W. Letsinger and her thrce year old daughter, Ella Virginia, were instantly killed when a light car in which they were riding was hit by a fast going northbound Santa Fe passenger train Monday afternoon at $4: 55$, one mile north of Monroe on the Lubbock-Plainview line of the Santa Fe . <br> Ted Letsinger, 12 years, and $\mathrm{S}_{\mathrm{ut}}$ May Letsinger. 17, were the other occupants of the car, but escaped with only slight injury. Ted was driving when the accident occurred, according to witnesses. He had evidently failed to see the approaching train, or else had concluded that he conld make the crossing ahead of it. The car, according to eye witnesses, evi- dently stalled just as the front wheels were placed on the rail, and the train was so near at hand that the efforts ior the occupants to abandon the car were futile. <br> Mrs. Letsinger and the baby who was killed with her were found about 60 feet from where the train hit the car.
