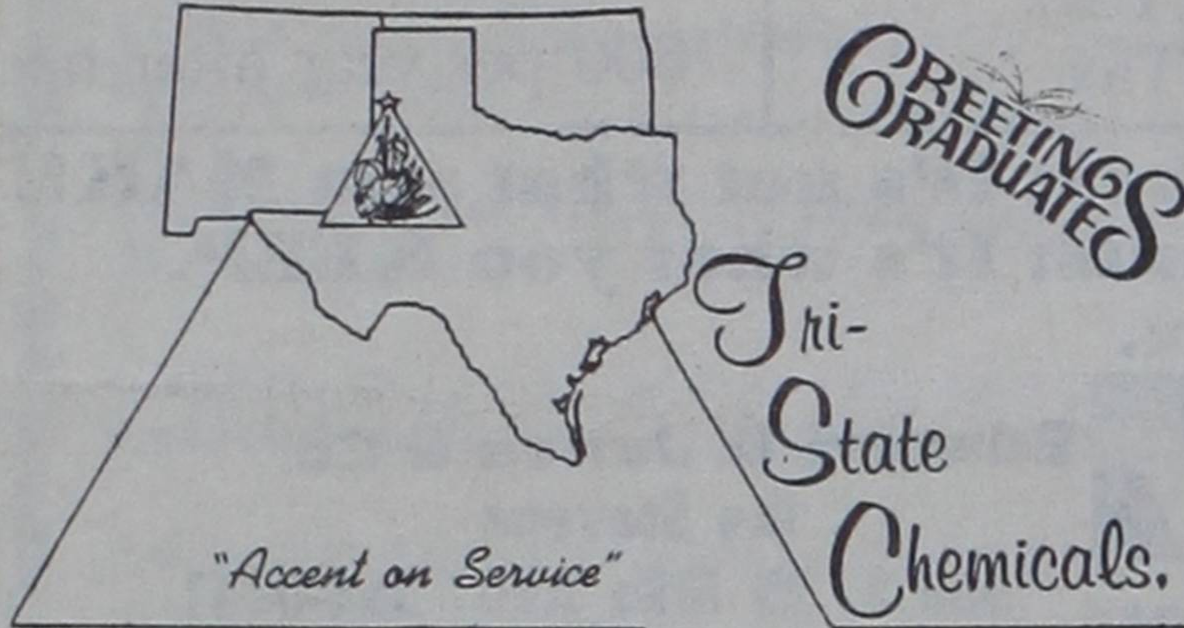

Osborn 29 (26); June Rhodes 49 (27) and Faye Smith 15 (15).

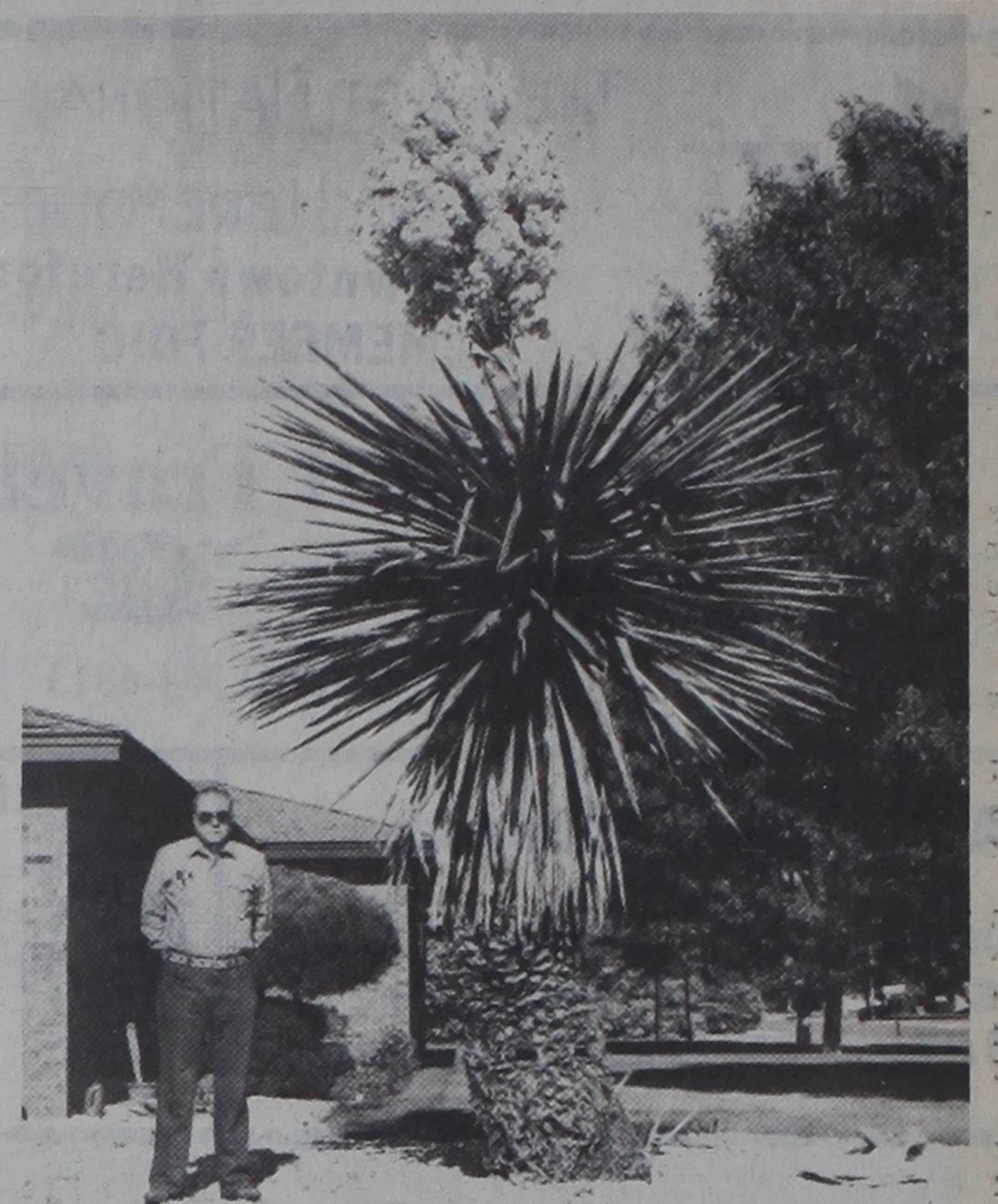

## Wheat Field Day Is Set

The annual Wheat Field Day to be conducted at the USDA Conservation and Production Research Laboratory located west of Bushland will start at 1 p.m. May 23, according to Gary Patterson, County Agricultural Agent.

"Wheat research at Bushland looks especially good this year because of above average rains, and Dr. B.A. Stewart, Director of the Research Laboratory, invites people to see wheat at its best," Patterson said. Field tours to research plots will begin after a few remarks by Dr. Stewart and Bill Nelson, Executive Director of the Texas Wheat Producers Association.

New wheat varieties, including TAM 107, TAM 108, and several experimental lines, on both irrigated and dryland, will be featured at the event. Research on irrigation of wheat, no-tillage production of wheat, and grazing of wheat also will be shown and discussed with field day visitors.

Participants at the Field Day will receive a publication describing all phases of wheat research being conducted at the research laboratory.
