TAXING POWER TO PRESIDENT UNCONSTITUTIONAL

The crowning iniquity of the Fordney-McCumber bill is the provision which vests in the president the power and authority to change the rates fixed by Congress. This surrendering of the taxing power to the Chief Executive is a confession of incompetence on the part of the Republican Congress—a cowardly evasion of its responsibility and a scheme which makes it easy for the Republican party to do in the secrecy of the Presidential office what the Senate and House of Representatives lacked courage to do in the open.

It is something more and worse than all this; it is an unconstitutional forfeiture and alienation of the sole right and responsibility of Congress to originate, determine and enact fiscal and tax measures. The constitution forbids, and the traditions and precedents of the American Government thus far in its history have trans-

versed, the transfer of the taxing power to the executive branch. It only remained for the Republican party to stain with unconstitutionality a bill which was already stained with hypocrisy, fraud and downright dishonesty.

Never before has the tariff bill provoked such widespread denunciation as the one which the Republican Congress has just inflicted on the United States. It is not a measure of protection to American industry and agriculture and labor; it is a license bestowed on the few to profiteer on the multitude.

There is but one remedy for the American people. That is to oust from legislative power the party that has used its control of the government to exploit the masses. Let them restore the Democratic policies and leadership under which the people prospered and progressed from 1801 until 1921.

Mr. Tom May, Brownfield, Texas, Friend Tom:

Replying to your inquiry as to what I am doing and what kind of oil I am using, I will say that I am running the star mail route from Roswell to Lovington, 106 miles, the majority of which is very rough and seven miles of which is heavy sand. I am doing the work with a Ford and Dodge car, running one at a time. I run the Ford car when my load is not too heavy for it. My loads range in weight from 200 to 2000 lbs, averaging probably 800 pounds. I have been late only once and that was caused by Federal Inspector holding me four hours on the road. I have run the Ford car about 9000 miles and excluding tires I have been out only 20c on parts and repairs, and that was to replace a radiator cap. I have not had the cylinder head off, neither have I had a spark plug out. I am using Magnolene medium in both cars. In my opinion there is no better oil at any price for Ford and Dodge cars.
