Replying to your inquiry as to what I am doing and what kind o oil I am using, I will say that I am running the star mail route from Roswell to Lovington, 106 miles, the majority of which is very rough and seven miles of which is heavy sand. I am doing the wo a with a Ford and Dodge car, running one at a time. I run the Ford car when my load is not too heavy for it. My loads range in weight from 200 to 2000 lbs, averaging probably 800 pounds. I have be in late only once and that was cau ed by Federal Inspector holding me four hours on the road. I have run the Ford car about 9000 miles and excluding tires I have been out only 20c on parts and repairs, and that was to replace a radiator cap. I have not had the cylinder head off, neither have I had a spark plug out. I am using Magnolene medium in both cars. In my opinion there is no better oil at any price for Ford and Dodge cars.
